

We have been a little lax in this area so I assigned each Custodian of the Work specific Chapters. I also appointed Assistant Custodians of the Work to assist with the schools. Several schools were successfully held. I believe this program should be continued, and the Grand Chapter increase Custodians of the Work Committee to four permanently
- 2: The Constitution and Code requires that each Chapter opens a minimum of four times per year. This is to include opening ritual and reading of the minutes. A declaration opening will not count towards the minimum number of openings.
- 3: All candidates for the degrees must petition the Chapter they wish to join, pay the fees, and be voted on before they can receive any of the degrees. Special arrangements are made for Field Days to meet this requirement. Any Candidate that has received any of the degrees without following these steps must be healed before continuing with any further degrees.
- 4: Non-Royal Arch Masons that wish to join a Chapter UD must do so through a Chartered Chapter.

Awards

I tasked my District Deputies with the duty of collecting the awards nomination forms for the General Grand Chapter Bronze Medal and the Murrow Award. They were to have the nomination forms in their hands no later than 12 midnight Dec 31. Otherwise they were to contact the High Priest and finds out where they were going to meet them to deliver the form. A few Chapters were exempt from this for just reasons. Because of this we had several deserving individuals nominated for both awards. The recipients will be announced at the General Banquet tonight.

I started this year planning on presenting the L.D. Clark Memorial Award for Ritual Excellence to one Chapter that impressed me with their opening and closing ritual. I am giving three away this year instead and they will be announced tonight also.

I wish to thank all of the Companions that thought of their Chapters future by purchasing Perpetual Memberships.

I would also like to remind the Craft that they can purchase lifetime memberships in the General Grand Chapter for the unheard of low, low (we can't keep them this low much longer (they do not call me Crazy Larry for nothing)) price of only \$25.00. RESOLUTION No. 1 2010

To: Most Illustrious Grand High Priest and members of Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Oklahoma,

WHEREAS, Article 9, refers to New Chapters and allows the Grand High Priest to issue letters of dispensation, and

WHEREAS, this Article is lacking in detail and confusing as to how to handle new petitioners, and

WHEREAS, since this article is being extensively amended, it was decided to rewrite the entire article now, and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the current Article 9, New Chapter, Sections 1 through 6 which now reads:

ARTICLE 9

NEW CHAPTERS

Section 1 Petition.

The Grand High Priest may grant letters of dispensation to nine or more Royal Arch Masons, authorizing them to assemble and open and hold a chapter and therein confer the degrees of Capitular Masonry. Preliminary to the granting letters of dispensation for a chapter, a petition therefore shall be presented to the Grand High Priest on a form furnished by the Grand Secretary, which shall be signed by each Companion with his full name, and shall show the name, number and location of the lodge with which he is affiliated, and the chapter with which he is affiliated, or from which he is demitted and, if demitted, he shall attach his demit to the petition. Upon the receipt of such petition, the Grand High Priest shall consider and thoroughly investigate the same, and if, in his opinion, the best interests of Capitular Masonry will be served by granting the prayer of the petitioners, he shall thereupon grant letters of dispensation for such chapter upon the payment of the fee of Twenty-Five Dollars.

Section 2. Expiration.

The authority so granted shall fix the date of expiration which, in no event, shall be later than thirty days preceding the next Annual Convocation of this Grand Chapter.

Section 3. Chapters U.D.

Chapters under dispensation shall be instituted, or set to work, by the Grand High Priest or by some High Priest, or Past High Priest, duly authorized to perform that duty as the representative of the Grand High Priest. A special meeting shall be called for the purpose by the designated High Priest on the date set by the Grand High Priest at which the Grand High Priest, or duly authorized representative, shall preside and open the chapter. The dispensation shall be read and ordered to be recorded in full in the minutes, and the chapter shall be fully instructed in regard to its jurisdiction, powers and duties.

Section 4. Duties.

Chapters under dispensation shall have authority to receive and act on petitions and confer degrees, but shall not have authority to collect dues or assessments from its members, own real estate, or elect officers; provided, however, that the High Priest may fill vacancies other than that of King and Scribe. Fees for the degrees shall not be less than the minimum authorized by this Grand Chapter. The chapter may purchase, rent or otherwise acquire furniture, paraphernalia or other necessary equipment. The High Priest shall within ten days after the expiration of his authority to work, transmit to the Grand Secretary a transcript of his proceedings and a return of his work.

Section 5. Charters.

The petition for a charter for a new chapter shall be signed by each petitioner with his name in full, and show the name and location of the lodge with which he is affiliated and of the chapter with which he was last affiliated, unless he shall have been exalted in the chapter under dispensation, which fact shall be shown. The petition, work, returns and all

books of all chapters under dispensation shall be referred to the Committee on Charters and Dispensations, who shall examine them and report thereon. This Grand Chapter may continue a dispensation or grant a charter as the facts may justify. The fee of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) shall be paid to the Grand Secretary before the charter is issued.

Section 6. New Chapters must be constituted.

When a charter is issued by order of this Grand Chapter, either upon direct application or following a dispensation, before such chapter can lawfully meet as such, it must be duly constituted_by the Grand High Priest, or his duly authorized representative. Such representative may be any officer of this Grand Chapter, a District Deputy Grand High Priest or Past Grand High Priest.

When a new chapter is to be constituted under a charter, the Grand High Priest shall fix the date thereof and shall notify the designated High Priest, who shall call a meeting for that purpose. Such convocation is a Special Convocation of the Grand Chapter, and the ceremonies of constitution shall be according to the form adopted by this Grand Chapter.

The charter, a copy of the Constitution and Laws, and nine rituals shall be delivered to the High Priest without expense, other than the fee for the charter.

The secretary of the newly organized chapter shall notify under seal the chapter which had issued certificates of membership to the petitioners who had signed the application for dispensation, and such procedure shall be sufficient to act as a process of regular election in the newly organized chapter.

BE AMENDED TO READ:

ARTICLE 9

NEW CHAPTERS

Section 1. Dispensation.

The Grand High Priest may, during the recess of the Grand Chapter, grant letters of dispensation to nine or more Royal Arch Masons, authorizing them to assemble and open and hold a Chapter and therein confer the degrees of Capitular Masonry. Preliminary to granting letters of dispensation for a new Chapter, a petition shall be presented to the Grand High Priest on a form furnished by the Grand Secretary, which shall be signed by each Companion with his full name, and shall show the name, number and location of the Chapter, and the Chapter with which he is affiliated, or from which he is demitted and, if demitted, he shall attach his demit to the petition. Upon the receipt of such petition, the Grand High Priest shall consider and thoroughly investigate the same, and if, in his opinion, the best interests of Capitular Masonry will be served by granting the prayer of the petitioners, he shall thereupon grant letters of dispensation for such Chapter upon the payment of the fee of Twenty-Five Dollars.

Section 2. Expiration.

The authority so granted shall fix the date of expiration which, in no event, shall be later than thirty days preceding the next Annual Assembly of this Grand Chapter.

Section 3. Chapter U.D.

Chapters under dispensation shall be instituted, or set to work, by the Grand High Priest or by some High Priest, or Past High Priest, duly authorized to perform that duty as the representative of the Grand High Priest. A special meeting shall be called by the designated High Priest on the date set by the Grand High Priest at which the Grand High Priest, or duly authorized representative, shall preside and open the Chapter. The dispensation shall be read and ordered to be recorded in full in the minutes, and the Chapter shall be fully instructed in regard to its jurisdiction, powers and duties. Dias Officers of a Chapter under dispensation shall be appointed by the Grand High Priest.

Section 4. Duties.

Chapters under dispensation shall have authority to receive and act on

petitions and confer degrees, but shall not have authority to collect dues or assessments from its members, own real estate, or elect officers; provided, however, that the High Priest may fill vacancies other than that of King and Scribe. The Chapter may purchase, rent or otherwise acquire furniture, paraphernalia or other necessary equipment. The High Priest shall, within ten days after the expiration of his authority to work, transmit to the Grand Secretary a transcript of his proceedings and a return of his work. The petition, work, returns and all books of all Chapters under dispensation shall be referred to the Committee on Charters and Dispensations, who shall examine them and report thereon.

