#### MATHEW A. TURNER BIOGRAPHY

Most Excellent Companion Turner was born November 15, 1987, in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, to Larry and Susan Turner. Companion Turner was a member of the Boy Scouts, where he attained the rank of Eagle Scout. After graduating from Moore High School in 2006, he enlisted in the United States Marine Corps and was honorably discharged in 2010.

Companion Turner received a BBA in Finance, graduating from the University of Oklahoma in December 2013. He began an internship at a bond brokerage while in college in 2012 and has continued to work in the role of a Municipal Bond Analyst.

Brother Turner was Initiated an Entered Apprentice in 2012, Passed to the Degree of Fellowcraft and raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in 2013 in Moore Lodge #539 in Moore, Oklahoma, where he also served as Worshipful Master in 2019, and currently serves as Secretary.

Companion Turner was Exalted to a Royal Arch Mason in August of 2014 in Norman Chapter No. 24, where he served as Excellent High Priest in 2017. Companion Turner was elected to the office of Most Excellent Grand High Priest on April 22, 2022.

Companion Turner received the degrees of Royal and Select Master in Norman Council No. 27, Royal and Select Masters in August of 2014, where he served as Illustrious Master in 2017.

Sir Knight Turner received the Commandery order in August and November of 2014 in Norman Commandery No. 38, where he served as Eminent Commander in 2018.

Leadership of the Grand Chapter, Grand Council, Grand Commandery, the Oklahoma Scottish Rite Valleys, and Oklahoma Shrines, met with the Grand Master and Grand Lodge officers to discuss the state of membership of the Fraternity as a whole, and what can be done to stop the decline in membership.

During these meetings, a presentation was given on a topic chosen by the Grand Commander, and general discussions were held. The Most Illustrious Grand Master and myself were invited to attend these Zoom meetings. During these meetings, I gave a brief update on what was going on in the Grand Chapter and encouraged the membership to plan engaging activities during their meetings to help with attendance. #### State of Capitular Masonry in Oklahoma

Membership issues continue to be a pressing concern. Exaltations of new companions continue to be outpaced by deaths and suspensions. We also pull our membership from a pool that is continuing to shrink, as fewer Master Masons are raised year after year. Continued decline in membership numbers will likely continue until we begin to again see growth in our lodges.

Generally, attendance at local chapter meetings has greatly improved since everything came to a halt in 2020. There are still chapters, however, that are regularly struggling to have a quorum in order to meet. Based on my observations, the Chapters that do have the best attendance tend to have some sort of program at their regular meetings, usually some sort of Chapter related education.

Though generally, most Chapters are able to proficiently open to conduct business, those that have had difficulties meeting quorum are struggling more with those basics. The utilization of the Custodians of the Work and their deputies would be of great benefit to these Chapters.

The Grand Master's Festival and Regional Degree Festivals are currently the only means by which candidates are being exalted. These festivals also currently only occur in the Central and Northeast Regions. Additional degree festivals in other regions would be beneficial, by cut down on travel time and offering additional opportunities to take the degrees. The membership committee has continued to do an excellent job promoting those festivals, and we thank them for all their hard work and dedication to that task.

We continue to see excellent ritual work from those chapters and teams that regularly put on the degree work, and we greatly appreciate the hard work and dedication of each the individuals involved in the degrees. With the regional degree festivals having become a big part of Exalting new Companions, it would greatly help to have all individual Chapters be able to put on the Mark Master and Past Master degrees in house since the regional festivals are not currently conferring those degrees. Having these degrees prior to the festival permits it to start later, allowing those Companions and Candidates attending more time to get to the festivals. A few Chapters have expressed a desire to do so.

Education continues to show effectiveness in engaging our membership, and offering value to our members. Those Chapters that do regularly hold some form of education tend to see increased attendance. The Grand Chapter has provided and made available many resources that can be used for education within the Chapter, however it is up to each individual Chapter to utilize these resources. Examples of educational programs, for Chapters that do not currently implement them, that can be given during a Chapter meeting, can be anything as simple as working through the degrees during the meetings, presenting papers on topics of interest to the individual Companions, or working though the Capitular Masonry Education Course. Not only does this help us learn, more about our degrees, but these engage our members, and brings and incentive to attend meetings.

#### **Concluding Remarks**

I want to express my sincere thanks and appreciation to R∴E∴ Jon Greene, Grand Secretary, for his hard work and dedication in the day-to-day administration of the Grand Chapter. Companion Jon, I greatly appreciate the changes you have implemented to increase efficiency and the many hours you spend every week making sure everything is getting done and helping us operate smoothly.

