Do you seek further Light in Masonry?

Do you desire to complete the Master Mason degree and fulfill the Second Landmark by receiving the Holy Royal Arch?

Do you wish to join a Christian Brotherhood by becoming a Knight Templar?

If you answered yes to any of these questions, then you should take a closer look at the York Rite of Freemasonry.

What is the York Rite?

The York Rite is a collection of several Masonic degrees and orders which are conferred upon those Master Masons who seek further Light in Masonry beyond that of the Master Mason degree.

According to the Second Landmark from the Constitution and Code of the Grand Lodge of Oklahoma, "Ancient Craft Masonry consists of three degrees: the Entered Apprentice, the Fellowcraft, and the Master Mason including the Holy Royal Arch."

The Royal Arch degree is thus central to both the Symbolic Lodge and the York Rite. In the Royal Arch degree, that which was lost in the Master Mason degree is found! It has been said that the Holy Royal Arch is "the root, heart, and marrow of Masonry."

The Cryptic degrees further illuminate and explain the lessons of the three degrees of the Symbolic Lodge and the Holy Royal Arch.

In addition, the York Rite confers three orders of Christian Knighthood, culminating in the Order of the Temple. It has been said that "no degree or order in Freemasonry is more solemn, more impressive or more soul-searching than the Order of the Temple."

It is the York Rite that offers the opportunity for a Master Mason to become a Companion of the Holy Royal Arch and a Knight of the Valiant and Magnanimous Order of the Temple, and much more.



York Rite Festival to Honor Grand Master Glen A. Chaney

On Saturday, July 22, 2023, the York Rite of Oklahoma will be holding a one-day degree festival in honor of M:W: Glen A. Chaney, Grand Master of the Grand Lodge A.F.&A.M. of the State of Oklahoma. Grand Master Chaney, along with many other dignitaries, will be in attendance.

All of the degrees and orders of the York Rite from the Mark Master thru the Order of the Temple will be conferred by degree teams from throughout Oklahoma. This will be a great opportunity to join the York Rite along with candidates from all parts of the state.

How to join the York Rite.

There are basically two ways to join the York Rite:

- All of the degrees and orders conferred at a one-day festival, like the one on July 22nd in Okla. City, or
- A few degrees and orders at a time over several weeks or months conferred at a local York Rite body.

In either case, begin by choosing a local York Rite body to join — your regional membership chairman can help you with that — and complete the enclosed petition. Don't worry about the Recommendations and Investigating Committee, we'll take care of that.

Submit your completed petition, along with the required fees, either (i) to your chosen local York Rite body, (ii) to your regional membership chairman, or (iii) to the Grand Secretary-Recorder. You may also submit your petition and fees during registration on the day of the Festival; but it is *extremely* important that you let your local York Rite or regional membership chairman know in advance that you will be attending, so that we can prepare for you.