Section 5. Petitions & Fees.

A Master Mason who desires to become a member of a Chapter U.D. must petition an existing Chartered Chapter with the knowledge and understanding that he will become a dual member of that Chapter and the Chapter U.D. When, and if the Chapter U.D. is chartered, those who were dual members will be issued a demit from the original existing Chartered Chapter, provided they are Members in Good Standing, and will become members of the New Chartered Chapter unless they wish to remain dual members. If they demit, any current dues paid to the original Chartered Chapter will be prorated and paid to the New Chartered Chapter and any fees paid to the original Chartered Chapter, minus any paid per capita and assessments, will be transferred to the new Chartered Chapter.

Section 6. Charters.

The petition for a charter for a new Chapter shall be signed by each petitioner with his name in full and show the name and location of the lodge with which he is affiliated and of the Chapter with which he was last affiliated. This Grand Chapter may continue a dispensation or grant a charter as the facts may justify. The fee of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) shall be paid to the Grand Secretary before the charter is issued.

The cost will not exceed the cost of a perpetual membership in his home Chapter.
- (4) 25 petitions The first line signer will receive a personalized silver sword, or a gold plated sword if the recipient is a Past Commander, paid for by the Grand York Rite Bodies of Oklahoma, after the petitioners have received all their York Rite degrees.

BE AMENDED TO READ:

- (1) 3 petitions The first line signer will receive a billfold.
- (3) <u>20</u> petitions The first line signer will receive a personalized silver sword, or a gold plated sword if the recipient is a Past Commander, paid for by the Grand York Rite Bodies of Oklahoma, after the petitioners have received all their York Rite degrees. (Limit one sword per recipient for all three Bodies)
- (4) <u>30</u> petitions The first line signer will receive a Perpetual Membership in his home Chapter, (after the petitioners have received all the York Rite degrees) paid by the Grand Chapter, RAM of Oklahoma. (a) If a top line signer has a perpetual membership he will have the option to add to his current perpetual membership account, or he may give the perpetual membership to any member in good standing, or purchase a perpetual membership in another Oklahoma Chapter in which he is a member. The cost will not exceed the cost of a perpetual membership in his home Chapter.

RESOLUTION No. 4 2010

To: Most Excellent Grand High Priest and members of Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Oklahoma,

WHEREAS, it is the intent to re-write the Constitution and General Laws of the Grand Chapter, Royal Arch Masons of Oklahoma, and

WHEREAS, Article 3, Section 3, Voting, is being clarified to limit vote to a maximum of three for any member, and

WHEREAS, the changes being made are only to make the Constitutions of the Grand Chapter and Grand Council read approximately the same, and

WHEREAS, the current Constitution requires that any change shall be read and referred to the Jurisprudence Committee for examination, report and recommendation at the next Annual Stated Assembly,

THEREFORE, be it resolved that this rewritten Constitution of the Grand Chapter be read

and referred to the Jurisprudence Committee for examination, report and recommendation at the next Annual Stated Convocation.

CONSTITUTION ARTICLE 1

- **Section 1. Name.** The name of this body shall be" The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Oklahoma".
- **Section 2. Allegiance.** This Grand Chapter is a member of the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, International.
- **Section 3. Jurisdiction.** Its jurisdiction shall be the territorial limits of the State of Oklahoma.
- **Section 4. General Powers.** This Grand Chapter shall have and exercise supreme power and authority over Capitular Masonry within the State of Oklahoma. It has, and of right exercises, the sole power of government, superintendence and control over all Chapters of Royal Arch Masons within said territory.

Section 5. Special Powers. It has the power especially:

- **a.** To enact and enforce all laws and general regulations for the government of the Chapters under its jurisdiction, and, at pleasure, to alter, amend or repeal the same.
- **b.** To constitute new Chapters by granting dispensations and charters under seal with the right to confer therein the degrees of Masonry denominated Mark Master, Past Master, Most Excellent Master and Royal Arch, and, for good cause, may arrest, annul, revoke, or amend such (any pre-existing) charter (at its pleasure.) or any pre-existing charter.
- c. To fix the territorial limits of each chapter under its jurisdiction and settle all controversies that may arise between them (Constituent) Chapters, and it has the final decision and determination of (on) all grievances and matters of controversy that may be brought up by appeal or otherwise.
- **d.** To reprimand, suspend or expel from its own body any member thereof for a violation of this Constitution or of the Laws of this Grand Chapter.
- **e.** To assess and collect from the several Chapter's under its jurisdiction such sums of money, annually, as may, from time to time, be approved for the support and maintenance of this Grand Chapter and its charities.
- **f.** To supervise the state and condition of its own finances, and adopt such measures in relation thereto as may be deemed for the good of Capitular Masonry.
- **g.** To establish and preserve a uniform ritual of the several degrees of Capitular Masonry.
- **h.** To consider and review at each Annual Convocation the reports and actions of the Grand Officers, and of the several Chapters under its jurisdiction, for the preceding Capitular year.
- i. To consider and do all whatsoever it may regard as necessary, or appertaining to the well-being and perpetuation of Capitular Masonry in Oklahoma.
- **j.** The enumeration of the foregoing jurisdictions and powers shall in no manner limit the jurisdiction, power or right of this Grand Chapter to exercise its inherent powers as sovereign, according to ancient custom and usage, over any other matter or thing falling within the sphere of Capitular Masonry in this Grand Jurisdiction.

ARTICLE 2

Section 1. Of Whom Composed. The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Oklahoma shall be composed of the following officers and members: Grand High Priest, Grand King, Grand Scribe, Grand Treasurer, Grand Secretary, Grand Captain of the Host, Grand Principal Sojourner, Grand Royal Arch Captain, Grand Master of the Third Veil, Grand Master of the Second Veil, Grand Master of the First Veil, Grand Chaplain, Grand Sentinel, Past Grand High Priests. Past Grand Kings and Past Grand Scribes

The High Priests, Kings and Scribes of constituent Chapters in its (this) jurisdiction, and of all Past High Priests of such Constituent Chapters, so long as they remain members of Chapters in this jurisdiction, Past High Priests of other Grand Jurisdictions who have removed to this (affiliated with a Chapter under the) Grand Jurisdiction (of this Grand Chapter) and become (a member of this Grand Chapter by majority vote at any Annual Convocation of) affiliated with a constituent chapter and who have been elected to membership in this Grand Chapter.

Section 2. Proxies. (Should the) The High Priest, King and Scribe if (of any Chapter be) unable to attend any Convocation of the Grand Chapter, (any of them) may appoint any member of his (own) Chapter as his proxy to represent him in the Grand Chapter. The Certificate of Appointment shall be in writing, signed by the officer appointing him and attested by the Secretary.

In the event that the High Priest, King or Scribe of a Chapter, for reason of death or permanent removal, is not available to sign the Certificate of Appointment, the authority to appoint a proxy for that office or offices and to sign the Certificate of Appointment shall devolve upon the highest ranking officer, High Priest, King or Scribe.

Section 3. Officers' Titles. The title of the Grand High Priest shall be "Most Excellent". The title of all other elective Grand Officers shall be "Right Excellent", (and all appointed) Appointive Grand Officers (shall be) "Excellent", and High Priests (and Past High Priests) of constituent Chapters shall be addressed as "Excellent". All other officers shall be addressed as "Companion", the title common to all Royal Arch Masons. Past Officers shall be addressed as present officers of like rank.

ARTICLE 3

Section 1. Annual Convocation. One Annual Stated Convocation of this Grand Chapter shall be held and special convocations may be convened, as provided by its laws. **Section 2. Quorum.** To authorize the opening of the Grand Chapter there shall be present the representatives of nine chartered Chapters, which number shall at all times constitute a quorum.