I also want to recognize M∴E∴ Kent Israel, Grand Treasurer, for his diligence in overseeing the finances of the Grand Chapter. Kent has done an excellent job keeping us apprised of the financial condition of the Grand Chapter.

I also want to thank R:E: Jim Cloud, Grand King, and R:E: Frank Bellardo, Grand Captain of the Host, for being excellent traveling Companions. There were few trips this year where I did not have at least one of these two in the car with me and was able to have hours of Masonic discourse.

To Companion Timothy P. Israel, Most Illustrious Grand Master of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma, and Sir Knight James R. Taylor Jr., Right Eminent Grand Commander of Knights Templar of Oklahoma, it has been a pleasure working with both of you this year. I have enjoyed our time spent together, and I thank you for the counsel and friendship you have provided as we diligently worked throughout the year.

To the officers soon to be elected and appointed, I wish you success in the coming year, and offer any help and support you need. I look forward to the ensuing year and look forward to the many successes which you will achieve.

Most importantly, I want to recognize all the Royal Arch Masons in attendance today and those who could not be here. This is your Grand Chapter. Without all of you in the quarries toiling away, running your meetings, participating in degree work, recruiting new members, cooking meals, and showing up, we would not be here today.

Serving as a Grand Officer of the Grand Chapter, and Grand High Priest has been a most humbling experience for me. It has given me a greater appreciation of those great men who have come before and will come after. I thank you for the opportunity to have served you, and look forward to the great work to come from those elected in the future, and all the individual Companions in this Grand Chapter.

The 2022 stock market performance was the worst since 2008. The S&P fell 19.4%, the Dow Jones Industrial Average lost 8.8%, and the Nasdaq tumbled 33.1%. We also incurred double digit losses. Despite the losses, with our strategy we were able to slightly increase dividends in our Perpetual Accounts. In the second half of the year, we made more than half of our dividends. I am hoping to continue to see growth in our dividends and interest in those accounts in coming years. So far in 2023 we have continued to see crazy volatility in the market and are currently positive for the year.

Changing investment advisors was a massive undertaking. We moved from Wells Fargo in Bartlesville to Morgan Stanley in Oklahoma City. It would not have been possible without our Grand Secretary Jon Greene. He was instrumental on getting not only tax id numbers, but pictures of original charters and other requested documents. Every time I felt we were close to getting everything setup with Morgan Stanley, they would need another document or signature. Thank you so much Companion Greene!

We added very few new members to our Perpetual Members list in 2022. With our change in Investment Advisors last year, checks were severely delayed and not mailed until the fall. The checks for this year have already been mailed out and are slightly larger than last year's checks.

Please see the attached statement of income and expenses for the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Oklahoma. In addition, the Grand Treasurer's report depicts the investment holdings and performance for the year.

We had a net loss of 44 Companions compared to a loss of 11 Companions last year. We Exalted 58 new Companions compared to 95 the previous year. Suspensions were 51 in both 2022 and 2021. Demits were 10 in both 2022 and 2021. Deaths were 49 in 2022 compared to 61 in 2021. We had 20 members reported on the Annual Reports who are unable to pay their dues compared to 14 last year.

Please be aware that perpetual fees are 15 times your yearly dues. If your Chapter's annual dues are not equal to or more than the per capita, you will not

recover your dues for that member. For example: at present, if your Per-capita is \$14.25 per member and your dues are \$28.50, you will get 50% of the dividends and interest. Less dues will be proportionately less, and more will be proportionately more. All computations are based on the time the perpetual was purchased. See Article 11, Section 21 of the Constitution and General Laws.

#### **EDUCATION**

To the Most Excellent Grand High Priest and Companions of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Oklahoma,

Significant progress has been made in recent years by the Committee on Education in producing and making available Capitular educational resources to both our Chapters and members.

The Capitular Masonry Education Course was published by the Grand Chapter in 2014. This text covers the history and symbolism of the four Chapter degrees and was adapted from a similar text originally introduced by the Grand Chapter R.A.M. of New York. The Course provides an excellent source of material for individual or group study.

In an effort to foster more opportunities for educational presentations during Chapter meetings, in 2016 the Committee on Education developed thirty-five lessons which are drawn from the *Capitular Masonry Education Course*, the Ritual of the Grand Chapter, and the Bible. These *Lessons* are specifically designed to enable presentation, participation, and discussion as a group during Chapter meetings.

During 2021 and 2022, a copy of the Capitular Masonry Education Course and a copy of the Lessons on Capitular Masonry were distributed to each of our Chapters.

During 2021 and 2022, the Committee on Education added one new educational resource for our Chapters and members: A monthly education enewsletter. Each month we explored a topic which we hoped was of interest to Royal Arch Masons (and Cryptic Masons). Each e-newsletter drew heavily from the two publications mentioned above, along with additional material from Masonic monitors, encyclopedias, and periodicals. Also included were relevant video presentations and links to even more information about that month's topic.

The twenty-fourth and final edition of this monthly e-newsletter was released in January 2023. Since then we have assembled all of our previously released editions into a single website, with links to each of the twenty-four topics covered. This new website may be found at:

This award is given to the Royal Arch Mason, who is considered worthy based on exceptional and meritorious service to Capitular Masonry above and beyond the call of duty.

Companion Michael T. Harden, Sr., has been instrumental in the survival and growth of Muskogee Chapter No. 3. Companion Harden has served his Chapter this past year not only as Excellent High Priest but also as the head chef. Companion Harden has been instrumental in much of the behind the scenes happenings. He has worked diligently in helping with the restoration of our beautiful Temple. He has also been the main cook for all the meals in York Rite since 2016. He has worked in helping get the Muskogee York Rite bodies as strong as it is today. He has helped with the membership by reaching out to Brethren to get them back active again, a crucial part in keeping Muskogee York Rite continuing to stay active. Not only has he been the main cook for the past several years, but he has also been the chauffer to all the Chapters, Councils, and Commanderies we visit throughout the year. He is a driver both figuratively and literally. He drives others to do better. He focuses on their strengths and uses them to help them stay more active in the York Rite bodies.

# GENERAL GRAND CHAPTER DISTINGUISHED SERVICE BRONZE MEDAL AWARD

### TIMOTHY P. ISRAEL BIOGRAPHY

Timothy Israel was born on January 8, 1954 to Esther & Marcellus Israel in Guymon, OK. He was raised in the Oklahoma panhandle town of Keyes where his father was a farmer and his mother sold Tupperware. His parents were not involved in the Masonic Family and there was no Masonic Lodge in his small town. However, he was not without Masonic influence.

Tim attended Southwestern State College (now Southwestern Oklahoma State University) in Weatherford for two years and then transferred to the University of Oklahoma in Norman to continue his studies and prepare to enter law school. He received his Bachelor of Business Administration degree with a major in Economics from the OU College of Business (now Price College) in 1976.

Shortly after graduation, in August of 1976, Tim married the love of his life, Jan Elizabeth Clark, of Boise City, Oklahoma. Two weeks after their marriage, Tim began Law School at the University of Oklahoma College of Law. Following graduation in 1979, Tim and Jan moved to Elk City, Oklahoma to begin the practice of law. He was involved in the private practice of law in Elk City from 1979 to 1987. Since then he has served as an Assistant District Attorney and has again returned to private practice in Beckham County.

In addition Tim served as the Executive Director of Sagebrush, Inc., a not for profit company which provides housing and employment for developmentally disabled adults.

Tim also served the Canute United Methodist Church as Lay Pastor from 1996 until he assisted in closing the Church in 2021.

The Israel's have three sons, Kenton Michael Israel, Timothy Kirk Israel, and Kyle Thomas Israel. Kent and Kyle are both Knights Templar, belonging to Elk City Commandery № 50. Kent is also a member and Past Commander of Oklahoma Commandery № 3, as well as currently serving the Oklahoma Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons as Grand High Priest, a position which Tim also held in 2008-09.

Jan was a "Rainbow Girl" and decided to join Eastern Star. She encouraged Tim to consider becoming a Mason. Tim was very active in Jaycees and postponed the decision to become a Mason until 1984.

Although Tim was busy with the work of his Lodge, Tim also joined the York Rite and was exalted in Elk City Chapter No 50, Royal Arch Masons, greeted in Elk City Council No. 25, and knighted in Elk City Commandery No. 22. In addition, he is a charter member of Altus Chapter No. 60 and Altus Council No.33.

Tim is also a member of the Guthrie Valley of the Ancient & Accepted Scottish Rite, where he served for several years on the 25th Degree team. He is currently serving on the 18th degree as the Spirit of Justice. He was Commander of Kadosh for the Guthrie Council of Kadosh. In 2011 he was Invested with the rank and decoration of a Knight Commander of the Court of Honor, served on the KCCH Induction Team as Grand Chancellor. The first Masonic degree Tim learned to confer was the Select Master degree and he has been active in his home Council serving as Illustrious Master and numerous other positions. He was recognized by the Grand Council, Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma with the General Grand Council Adult Leadership Award in 2002, as well as being selected as Cryptic Mason of the Year for 2009. He has also received the Ephraim Kirby Award.