Section 3. Voting. On all questions before this Grand Chapter each member present shall have one vote by virtue of membership, but, when voting by paper ballot, a Past High Priest who is then serving his Chapter as High Priest, King or Scribe **is entitled to one vote**, or who is carrying a proxy or proxies as specified in Article 2, Section 2, shall be entitled to **(any combination of)** a maximum of three votes.

Voting in this Grand Chapter shall be, first, by paper ballot, and, second, by show of hands. The first method shall be used in the election of officers and elsewhere as provided by law, except that, by unanimous consent, the second method may be used.

In all other matters the second method shall be used unless nine or more members concur in a demand (request) for a paper ballot, in which case the first method shall be used; provided that the Grand High Priest or presiding officer, may, on occasion, order the use of the first method, when in his judgment the second method would not properly reflect the will of the Grand Chapter.

ARTICLE 4

Section 1. The Constitution of this Grand Chapter shall be construed as paramount to the General Laws; and all laws, rules, regulations and edicts heretofore enacted, and decisions of Grand High Priests in conflict therewith shall be null and void. **Section 2.** This Constitution shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption

Section 2. This Constitution shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption by this Grand Chapter.

Section 3. Constitution, How Altered. This Constitution may be altered or amended by resolution, in writing, stating distinctly the proposed alteration or amendment, which shall be read and referred to the Jurisprudence Committee for examination, report and recommendation at the next Annual Stated Convocation. An affirmative vote of two-thirds of the total votes cast shall be necessary for its adoption.

In the event any such proposed alteration or amendment to this Constitution contains any proposition that would have the effect of relinquishing, eliminating or detracting from the Sovereign Powers of this Grand Chapter; then and, in such event, in

addition to the foregoing provisions for adoption, such proposition shall be submitted to the constituent Chapters, and should nine or more Chapters vote to reject the proposition the same shall be declared lost.

MASONIC CHARITY FOUNDATION REPORT

The Charity Foundation elected new officers at its last meeting held in January. The president is David Ray, 1st Vice President Charles L. Stuckey, and 2nd Vice President Elwood "Ike" Isaacs, Secretary Robert G. Davis, Treasurer Gary A. Davis and Assistant Secretary John Logan. I want to express my appreciation to the members of the Masonic Charity Foundation Board by allowing me to serve as president and to the companions of the Grand Chapter for allowing me to represent them in this important work.

The Charity Foundation has participated in some very worthwhile events this past year. On behalf of the Masons of Oklahoma, a significant donation for \$1,000,000 was given to the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation to equip a laboratory to study Alzheimer's disease. Grand Master Richard Massad presented the check at a ceremony at the Medical Research facility in Oklahoma City.

A new program has been implemented by the Foundation that will benefit students at our six regional universities. The Board of Directors authorized a grant program that each of the regional universities apply for. The amount for each grant is \$100,000 and must be approved by the Foundation Board. Northwestern in Alva is the first recipient of this program and Grand Master Belnap presented the grant at a ceremony this past March.

At present the Masonic Charity Foundation is designated a public charity. This designation is very important to the Foundation and the Masonic Fraternity of Oklahoma. One of the tests required by the Internal Revenue Service is based on the amount of donations received by the Foundation. With the tough economic times all of us are experiencing, our donations are declining. Donations received by the Charity Foundation are never spent and only the revenue from interest is used to fund the Foundation's programs. A donation to the Foundation will help continue the great work it does of which the Masons of Oklahoma can be proud.

RARA COMMITTEE

The Able Kids Foundation™ (AKF) continues to be the recipient of RARA support. The Able Kids Foundation is a nonprofit organization established to enhance and maximize abilities. This Colorado-based foundation joins with local, national, and international partners to expand opportunities for people with disabilities.

The potential need for central auditory processing disorder (CAPD) diagnosis and management is great. Because central auditory processing difficulties are associated with children and adults with other challenges such as traumatic brain injury, autism, and attention deficit disorder (ADD), the incidence of CAPD is most likely underestimated. For example, the incidence of autism is 1 in every 500 births, 200 million people a year have some degree of head injury, and 28 million individuals have hearing loss. Furthermore, 2 million children have been diagnosed with ADD, and 1 in every 1600 individuals has multiple sclerosis. All of these population groups are at risk for CAPD and with your continuing support, we can help them.

Removing barriers and encouraging self-value is what the Able Kids Foundation and the Royal Arch Research Assistance is all about.

Your Oklahoma York Bodies, as of February 28, 2010, had contributed a grand total since the conception, of \$111,016.27 (\$97,874.00 in "regular" contributions and \$13,142.27 in memorial contributions).

TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE

The committee would like to thank the Grand Chapter, Grand Council and Grand Commandery for providing the necessary funding to create two new sections of the Oklahoma York Rite Web site. Through their kind consideration, we added a new photo gallery and the York Rite Bodies ZIP Code search system. In the month after the launch, traffic increased 25%. Since then, the Photo Gallery has consistently been one of the top 10 most visited sections of our web site. The location search, which uses a separate statistical model has recorded more than 1,400 ZIP code searches since its launch late last year. The Grand Chapter also created their own section of the web site, at no additional cost to our organization, which made top 5 in the most popular sections of our

Web site nearly every month since the launch. Finally, a promotional campaign was launched with the grand lodge of Oklahoma, featuring three different tile ad campaigns that resulted in 588 visits to the okyorkrite.org web site in a 4.5 month period (more than 130 visits per month). Overall, traffic for the first six months of 2009 was 2,123 visits with an average time of 3:02 and 6.25 pages per visit, while the second half of 2009 was 2,949 visits with an average time of 4:05 (25% increase) and 7.4 pages (16% gain) per visit.

This committee recommends York Rite Bodies of Oklahoma calendar be permitted for use by all of the York Rite Chapter, Council and Commandery bodies for the purposes of listing their stated business meetings. The mechanism to submit such meetings is already built into the existing calendar and a representative assigned to authenticate and administer the requests is all that would be required. This would serve to further increase the functionality of our site and is important because the calendar was the second most visited page (only the homepage received more visits) for the past five consecutive months (October 2009-February 2010).


DISTINGUISHED SERVICE BRONZE MEDAL AWARD RECIPIENTS



We had a decrease of **19** members compared to **100** last year. Greetings of **78** compared to **53** last year, and suspensions/withdrawals were **69** compared to **118** last year. All Councils have submitted monthly and quarterly reports for Year 2009.

RESOLUTION No. 1 2010

To: Most Illustrious Grand Master and members of Grand Council, Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma,

WHEREAS, Article 9, refers to New Councils and allows the Grand Master to issue letters of dispensation, and

WHEREAS, this Article is inadequate compared to the Grand Chapter General Laws, and

WHEREAS, since this article is being extensively amended, it was decided to rewrite the entire article now, and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the current Article 9, New Councils, Sections 1 and 2 which now reads:

ARTICLE 9

NEW COUNCILS

Section 1. Dispensation. The Grand Master may, during the recess of the Grand Council, upon proper application, issue letters of dispensation for the formation of new councils. The authority so granted shall fix the date of expiration which, is no event, shall be later than thirty days preceding the next Annual Assembly of this Grand Council. No dispensation for a new council shall be granted except upon the petition of at least nine Cryptic Masons in good standing. The petition shall be accompanied by a recommendation from the Council nearest to the place where a new Council is to be held.

Section 2. Degrees. Councils under dispensation shall have the right to confer degrees. If a dispensation should be withdrawn, or charter refused, the affiliated Companions in the proposed new council shall resume their memberships in their former councils without petition or other action, and Companions receiving the degrees under dispensation shall be issued a Certificate of Good Standing by the Grand Recorder. Officers of a council under dispensation shall be appointed by the Grand Master.

BE AMENDED TO READ:

ARTICLE 9

NEW COUNCILS

Section 1. Dispensation. The Grand Master may, during the recess of the Grand Council, grant letters of dispensation to nine or more Select Master Masons, authorizing them to assemble and open and hold a Council and therein confer the degrees of Cryptic Masonry. Preliminary to granting letters of dispensation for a new Council, a petition shall be presented to the Grand Master on a form furnished by the Grand Recorder, which shall be signed by each Companion with his full name, and shall show the name, number and location of the Council, and the Council with which he is affiliated, or from which he is demitted and, if demitted, he shall attach his demit to the petition. Upon the receipt of such petition, the Grand Master shall consider and thoroughly investigate the same, and if, in his opinion, the best interests of Cryptic Masonry will be served by granting the prayer of the petitioners, he shall thereupon grant letters of dispensation for such Council upon the payment of the fee of Twenty-Five Dollars. Section 2. Expiration. The authority so granted shall fix the date of expiration which, in no event, shall be later than thirty days preceding the next Annual Assembly of this Grand Council.

Section 3. Councils U.D. Councils under dispensation shall be instituted, or set

to work, by the Grand Master or by some Master, or Past Master, duly authorized to perform that duty as the representative of the Grand Master. A special meeting shall be called by the designated Master on the date set by the Grand Master at which the Grand Master, or duly authorized representative, shall preside and open the Council. The dispensation shall be read and ordered to be recorded in full in the minutes, and the Council shall be fully instructed in regard to its jurisdiction, powers and duties. Dias Officers of a Council under dispensation shall be appointed by the Grand Master.

Section 4. Duties. Councils under dispensation shall have authority to receive and act on petitions and confer degrees, but shall not have authority to collect dues or assessments from its members, own real estate, or elect officers; provided, however, that the Master may fill vacancies other than that of Deputy Master and Principle Conductor of the Work. The Council may purchase, rent or otherwise acquire furniture, paraphernalia or other necessary equipment. The Master shall, within ten days after the expiration of his authority to work, transmit to the Grand Recorder a transcript of his proceedings and a return of his work. The petition, work, returns and all books of all Councils under dispensation shall be referred to the Committee on Charters and Dispensations, who shall examine them and report thereon.

Section 5, Petitions & Fees. A Master Mason who desires to become a member of a Council U.D. must petition an existing Chartered Council with the knowledge and understanding that he will become a dual member of that Council and the Council U.D.

When, and if the Council U. D. is chartered, those who were dual members will be issued a demit from the original existing Chartered Council, provided they are Members in Good Standing, and will become members of the New Chartered Council unless they wish to remain dual members. If they demit, any current dues paid to the original Chartered Council will be prorated and paid to the New Chartered Council and any fees paid to the original Chartered Council, minus any paid per capita and assessments, will be transferred to the new Chartered Council.

Section 6. Charters. The petition for a charter for a new Council shall be signed by each petitioner with his name in full and show the name and location of the lodge with which he is affiliated and of the Council with which he was last affiliated. This Grand Council may continue a dispensation or grant a charter as the facts may justify. The fee of Twenty-Five Dollars (\$25.00) shall be paid to the Grand Recorder before the charter is issued.

Section 6. New Councils must be constituted. When a charter is issued by order of this Grand Council, either upon direct application or following a dispensation, before such Council can lawfully meet as such, it must be duly constituted by the Grand Master, or his duly authorized representative. Such representative may be any officer of this Grand Council, a District Deputy Grand Master or Past Grand Master.

When a new Council is to be constituted under a charter, the Grand Master shall fix the date thereof and shall notify the designated Master, who shall call a meeting for that purpose. Such Assembly is a Special Assembly of the Grand Council, and the ceremonies of constitution shall be according to the form adopted by this Grand Council.

The charter, a copy of the Constitution and General Laws, and nine rituals shall be delivered to the Master without expense, other than the fee for the charter.

The Recorder of the newly organized Council shall notify, under seal, the Council which had issued Certificates of Good Standing to the petitioners who signed the application for dispensation or charter, and such procedure shall be sufficient to act as a process of regular election in the newly organized Council.

This shall be paid on vouchers to the Grand Recorder, only in the amount, up to the appropriation, by which costs exceed income to the Host Council.

BE AMENDED TO READ:

a. The Finance Committee shall at each Annual Assembly appropriate a sum not to exceed **Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00)** to the Host Council for the expenses of the next Annual Assembly. This shall be paid on vouchers to the Grand Recorder, only in the amount, up to the appropriation, by which costs exceed income to the Host Council.

RESOLUTION No. 3 2010

To: Most Illustrious Grand Master and members of Grand Council, Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma

WHEREAS, Article 7, Section 5, Membership Incentives, paragraphs 1, 3 & 4 refers to incentives, and

WHEREAS, the incentive for 3 petitions has changed from a lapel pin to a billfold, and WHEREAS, since the incentives for receiving a Perpetual Member is a greater expense to the Grand Chapter the incentive needs to be increased, and

WHEREAS, the incentive for receiving a sword should be decreased,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that ARTICLE 7, Section 5, paragraphs 1, 3 and 4

which now reads:

- (1) 3 petitions The first line signer will receive a unique lapel pin.
- (3) 15 petitions The first line signer will receive a Perpetual Membership in his home Council, (after the petitioners have received all the York Rite degrees) paid by the Grand Council, CM of Oklahoma. (a) If a top line signer has a perpetual membership he will have the option to add to his current perpetual membership account, or he may give the perpetual membership to any member in good standing, or purchase a perpetual membership in another Oklahoma Council in which he is a member. The cost will not exceed the cost of a perpetual membership in his home Council.
- (4) 25 petitions The first line signer will receive a personalized silver sword, or a gold plated sword if the recipient is a Past Commander, paid for by the Grand York Rite Bodies of Oklahoma, after the petitioners have received all their York Rite degrees.

BE AMENDED TO READ:

- (1) 3 petitions The first line signer will receive a **billfold**.
- (3) <u>20</u> petitions The first line signer will receive a personalized silver sword, or a gold plated sword if the recipient is a Past Commander, paid for by the Grand York Rite Bodies of Oklahoma, after the petitioners have received all their York Rite degrees. (Limit one sword per recipient for all three Bodies)
- (4) <u>30</u> petitions The first line signer will receive a Perpetual Membership in his home Council, (after the petitioners have received all the York Rite degrees) paid by the Grand Council, CM of Oklahoma. (a) If a top line signer has a perpetual membership he will have the option to add to his current perpetual membership account, or he may give the perpetual membership to any member in good standing, or purchase a perpetual membership in another Oklahoma Council in which he is a member. The cost will not exceed the cost of a perpetual membership in his home Council.

Resolution No. 3 - Passed

RESOLUTION No. 4 2010

To: Most Illustrious Grand Master and members of Grand Council, Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma.

WHEREAS, it is the intent to re-write the Constitution and General Laws of the Grand Council, Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma, and

WHEREAS, Article 3, Section 3, Voting, is being clarified to limit vote to a maximum of three for any member, and

WHEREAS, the changes being made are only to make the Constitutions of the Grand Chapter and Grand Council read approximately the same, and

WHEREAS, the current Constitution requires that any change shall be read and referred to the Jurisprudence Committee for examination, report and recommendation at the next Annual Stated Assembly.

THEREFORE, be it resolved that this rewritten Constitution of the Grand Council be

read and referred to the Jurisprudence Committee for examination, report and recommendation at the next Annual Stated Assembly.

CONSTITUTION ARTICLE 1

Section 1. **Name.** The name of this body shall be "The Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma".

Section 2. Allegiance. This Grand Council is a member of the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons, International.

Section 3. Jurisdiction. Its jurisdiction shall be the territorial limits of the State of Oklahoma.

Section 4, General Powers. This Grand Council shall have and exercise supreme power and authority over Cryptic Masonry within the State of Oklahoma. It has, and of right exercises, the sole power of government, superintendence and control over all Councils of Cryptic Masons in its jurisdiction.