Last year, the Grand Illustrious Master said, "I would consider the state of Cryptic Masonry in Oklahoma to be stable and improving. That may not seem like much of a compliment, but compared to other jurisdictions, we are doing very well indeed. Our recent emphasis on (i) membership recruitment and retention, (ii) ritual proficiency and degree conferrals, and (iii) education for both candidates and members has undoubtedly contributed to our success."

I found those words very encouraging and have tried to encourage those three areas.

I am going to "steal his "outline" for the next few sections. His analysis is beyond compare. I will merely update the information.

### **MEMBERSHIP**

After hitting an historic low of 1,365 members at the end of 2012, we fluctuated around that number for five years and ended the year 2017 with 1,361 members. While remaining essentially unchanged over a five year period may not seem like something to be praised, it is in fact the exception rather than the rule in Masonry these days.

This five year period of relative stability was followed by a three year period of net membership decline as we ended the year 2020 with 1,248 members. While some of this 8.3% decline can be attributed to the pandemic, much of the decline occurred during 2018 and 2019 before the general cessation of in-person Masonic activities.

While the good news WAS that in 2021 we resumed our previous relative success in membership recruitment and retention. We ended the year 2021 with 1,249 members, for a net gain of one member for the year! We did not fair that well this year.

In order to maintain our membership at its current level and potentially grow a bit, I adopt Clyde's proposal for each of our sixteen Councils to greet each year a number of new Cryptic Masons equal to or greater than 10% of their current membership. This does give us a very specific goal to reach, one that should be reasonable and manageable.

Actual results this year show that our membership declined by 21 members. If every council had recruited 1 new member more or had worked harder and saved one existing member from suspension, we would have been close to net growth.

### MEMBERSHIP RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION

We have a formal structure to our membership recruitment in the form of a Membership Committee with a statewide chairman and seven regional chairman. The results remain hit-or-miss. During this last Cryptic year, not calendar year, we, as a state, greeted 56 new members and reinstated 4. That is less than 5%. Although DEATHS took their toll (with 33) our bigger loss comes from SUSPENSIONS (with 41) We also lost 10 members who demitted. Our total GAIN was 63 members and that was overcome by our total LOSS of 84. The net effect was a net loss of 21 members across our 16 bodies.

A brief view of our overall numbers. Our largest Council greeted them most members with 13 and our next largest Council 10. From there, we had 2 councils that greeted 5 or more members; 7 councils with 1 or more. We had 5 councils that did not greet any new members. Every council, except 3, had deaths. It appears we had 6 councils that did not lose members to death.

A quick summary of that information. There was ONE council which grew by 3 members, one by 2, and 3 that grew by 1 (counting Affiliations).

This is not encouraging news. But, we can still save our membership by the specific plan set forth by my predecessor and others.

You will note that the above numbers are different from the information included in the Grand Recorders Report. That is because HIS report is Calendar Year and MY figures are from Grand Assembly to Grand Assembly.

I would propose that the Illustrious Master of each of our constituent Councils appoint for his Council a membership chairman whose task it would be to promote the York Rite in the local Lodges in that Council's membership district. The regional membership chairman would provide assistance and direction to these local membership chairmen.

In addition, we really need to maintain contact with our members who are both local and who have moved away. The Local Membership Chairman needs to appoint a member or two to re-establish and maintain contact with those members. A second benefit to that would be that we would know if they were ill, or had relocated, or, sadly, died.

The weakness we see in a few of the regional membership chairmen is that while they have been active in recruiting new members, most of their efforts have resulted in new members in their own Councils and relatively few new members in other Councils in their regions. It appears that we desperately need membership chairmen in each of our Councils who will actively recruit new members from the Lodges near their Council.

Several years ago, the Membership Committee (with the invaluable assistance of the Education Committee) labored diligently to produce a variety of promotional materials, including "Welcome to the York Rite of Freemasonry," "The York Rite and the Scottish Rite: Separate Origins – Shared Traditions," "Ten Reasons You Should Be a Royal Arch Mason," and a periodic newsletter "The Ancient Craft Mason." These tools, especially with the books from the Education Committee, are being used in our various Councils. If you do not have such education ongoing, pick up the books from the Recorder and start a study group.

Each year these materials, along with invitation letters from the Grand Presiding Officers, have been both sent as mailings to new Master Masons and displayed at various Masonic events (e.g., Scottish Rite Reunions, Grand Lodge Leadership Conferences, etc.) where prospective members might be in attendance. These efforts have certainly contributed to our recent success.

But mailings and displays can only go so far. We need to do more if we are to grow our membership. As noted above, it is vitally important that members from each of our constituent Councils make a sincere effort to attend Lodge meetings, District meetings, and other Masonic meetings in their immediate area to promote the York Rite. It is only through this type of personal contact with prospective members that we can expect to continue our success and not only maintain our current level of membership, but actually grow and prosper.