Section 5. Special Powers. It has the power especially:

- **a.** To enact and enforce all laws and general regulations for the government of the Cryptic Rite of Masonry (Councils under is jurisdiction, and), at pleasure, to alter, amend or repeal the same.
- b. To constitute new Councils by granting dispensations and charters under seal (with the right to confer therein the degrees of Masonry denominated Royal Master, Select Master and Super Excellent Master), and, for good cause, may (arrest,) annul, revoke, suspend (or amend any pre-existing charter) and I the same at (its) pleasure.
- c. To settle all controversies that may arise between its constituent Councils (and it has the final decision and determination on all grievances and matters of controversy that may be brought up by appeal or otherwise).
- d. To reprimand, suspend or expel from its own body any member for a violation of its Constitution or the General Laws of the Grand Council, made in pursuance thereof.
- **e.** To assess and collect from the several Councils under its jurisdiction such sums of money, annually, as may, from time to time, be approved for its support and maintenance of the Grand Council (and its charities).
- **f.** To supervise the state and condition of its own finances, and to adopt such measures in relation thereto as may be deemed for the good of Cryptic Masonry.
- g. To establish and preserve a uniform (ritual of the several degrees of Cryptic Masonry.) code of work, ceremonies, rituals and degrees.
- h. To consider and review at each Annual Assembly the reports and actions of the Grand Officers, and of the several Councils under its jurisdiction, for the preceding Cryptic year.
- i. To consider and do all whatsoever it may regard as necessary, or appertaining to the well-being and perpetuation of Cryptic Masonry in Oklahoma.
- j. (The enumeration of the foregoing jurisdictions and powers shall in no manner limit the jurisdiction, power or right of this Grand Council to exercise its inherent powers as sovereign, according to ancient custom and usage, over any other matter or thing falling within the sphere of Cryptic Masonry in this Grand Jurisdiction.)

ARTICLE 2

Section 1. Of Whom Composed. The Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma shall be composed of the following officers and members: Grand Master, Deputy Grand Master, Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, Grand Treasurer, Grand Recorder, Grand Captain of the Guard, Grand Conductor of the Council, Grand Marshal, Grand Steward, Grand Sentinel, Grand Chaplain, and Past Grand Masters.

The Masters, Deputy Masters and Principal Conductors of the Work, for the time being, of Constituent Councils in its (this) jurisdiction, and of all Past Masters of such Constituent Councils, so long as they remain members of Councils in this jurisdiction, Past Masters of other Grand Jurisdictions who have affiliated with a Council under the Jurisdiction (of this Grand Council) may and become (a member of this Grand Council by majority vote at any Annual Assembly of) affiliated with a constituent chapter and who have been elected to membership in this Grand Council.

Section 2. Proxies. Should the Master, Deputy Master or Principal Conductor of the Work of any Council be unable to attend any Assembly of the Grand Council, (any) either of them may appoint any member of his own Council as his proxy to represent him in the Grand Council. The Certificate of Appointment shall be in writing and signed by the officer appointing him and attested by the Recorder.

(In the event that the Master, Deputy Master or Principle Conductor of the Work of a Council, for reason of death or permanent removal, is not available to sign the Certificate of Appointment, the authority to appoint a proxy for that office or offices and to sign the Certificate of Appointment shall devolve upon the highest ranking officer, Master, Deputy Master or Principle Conductor of the Work.)

Section 3. Officers' Titles. The title of the Grand Master is "Most Illustrious". (The title) of the (all) other elective officers (Grand Officers shall be) "Right Illustrious"; and of the appointive (Grand) Officers (shall be) "Illustrious", Any companion who shall have been elected to the position of Master of a council is entitled to the title of "Illustrious", and any Master of a council who shall have completed the term for which he was elected shall be entitled to the rank of Past Master and shall also be entitled to the title of "Illustrious". (and Master (and Past Master) of constituent Councils shall be addressed as "Illustrious". All other officers shall be addressed as "Companion", the title common to all Cryptic Masons. Past Officers shall be addressed as present officers of like rank).

ARTICLE 3

Section 1. Annual Assembly. One Annual Stated Assembly of this Grand Council shall be held and special assemblies may be convened, as provided by its laws. **Section 2. Quorum.** To authorize the opening of the Grand Council there shall be present the representatives of nine chartered Councils, which number shall at all times constitute a quorum.

Section 3. Voting. On all questions before this Grand Council each member present shall have one vote, by virtue of membership, but, when voting by paper ballot, a Past Grand Master who is then serving his Council as Illustrious Master, Deputy Master or Principal Conductor of the Work (is entitled to one vote), or who is carrying a proxy or proxies as specified in Article 2, Section 2, shall be entitled to (any combination of) a maximum of three votes.

Voting in this Grand Council shall be, first, by paper ballot, and, second, by show of hands. The first method shall be used in the selection of officers and elsewhere as provided by law, except that, by unanimous consent, the second method may be used. In all other matters the second method shall be used unless nine or more members concur in a request for (a paper) ballot, in which case the first method shall be used; provided that the Grand Master or presiding officer, may, on occasion, order the use of the first method, when in his judgment, the second method would not properly reflect the will of the Grand Council.

ARTICLE 4

Section 1. The Constitution of this Grand Council shall be construed as paramount to the General Laws; and all laws, rules, regulations and edicts heretofore enacted and decisions of Grand Masters in conflict therewith, shall be null and void.

Section 2. This Constitution shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption by this Grand Council.

Section 3. Constitution, How Altered. This Constitution may be altered or amended by resolution, in writing, stating distinctly the proposed alterations or amendment, which

shall be read and referred to the Jurisprudence Committee for examination, report and recommendation at the next Annual Stated Assembly. An affirmative vote of two-thirds of the total votes cast shall be necessary for its adoption.

In the event any such proposed alteration or amendment to this Constitution contains any proposition that would have the effect of relinquishing, eliminating or detracting from the Sovereign Powers of this Grand Council; then, and in such event, in addition to the foregoing provisions for adoption, such proposition shall be submitted to the constituent Councils, and should nine or more Councils vote to reject the proposition the same shall be declared lost.

On page 29 of the preprint concerning the "Proposed Agreement of Cryptic and Templar Brotherhood" be changed to reflect that the actions will be on two separate dates and that proper names of the Organizations should be used.

The committee would like to commend the Illustrious Grand Master on a successful year and thank him for his tireless efforts in traveling across our Grand State promoting York Rite Masonry on behalf of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons.

Membership - 98 Councils reported a membership of 11,298, a net loss of 410 as compared to 488 loss the previous year, 294 advancements were 14 fewer than last year. MASONIC CHARITY FOUNDATION REPORT

The Masonic Charity Foundation continues to be a visible charitable activity of the Oklahoma Masonic Family and continues to provide financial assistance for charitable and educational activities throughout the state, made possible by donations to the Foundation and the investment policies monitored by the Investment Managers and ratified by the Board of Directors.

The programs of the Masonic Charity Foundation continue to touch more lives and meet a wider range of needs than any other private philanthropy in Oklahoma. Through the Community Matching Funds and the Promises Matter Matching Funds programs, funds are available for charitable projects of the local Lodges. In cooperation with the Area Agencies on Aging, funds are dispersed to those in need, in addition to the Matching Funds program. The local AAA receives the funds and distributes them to the

persons 55 years and older who qualify for financial assistance. The Matching Funds program and the Promises Matter Programs are still very active and more Lodges are encouraged to avail themselves of these funds for their local communities.

Many other programs are still in place and active, such as the Student of Today, Teacher of the Year, Partners to Prevent Blindness, OETA support, Essay Contest, assisting our Masonic youth organizations and others, all of which are important to our Masonic activities.

Our continuing support of the Masonic Charity Foundation is very important if we are to continue our charitable and educational support and the relief of those in need in our communities.

CMMRF COMMITTEE REPORT

Founded in 1986 to research and find cures for arteriosclerosis and its complications, the Cryptic Mason Medical Research Foundation has made great progress in finding treatments for a disease that touches everyone in all walks of life.

Most recently, support from the Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation (CMMRF) has bolstered ground breaking research into the use of a patient's own stem cells to treat Peripheral Vascular Disease (PAD) in the legs. The goal was to repair vessels or grow new ones, increasing blood flow to the patient's legs and sparing them from amputation. When 32 patients were injected with stem cells derived from their own bone marrow, all but one of the patients avoided amputation.

Keith March, M.D., Ph. D. CMMRF Chair in Vascular Biology and Medicine is also looking into the other uses for adult stem cells ranging from heart attack to poor leg circulation, difficult wound healing, stroke and diabetes. This research is leading to the creation of new devices and technologies that have been used in more than 5,000,000 patients.

"None of this would have happened without the early support of the Cryptic Masons and their visionary decision to fund our center," Dr. March said.

Total contribution from 19 councils in Oklahoma for 2009 was 1669. Again, I would urge every companion to give as generously as he can to the great cause, for it may help you or a member of your family.

The committee wishes to thank the Companion Jim Mahan, Most Illustrious Grand Master for the opportunity to serve York Rite Masonry and we commend him for his leadership.


GRAND COUNCIL OF CRYPTIC MASONS OF OKLAHOMA DISTRICT DEPUTIES FOR 2010-2011

LEWIS A. HULLUM GRAND COMMANDER 2009-10

Lew was born to Al and Dorothy Hullum on 4 October, 1946 in Oklahoma City, OK. Dad had grown up in a Southern Oklahoma town where he became a Mason and served as Master of his Lodge during the depression era in Oklahoma. He moved to Oklahoma City and worked for the MacDonald Douglas Aircraft Company where he met and later married Dorothy Brumley.

In 1948 the Federal Government purchased the MacDonald Douglas facility and laid everyone off until they could set up the Tinker Air Force Base Organization. While Dad and Mom were waiting to be rehired, Dad was asked to manage a local grocery store by Ike Goldman who had a dream to create "Super Markets" using shopping carts that Ike invented. Al's Dad had owned and operated a general store where Al had worked while he was growing up. We moved to Shawnee, OK where I grew up.

I grew up with four Brothers and Sisters. Throughout my adolescent years, Dad constantly taught all of us how we should live and interact with others. At the time, I didn't realize that his teachings went beyond the do's and don'ts that most kids are taught, until I became a Mason. Dad passed away before we had a chance to discuss Masonry in a more direct personal manner. This is one of the true regrets in my life.

I graduated from Shawnee High School in 1964. After a series of short periods at the

University of Oklahoma, United States Air Force, working at Standard Humpty Dumpty Super Markets, and being hired by Tinker AFB, I met and married Janet Marie Carter. I was completely infatuated with her and fortunately for me she was infatuated with me. She and her large family were devout Catholic. I converted from Methodist to Catholic when we were married in 1969.

In the mid 1970s the Pope convened "Vatican II". At this conclave of church leaders, the Catholic Church decided to lift its objections to Catholics who wanted to be members of the Masonic Fraternity. At that time I remembered Dad's subtle hints about the Masonic Fraternity while I was growing up. Jan and I were planning on building a home and contracting it ourselves. I was working the graveyard shift and had watched a local builder build our first home, which was much too small for our needs. I went to the local lumber supply yard where I met the Master of Shawnee Lodge #107. I noticed his installation picture on the wall and asked him about membership. This conversation led to me petitioning the lodge for membership where I was promptly black balled. A man Jan worked with cornered me at her office and impressed me with the thought that there was a member in the Lodge that had a problem with Catholics in the Fraternity and wanted me to wait the required year and repetition. He assured me that within the year the Lodge members would work to educate this member on the day and age that we were currently living in instead of the day and age he was living in. They must have been successful because this same Mason was instrumental in teaching me my Masonic work as I was progressing though the Blue Lodge Degrees. I might add that Jan, being Catholic, wasn't sure how much her family would support us when they found out what I was doing. She told me she would not, in any way, limit me in my Masonic activities. But, that she wanted to keep peace in her side of the family and wouldn't participate in my Masonic activities. It's been interesting and gratifying to me to watch her transition as a Masonic wife and not only helping me but taking an active interest in all of my Masonic functions. Even to the point of telling a co-worker off because he made some disparaging remarks about our Fraternity.

At that time I made a vow to myself that I would take all Masonic Degrees made available to me during the rest of my life. Boy, I had no idea how vast an idea that was. After earning the status of becoming a Master Mason, I took my Scottish Rite Degrees because

Dad had taken them and I felt that many of his teachings had been generated from his experiences there. After taking those degrees while working in the Scottish Rite Temple, I met and became impressed with members of the York Rite. Dad hadn't believed that the York Rite existed in Oklahoma so he hadn't participated in them. In retrospect, I believe he would have concluded that the York Rite and Scottish Rite Degrees are compliments of each other and not mutually exclusive ideas for Masons to disagree on. At that time, I didn't know that I was not recognized as a Master by the Masonic Fraternity outside of the United States, until I took the Royal Arch Degree in The Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Mason.

After becoming a Royal Arch Mason I became eligible to take Masonic Degrees on an International Scale. The Degrees that I have taken while on my Masonic path are, Blue Lodge, Scottish Rite, York Rite, York Rite College, Allied Masonic Degrees, Red Cross of Constantine, Royal Order of Scotland, Shrine, Masonic Societas Rosiccruciana, Knight Masons, National Sojourners, Grotto, Eastern Star, The Order of the Symbolic Chain, and Royal Order of the Ducks.

My proudest moments were serving as Most Illustrious Grand Master of Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma, being coroneted an Inspector General Honorary, and serving as Grand Commander of Knights Templar of Oklahoma. I've also been presented with the KYGCH (2 quadrants), Purple Cross in the York Rite College, and Demolay Legion of Honor awards. I was fortunate to have, in addition to my Dad, some very well known and prominent Oklahoma Masons who helped me understand what I believe Masonry to be. Many Masons spent countless hours working on and presenting the classic Masonic Degrees to help me understand the relationship of Masonic beliefs to my life. To further impress me with these relationships Masons such as Nolan Watson, Lec Moore, Neil Leech, C. W. Epperson, Gene Smith, Fred Smith, Ben Mandlebaum, Joe Lewis, Joseph Jennings, and a group of men that referred to themselves as the "Lost Word Club" in Shawnee Lodge #107 made me the Mason I am today. I look forward to conveying the ideas and messages that I have learned to those who come after me. I also pray that the true tenets of Masonry live forever in the lives of those who come after me.

This was a very interesting Inspection Year. As I traveled to most every Commandery, I found that several Commanderies didn't feel that Grand Commandery Officers supported their activities. This created an uncertainty within their membership about how important York Rite Masonry is. Therefore their participation lacked direction. I believe that this fact has had a direct bearing on our Inspection activities. Being able to confer the Orders of Knighthood are paramount to rewarding deserve Masons in the State of Oklahoma. I truly believe that the principles that a Sir Knight obligates himself to are the ultimate attributes that any man can aspire to. But, if Commanderies can not impress the Mason with these responsibilities, that Commandery is doing a great disservice to the Mason and the Order. Our Inspections help us insure that Commanderies can perform this required act in an impressive manner. I am happy to report that I observed improvement in all Commanderies except two. We had much more participation at Work and Tactics than we had seen in recent years. Our goal was to open Grand Commandery and provide complete examples of how a Commandery should open and receive visitors. Due to a technicality we did not exactly carry out this goal. But, we did provide more complete visual representations of appropriate actions than we had given before. I believe we need more occasions for these activities by the Grand Commandery for the future.

I used the Knight Templar Magazine inserts to point out items that I believe you should take a pro-active attitude in. Most Grand Commanderies use them as avenues to brag on local Commandery and Sir Knight Accomplishments. I hope that in the future we might use the insert to highlight our activities instead of pointing out our shortcomings.