Special thanks should go to the Membership Committee. Keep up the good work. As we reviewed above, a neglected aspect of membership is the retention of members. It is vitally important to realize that the loss of each member due to suspension or resignation negates the increase in our membership from the greeting of

a new Cryptic Mason. As a result, we must diligently work to minimize membership losses due to suspension or resignation.

We need to continue all efforts, statewide and local, to continue or start this practice of contacting members in danger of suspension be continued in future years. In addition, it would clearly be advantageous for the members of each of our constituent Councils to personally contact their members in danger of suspension, and that contact should be made early and often.

### GRAND MASTER'S FESTIVAL

The annual Grand Master's Festival is a great benefit to the York Rite. Like several of those who have gone before me, I tend to think of it as a necessary evil. In a cursory review of out statistics, it appears that EVERY NEW COUNCIL MEMBER was greeted at either a Regional Festival or the GRAND MASTER' FESTIVAL. Our total was 56. Last year, Clyde said, "For some candidates, it appears to be the only way that they can (or will) join the York Rite." I submit it may be more. I am glad we are starting the Regional Festivals with the Most Excellent Master degree to encourage our local bodies to at least do some of the degrees at home, even if they are Chapter Degrees.

For several years the organizing committee of the Grand Master's Festival has been composed of the Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, along with the Grand Scribe (from the Grand Chapter) and the Grand Generalissimo (from the Grand Commandery). This administrative structure has the added benefit that the three Grand Officers forming this administrative committee will only serve for one year and don't have to worry about being stuck with the administration of the Grand Master's Festival for many, many years. It is my hope that we continue this administrative structure in future years.

We Greeted 45 new Companions into this Grand Council at the Grand Master's Festival.

Special thanks should go to this year's committee Grand Principal Conductor of the Work James, R. Taylor, Jr (Tulsa Council #22), Blaine C. McKnight (Council #3), and Glen A. Chaney (Lawton Council #21) for their hard work in making this year's Grand Master's Festival a success

### REGIONAL DEGREE CONFERRALS

Over the years, we have become terribly dependent upon the one-day degree festivals for new members. The efforts over the past several years to encourage regional degree conferrals is an effort to break this dependency. The Central Region, centered around Alpha Council #18, and the Northeast Region, centered around Tulsa Council #22, have been quite active for many years. Western Oklahoma had been very active, but it had devolved to just one local body doing most of the work. If you are going to do all the degrees yourselves, you might as well go back to doing them at your stated meetings. Unfortunately, most of us are coming up short trying to do that. I think the advantage of the Regional Degree Festival not doing all three bodies' degrees and orders in one day is a great change.

During the past twelve months, both the Central and Northeast Regions held a regional festival. A total of 11 new Cryptic Masons were greeted at these two regional conferrals. While the number of new Cryptic Masons greeted at these four festivals does not rise to the level of the 45 greeted at the Grand Master's Festival in Oklahoma

City in September, it does demonstrate that a significant number of candidates are looking for an alternative to the one-day degree festivals.

I would join my predecessor in proposing that we continue and expand these efforts. Specifically, that each of the two regions mentioned above continue to confer all of the degrees at least once during each year and that conferrals in other potential regions be explored as needed. The availability of these regional degree conferrals might also take a bit of pressure off the Grand Master's Festival. Plus an additional benefit of these regional conferrals might be an increased number of our constituent Councils who would be able to confer one or more of the degrees.

Special thanks should be given to our Grand Captain of the Guard Brian M. Ragain, (Council 21) who served as Chairman. He was assisted by his seven regional chairmen. I believe that the regional festivals are the best hope we have to get local Councils. We really need to keep these festivals and seek to have another Region or two to step up as well. I would recommend that we continue to make this statewide coordination a responsibility each year of the Grand Captain of the Guard and that he be assisted in the various regions by the regional chairmen and the appropriate District Deputy Grand Master.

### SUPER EXCELLENT MASTER DEGREE

At the Central Regional Festival held in Oklahoma City on February 4th, 2023, the annual conferral of the Super Excellent Master degree was held as called for by Article 4, Section 4 of the General Laws of the Grand Council of Oklahoma. This conferral was a joint effort of four teams from various regions of the state, under the direction of John Carter (Ardmore Council #11), Jim Taylor (Tulsa Council #22), Clyde H. Schoolfield, Jr. (Alpha Council #18) and myself, Tim Israel (Elk City Council #25 & Altus Council #33), This conferral of the degree as a joint effort has been quite a success since its inception a few years ago and it is my hope that this arrangement can be continued in future annual conferrals.