Letters of Resignation:

I have deep regrets in accepting the notice from SK Edwin C. Womack, Grand Standard Bearer. He will not be available for election to Grand Junior Warden. He has been dealing with some very serious health problems. We offer our prayers for a full recovery for him.

Observations and Recommendations:

The Oklahoma Grand Commandery is considerably stronger than it appears. Its strength comes from a combination of older experienced members working with newer younger members who have begun to become curious about the Masonic Mysteries that are hinted at but not explained in other Masonic Bodies.

I have heard Masonic Leaders in many constituent Masonic Organizations refer to Membership as being a central "problem". To me, this implies that we're not signing enough new men and taking their money like many social organizations. What sets Masonry apart from these other organizations is what we share with men when they knock on the Preparation Room Door. Our Degrees and Orders are what we are about. If we present the Degrees and Orders in a manner that leaves a lasting impression with these men, I believe that the "symptom" of membership will disappear because we will have solved the real problem of not presenting the Degrees and Orders in the proper manner.

I believe that the Grand Commandery Officers should convene Grand Commandery events for general activities more often than once per year. Conducting a day of Drill Ceremonies in each of the areas Eastern, Western, and Central Oklahoma, would give all members the chance to see the ceremonies and drills performed in their proper form. This plan would give them a better understanding by example of the proper manner of presentation.

Being elevated to the Rank of Sir Knight should be one of the most memorable experiences that a man can have. We sometimes become so engrossed in activities such as inspections that we forget that the presentation and ceremony isn't about us. It is about the Mason who has earned the right to that privilege and is proceeding through our ceremonies. We need to make sure that a man traveling from Mason to Sir Knight understands the solemnity and importance of his journey. We need to concentrate on him more than ourselves.

Thank you for allowing me to represent you this year. It truly has been an experience that I will always treasure.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman SK John L. Logan at 9:35 p.m. Covered were the actions, dispensations, general orders, correspondence and committees of the Grand Commandery for this Templar year.

It was noted by the Jurisprudence committee that all correspondence and general orders should be submitted through the General Grand Secretary's office for proper record keeping and distribution.

The committee reviewed the Grand Commander's address and makes the following change: General Orders #7 and #8 are deleted. General Orders #7 and #8 were not distributed to the constituent Commanderies

Resolution #1 was found to be in proper order with this exception: Under Section 4 the

words "Grand Council of KT of Oklahoma", should read "Grand Commandery of KT of Oklahoma".

The Jurisprudence committee noted that pictures were taken in a tiled asylum while performing degree work which is in conflict with Masonic practice in Oklahoma and should not be done during the performance of the degree as it distracts from the solemnity of the Order and the pictures taken under this circumstance be destroyed.

On page 31 of the preprint concerning the proposed agreement of Cryptic and Templar Brotherhood be changed to reflect that the actions will be on two separate dates and that proper names of the Organizations should be used.

The Committee would like to commend the Right Eminent Grand Commander on his hard work in hosting the South Central Department Conference and personal commitment to improving Templarism throughout our state with his multiple visits to our constituent Commanderies. The Grand Commander is also commended for providing an insert each month to the Knight Templar Magazine.

THE REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON GENERAL MATTERS

We find the condition of our local Commanderies rather mixed. Eight Commanderies reported an increase in membership. Lawton No. 18 did the best. They had a 10 percent increase and a net gain of 9. Others showing gains were Oklahoma No. 3, Ardmore No. 9, Trinity No. 7, Elk City No. 22, Gethsemane No. 25, St. Aumer No. 29 and Capital Hill No. 53. Norman No. 38 shows an increase of 53. Sixty-five transferred from Shawnee, which gave them a net loss of 15.

Several Commanderies continue to be late in filing their returns. Some also are not fulfilling their inspection responsibilities.

The loss of members across the jurisdiction is slowing. This year we experienced a loss of 1.5%. If each Commandery would work on membership, we could easily show a gain for 2010.

We suggest the Officers in Charge and the Deputy Grand Commander pay particular attention to those Commanderies at risk, work with them, and outline a workable plan to strengthen them. Any local Commander refusing to work to improve his Commandery should be removed from office by the Grand Commander.

THE MASONIC CHARITY FOUNDATION OF OKLAHOMA

The Masonic Charity Foundation of Oklahoma is an Oklahoma not for profit corporation formed July 9, 1930, for the purposes of encouraging charity, benevolence, education and philanthropy. It was created in order that the institutional giving of Oklahoma Freemasonry could be better focused and coordinated. The activities of the Foundation do not replace those of the individual Masons; they merely serve to supplement them.

Management

The Foundation is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of twenty-two members. The Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of the State of Oklahoma elects fifteen of the Directors,

three each year, for a five year term. There are also three Directors representing the Scottish Rite, one from each Valley, three Directors representing the York Rite, one from each Grand Body, and one Director from the Order of the Eastern Star. Board members receive no monetary compensation of any kind. The Foundation has a full time staff working in the Edmond office, under the direction of John L. Logan, Executive Director. Financial

The Foundation 12/31/09 financial report shows an increase to the general fund of \$3,433,518. The 2010 budget projects revenues of \$5,720,841 and expenses of \$3,262,409.

Lodge Matching Funds

This program was established in 1983 and designed to encourage and support local Lodges in charities by matching local Lodge monetary contributions in the areas of scholarships, local disasters, local charitable causes and local community services. In order to qualify, the Lodge must be actively engaged in raising the money to be matched. In 2002, the amount was raised to \$10,000, with the requirement that no more than \$7,500 could be used for community needs. The remaining \$2,500 could be used only for a needy Brother or his family. In 2007, the community matching funds portion was raised to \$10,000, with the \$2,500 remaining for Promises Matter matching. In 2009, 223 Lodges used the program in the amount of \$1,533,199.

Promises Matter

The Foundation stands ready to assist those Lodges and OES Chapters in caring for their needy members through matching funds or direct grants. Each Lodge or Chapter is in the best position to know which of its members need assistance. Lodges may use their entire \$12,500 allotment of matching funds for Promises Matter activities. The Foundation can be contacted immediately on a toll free number (1-877-5-Masons) if a member is discovered whose needs are beyond the ability of the Lodge or Chapter. In 2009, 34 Lodges/Chapters participated with grants totaling \$139,556.

Public Partnerships

The Foundation works with other organizations to achieve worthwhile goals and make Masonic charity more visible across the State of Oklahoma.

Partners in Prevention is a partnership with Prevent Blindness Oklahoma. Lodges statewide sponsor vision and glaucoma screenings, targeting the young and the elderly. The Foundation funded the project in the amount of \$100,000 in 2009 and has budgeted \$100,000 for 2010.

Oklahoma Educational Television Authority, better known as OETA, received a combined total of \$42,069 from 147 Lodges with matching funds from the Foundation. Our contribution allows us to sponsor four of the most popular programs of public television, the OETA Movie Club, the World of National Geographic, This Old House and Antiques Road Show.

The Oklahoma State Department of Education = Our support for public education is

demonstrated in four statewide programs.

The Oklahoma State Teacher of the Year program honors teachers who make outstanding contributions in the public education of our youth. The State Teacher of the Year is awarded a check for \$5,000, each of the eleven finalists receives a check for \$500 and each local Teacher of the Year receives a framed certificate of appreciation.

The Student of Today award is a program that encourages outstanding performance in students of all grade levels by recognizing exemplary students. Recipients are presented certificates, usually by local Masons, at their school awards assembly, or some Lodges host banquets for the winners. In 2009, the Foundation prepared 2,599 certificates for presentation by 195 participating Lodges.

The Teacher of Today award program is used by Freemasonry in Oklahoma to say "thanks" to those hundreds of teachers across our state that make a daily difference in the lives of our children. Each teacher receives a certificate presented by the local Lodge. It is a small token to express our appreciation to these men and women who carry the burden of the future on their shoulders. In 2009 the Foundation prepared 832 certificates for presentation by 184 participating Lodges.

The State Superintendent's Awards for Arts Excellence honor the fifty top high school seniors in the visual and performing arts in our state. In addition, the top school administrators and school board members are honored during a prestigious formal reception at the Guthrie Scottish Rite Temple. The students are presented medals by the Grand Master and State Superintendent of Education.

The Payne Education Center is a non-profit organization established in 1984. Since 1996 the Foundation has supported the Payne Education Center's Reading Readiness program designed to train kindergarten and transitional 1st grade teachers by providing \$75 reading readiness kits. For 2010, the Foundation budgeted \$40,000.00 for this program.

Senior Assistance Program -Through an agreement with the Oklahoma Area Agencies on Aging, a division of the Department of Human Services, \$772,749 was given in 2009 to assist needy Oklahomans aged 55 and over with services not covered by existing government programs. These eleven agencies can be accessed by calling 1-800-211-2116 or at www.okdhs.org.

Foundation Activities

A report of the Foundation activities including its audited financial statements is made annually to the MW Grand Lodge of Oklahoma and is printed in its annual proceedings. Additional information can also be found at the Foundation's website www.mcfok.org.

In April 2009 the Foundation funded the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation's Masonic Fraternity of Oklahoma Alzheimer's Disease Research Laboratory on behalf of the Fraternity. The \$1 million donation will fund the equipment requirements for the laboratory in the OMRF's new medical research facility in Oklahoma City.

It has been a great honor to serve as the Foundation representative for the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Oklahoma, and I thank the members for the opportunity to serve as their representative in this important work.

It has been an honor for me to serve as the State Chairman for the Knights Templar Eye Foundation again this year. I want to thank each of you for your needed contributions and support toward this worthy cause. I prompt each Commandery to have at least one fundraiser per year for this purpose. Soliciting your community through fundraising will help us accomplish the goal that we may not afford by ourselves. Through the years, the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc. has provided millions of dollars for approved procedures and millions more for Research Grants for the field of Ophthalmology.

Our partnership with Dean A. McGee Eye Institute, located in Oklahoma City, has continued to grow since its' beginning in 2003. As many know, they provide eye care for those in need. It seems that the demand grows each year. Through the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc. we have been able to contribute support for this worthwhile cause. I wish to that the Doctors and Staff at Dean A. McGee and the efforts of Sir Knights Ed Hart; PGC, Gene Harper, William Pearce and Jim Halbrook for their assistance.

Last year the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc. funded \$317,904.00 for eye care procedures for our friends and neighbors here in Oklahoma. Each year this figure continues to increase. Sir Knights, this past year we also increased our total contributions, but not enough. Our total contribution was \$11,734.36.

The 41st Annual Voluntary Campaign began October 1, 2008 and ended on April 30, 2009. TEMPLE REVIEW

The following are portions extracted from the proceedings of different Grand Commanderies for 2005-2008.

<u>Louisiana</u>----The 145th annual Conclave was held in the city of Baton Rouge on April 14 and 15 2008. S/K Beverly J. Guillot presided as the Right Eminent Grand Commander. All 15 Constituent Commanderies were represented for the Grand Conclave along with 12 past Grand Commanders in attendance. The Grand Recorder reported that the loss for the year of 2007 was seven and membership now stands at 1974. One Commandery reported a gain of 16 percent in membership. Four ministers were sent to the Holy Land this past year. S/K Daniel F. Thomas was elected and installed Right Eminent Grand Commander for 2008-09.

Washington—The Grand Commandery of Washington was organized on June 2, 1887. Their 120th Annual proceeding was held in Wenatchee on May 10, 2007. One of the continuing problems concerns monthly reports to the Grand Recorder. This is not a unique problem only to the state of Washington. Recorders need to be diligent in their work and get the reports to the Grand Bodies in a timely manner.

<u>Texas</u> ---- The 156th Annual Conclave was held at Waco on April 24-27, 2009. Membership increased this year by 662 and losses reported at 990 which spells a decrease in net membership of 439. Current membership is 9,980. The Grand Commander for Texas for 09-10 is S.K. Dock F. Dixon. The 157th Annual Conclave will convene in Kerrville on April 16-19 2010.

<u>Arkansas</u>---The Grand Commandery of Arkansas held its 135th Annual Conclave March 8-10 2007 in North Little Rock at the Wyndham Hotel. The report of the Membership Committee was encouraging. This year Arkansas has experienced a total loss of 31 in comparison of previous years of 100 or more. At the end of 2006, there are 1246 members in the Grand Commandery.

Minnesota—The city of Willmar, Minnesota was the site for the 141st Conclave of the Minnesota Grand Commandery. There was a net loss of 151 members and as of May 15, 2006 there are 2,439 members. Minnesota also has 1,217 Life Eye Sponsors which is commendable. The Grand Commander for this year is S.K. Allan F. Kauppi, Sr.

Ohio—October 5-7 2006 marked the 164th Annual Conclave at Columbus, Ohio. Ohio is one a few states that give grants to Seminary Students. The grants are in the amount of \$1,500 per year and may be requested for three years in writing each of the three years. The recipients must be in a recognized Seminary and studying for the ministry. These grants are funded from the interest collected on student loans, securities, investments, and bank deposits after all expenses of operation and administration have been taken care of according to the Grand Encampment Regulations and Standard Practice.

New Jersey—The 146th Annual Conclave was held at Somerset, New Jersey on March 3-6 2006. At the receipt of their report on their conclave, New Jersey had 1,001 members which reflects a 3% loss in membership. They are experiencing some Commanderies not filing reports and one in particular as being in arrears for 3 years in a row. The Grand Recorder has asked that this Commandery improve on submitting the required monthly and annual reports on time. This Commandery has installed a new recorder and the reports are expected to be in on time. In 2006, S.K. William C. Godfrey served as Grand Commander.

Michigan----The 152nd Annual Conclave was held in Kalamazoo on August 8-9 2008. R.E. Glenn Leeper, Jr. Grand Commander presided during 2007-08. The Grand Recorder reported a 38% loss of membership during the past six years. Membership stands as of March 31, 2007 at 2,675. Deaths and suspensions are the main reasons for this drop in membership. S/K David L. Seyferth was elected to serve as Grand Commander for 2008-09 with the next

Annual Conclave to be held on August 7-8 in Flint.

North Carolina—R.E. Richard M. Ripley is the Grand Commander for this jurisdiction for 2008-09. He was elected at the 127th Annual Conclave held in Hickory, North Carolina on March 18, 2008. On March 16 2009, the 1278th Annual Conclave was held in Raleigh. There are 3,942 members represented in the 2008 Grand Recorder's report. The Grand Commander elected to serve for 2009-10 is R.E. John McDonald Walston, Jr.

<u>South Carolina</u>---The 101st Annual Conclave was held on March 8-10 2008 in Spartanburg. Membership stands as of 12/31 2007 at 4,993 with a net loss of 276. The two main reasons for the decline was reported as due to deaths and non payment of dues. S/K William R. Hall was installed as the R.E. Grand Commander and will serve during 2008-09.

<u>Nevada</u>---The Grand Commandery of Nevada held its 91st Annual Conclave with a formal opening on June 8, 2009. The Grand Recorder listed membership at 577 with a loss of 62 from last year's membership. The newly installed Grand Commander is Ted P. Bendure. The 92nd Annual Conclave will be held in Reno on June 8, 2010.





Statewide, Trasen was praised this year for his excellent conferral of the "Order of the Temple" during inspection. He created the "Armory", a guide for Knights to equip themselves. He has personally made chapeaus, by hand, for many York Rite members and constantly encourages men to purchase and maintain a complete set of York Rite equipment. Finally, he was tapped as "Aide de Camp" for the Grand Commander as recognition that he tirelessly promotes Templary in Oklahoma.