### RITUAL PROFICIENCY

Over the past several years, Schools of Instruction, each under the direction of one of the Custodians or Assistant Custodians of the Work, have been held in most of our constituent Councils. At these Schools, instruction has concentrated on the ritual for the opening and closing of the Council and the reception of visitors. The officers and members of the Councils involved have been very receptive to the instruction and have made good progress.

The Custodians of the Work hope to continue this practice, with the goal of holding a School of Instruction in each constituent Council at least once every two years. Since the Grand Chapter's Custodians of the Work are also holding Schools of Instruction, often on different dates than those of the Grand Council, this could result in some sort of School of Instruction being held in each local York Rite at least once per year.

I would like to see a walk-thru of at least one degree at these local schools as a tool to encourage our companions that the degrees really aren't that difficult.

A "plain English" version of our adopted ritual was authorized by our Grand Council at its Annual Assembly in 2003. Last year, Clyde Schoolfield directed the Custodians of the Work to prepare a manuscript of our ritual in "plain English," with limited encoding where appropriate (e.g., passwords, signs, obligations, etc.), suitable

for publication and general distribution to our membership. This has been accomplished.

### **EDUCATION**

Over the past several years, the Education Committee has introduced a number of resources to enhance candidate and member education. The candidate education resources are highlighted by: (i) a series of short prologues to be shown before the conferral of each of our degrees, and (ii) new member materials previously distributed to candidates on flash drives, but now available on our website.

The member education resources are highlighted by: (i) the Cryptic Masonry Education Course, which covers the history and symbolism of the three Council degrees and provides an excellent source of material for individual or group study, and (ii) the Lessons on Cryptic Masonry, which is twenty-four lessons drawn from the Cryptic Masonry Education Course, the Ritual of the Grand Council, and the Bible and is designed to enable presentation, participation, and discussion as a group during Councils meetings.

During the prior year, the Most Illustrious Grand Master presented a copy of the Cryptic Masonry Education Course and a copy of the Lessons on Cryptic Masonry to each of our Councils. I have seen those resources being used as I visited Councils this year. They are very well received. I was very happy to see them put to good use. I trust that the Illustrious Masters or an instructor will continue to use them. There is much benefit to having educational presentations at each of our stated assemblies.

Last year, the Committee on Education added one new educational resource for our Councils and members: A monthly education e-newsletter. Each e-newsletter draws heavily from the two publications mentioned above, along with additional material from Masonic monitors, encyclopedias, periodicals, and video presentations. The monthly education e-newsletter may be found at: https://okyorkrite.com/

I urge our Councils and members to utilize these plentiful resources and make Cryptic education an integral part of their Masonic experience.

### YORK RITE COORDINATION

According to Article 3, Section 2(h) of the General Laws of this Grand Council, it shall be the duty of the Committee on York Rite Coordination, along with its counterparts in the Grand Chapter and Grand Commandery, to "research, plan, and recommend programs for the advancement of the York Rite in Oklahoma; to coordinate promotional material; plan area and statewide festivals; provide a continuing file of personnel and facilities available for degree work; and such other duties as may be delegated to this committee."

While this committee has not "officially" met in recent years, its responsibilities enumerated above have been the subject of regular meetings of the Grand Officers, along with their counterparts in the Grand Chapter and Grand Commandery. This year we have met both in person and on ZOOM. The three Grand Heads have met at least 2 times per month either in Zoom conferences or telephone calls. It is extremely important, in my opinion, to have leaders who seek to be on the same page and that assist each other outside of our own Grand Body.

### GENERAL GRAND CHAPTER / COUNCIL TRIENNIAL

The 48th Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Council AND the 72nd Triennial Convocation of the General Grand Chapter will be held at Branson, Grand Council 22 129th Annual Assembly

Missouri on Saturday August 12 to Tuesday August 15 with the General Grand Council on Monday August 14 and General Grand Chapter Tuesday August 15.

I urge all of our Grand Council and Grand Chapter Officers to attend. It is a great time and is very educational. The biggest advantage is that it is close to Oklahoma and the travel time is minimal compared to some of our recent locations.

I have attended several and I personally highly recommend this event.

### SOUTH-CENTRAL REGIONAL CONFERENCE

The 65th Annual South-Central Regional York Rite Conference was held September 16th – 17th, 20221 in Shreveport, Louisiana. There were York Rite Masons from a six state region (Arkansas, Kansas, Louisiana, Missouri, Oklahoma, and Texas) and a number of national and international Grand Officers in attendance at the conference.

The 66th Annual South-Central Regional York Rite Conference is scheduled to be held September 15th – 16th, 2023 in Branson, Missouri. Any and all Cryptic Masons are welcome to attend. The conference is designed for those in leadership. We hope all our members are active and leaders. As always, there will be a number of interesting presentations. Leadership training will be available through the "York Rite Leadership Training Program" at the conference. A portion of it is also available online.

The 67th Annual South-Central Regional York Rite Conference is tentatively scheduled to be held September 20th – 21st, 2024 in Oklahoma at a location yet to be determined.

### **RESOLUTIONS:**

The Resolutions which you will find in this Pre-Print will be voted on by the Companions. I urge their adoption. They are really housekeeping issues due to the improvements offered by the YRIS / MMS database system AND THE ADDED AMOUNT OF WORK OUR RECORDER HAS TAKEN ON TO MAKE SURE EVERY CANDIDATE GREETED IS INCLUDED IN THE SYSTEM. I would strongly encourage the Grand Council to continue its three-fold emphasis on (i) membership recruitment and retention, (ii) ritual proficiency and degree conferrals, and (iii) education for both candidates and members. I would urge my successors as Grand Illustrious Master to continue these programs and to add to them, in their own ways, leading to a level of continuity for this Grand Council that will undoubtedly contribute to our future success.

I am going to miss our frequent visits and comradery. I wish to congratulate them on their successful completion of their terms of office. I believe that bonding and fraternal relationship that has existed among the three of us has indeed helped to contribute to the successes achieved by our York Rite over this past year.

I wish to thank the Officers and committeemen of this Grand Council for their unceasing dedication and hard work. The successes that we have experienced in this Grand Council 23

The 2022 stock market performance was the worst since 2008. The S&P fell 19.4%, the Dow Jones Industrial Average lost 8.8%, and the Nasdaq tumbled 33.1%. We also incurred double digit losses. Despite the losses, with our strategy we were able to slightly increase dividends in our Perpetual Accounts. In the second half of the year, we made more than half of our dividends. I am hoping to continue to see growth in our dividends and interest in those accounts in coming years. So far in 2023 we have continued to see crazy volatility in the market and are currently positive for the year.

Changing investment advisors was a massive undertaking. We moved from Wells Fargo in Bartlesville to Morgan Stanley in Oklahoma City. It would not have been possible without our Grand Secretary Jon Greene. He was instrumental on getting not only tax id numbers, but pictures of original charters and other requested documents. Every time I felt we were close to getting everything setup with Morgan Stanley, they would need another document or signature. Thank you so much Companion Greene!

We added very few new members to our Perpetual Members list in 2022. With our change in Investment Advisors last year, checks were severely delayed and not mailed until the fall. The checks for this year have already been mailed out and are slightly larger than last year's checks.

previous year. We Greeted 56 compared to 95 last year. Suspensions and withdrawals were 60 compared to 44 last year. We had 46 deceased Companions in 2022 as compared to 55 deceased Companions in 2021. We had 20 members reported on the Annual Reports who were unable to pay their dues compared to 14 last year.

Please keep in mind that perpetual fees are 15 times your yearly dues. If your Council's yearly dues are not equal to or more than the per capita, then you will not recover your dues for that member. For example: at present, if your Per-capita is \$13.75 per member and your dues are \$27.50, you will get 50% of the dividends and interest. Less dues will be proportionately less, and more will be proportionately more. All computations are based on the time the perpetual was purchased. See Article 11, Section 21 of the Constitution and General Laws.

It shall be the duty of the Illustrious Master to preside at all Assemblies of the Council and see that the by-laws of his Council and the Constitution and General Laws and Edicts of the Grand Council are strictly observed; that accurate records are made, and just accounts rendered; that regular quarterly reports are promptly made to the Grand Council; and that Degree, Reinstatement fees, and the annual dues are promptly paid. He shall appoint a committee to audit annually the books and records of the Council. He shall preside at the Assemblies of his Council. He shall attend all Assemblies of the Grand Council either in person or by proxy.

Any Council which shall neglect to make payment of such dues or assessments as may be levied against it by resolution of the Grand Council or which shall fail, neglect or refuse to send at least one representative to the Stated Assembly of the Grand Council, or which shall fail, neglect or refuse to file its quarterly or annual report to the Grand Recorder as required under this code shall be deemed to be delinquent and may, by resolution of the Grand Council, be held under suspension, during which the Council may not function as such except under special dispensation of the Grand Illustrious Master.

#### BE AMENDED TO READ:

Section 23. Penalties for Failure to Make Reports. Any Council which shall neglect to make payment of such fees, dues or assessments as may be levied against it by resolution of the Grand Council or which shall fail, neglect, or refuse to send at least one representative to the Stated Assembly of the Grand Council, or which shall fail, neglect or refuse to file its quarterly or annual report to the Grand Recorder as required under this code shall be deemed to be delinquent and may, by resolution of the Grand Council, be held under suspension, during which the Council may not function as such except under special dispensation of the Grand Illustrious Master.

#### RESOLUTION NO. 2 - PASSED AS AMMENDED

TO THE MOST ILLUSTRIOUS GRAND MASTER AND MEMBERS OF THE GRAND COUNCIL OF CRYPTIC MASONS OF OKLAHOMA:

WHEREAS: The Triennial Fund was set aside to help pay the way for the Grand Illustrious Master, Grand Deputy Master, and Grand Principal Conductor of the Work to attend the Triennial Session and;

**WHEREAS:** The Triennial Fund has not been changed to account for inflation costs in a number of years, and;

WHEREAS: We shouldn't expect the Grand Illustrious Master, Grand Deputy Master, and Grand Principal Conductor of the Work to go into great personal debt to attend the Triennial Session.

## NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED

Article 6, Section 5. Triennial Fund. A) The Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer shall accumulate the Triennial Fund in an amount equal to twenty (20) cents per member on the rolls of the Grand Council as of December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year in the Triennial Fund. These accumulated figures will be included in the annual budget for the Triennial year. This fund will be used to pay the expenses of the Grand Illustrious Master, Grand Deputy Master and Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, not to exceed twenty (20) cents per mile, one way, by direct route and twenty-five (\$25) dollars per diem while in actual attendance at the Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Council.

## BE AMENDED TO READ:

**Article 6, Section 5.** Triennial Fund. A) The Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer shall accumulate the Triennial Fund in an amount equal to twenty (20) seventy-five (\$0.75) cents per member on the rolls of the Grand Council as of December 31st of each year in the Triennial Fund. These accumulated figures will be included in the annual budget for the

Triennial year. This fund will be used to pay the expenses of the Grand Illustrious Master, Grand Deputy Master and Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, not to exceed twenty (20) sixty-five (\$0.65) cents per mile, one way, by direct route, two nights lodging, and twenty-five (\$25) fifty (\$50.00) dollars per diem while in actual attendance at the Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Council.

\*\*NOTE: R:I:. Companion Jon B. Greene, Grand Recorder, presented an amended version to mirror the resolution that was passed by the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Oklahoma. R:I:. Companion Greene recommended the adoption of the following amended version:

# BE AMENDED TO READ: (This version was presented and passed) Article 6, Section 5. Triennial Fund.

a) The Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer shall accumulate the Triennial Fund in an amount equal to seventy-five (\$0.75) cents per member on the rolls of the Grand Council as of December 31st of each year in the Triennial Fund. These accumulated figures will be included in the annual budget for the Triennial year. This fund will be used to pay the expenses of the Grand Illustrious Master, Grand Deputy Master and Grand Principal Conductor of the Work to attend the Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Council. For each of the three said officers, the maximum sum allowed will be one-third of the accumulated Triennial Fund.

## JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

To the Most Illustrious General Grand Master and Companions of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma,

The Jurisprudence Committee of this Grand Council met on Thursday, April 27th, 2023, in the Boardroom of the Hilton Garden Inn in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 2:45 p.m. by John D. Church, Chairman.

The Past Grand Illustrious Masters of Oklahoma commend Most Illustrious Companion Israel for his leadership and dedication to the progress of Cryptic Masonry during this past year.

We are pleased to note that he was able to make official visits to every one of our constituent Councils during his term and we are certain that his visits were most welcome. We also express our appreciation for his diligence in representing this Grand

Council at the meetings of other bodies and youth groups that comprise the family of Freemasonry in Oklahoma.

We commend him for his unwavering promotion of all of the programs which have been adopted by this Grand Council in recent years; in particular, (i) ritual proficiency, (ii) membership recruitment, (iii) regional degree conferrals, and (iv) member and candidate education. We encourage his successors to do the same.

The committee also reviewed that portion of the Annual Report submitted by the Grand Illustrious Master enumerating his official acts during the recess of this Grand Council, along with other of his acts and recommendations. We found that his dispensation issued to Tulsa Council No. 22 to move the date of its annual elections to be in conformity with accepted law and practice and well within his power.

The committee reviewed the seven Resolutions that have been submitted for the consideration of this Grand Assembly.

An amendment to this Resolution has been proposed by the Triennial Committee. Both the Resolution and the proposed amendment were found to be in legal and proper form.

In conclusion, we applaud our Grand Illustrious Master for a job well done and look forward to his many years of continued service to the York Rite of Oklahoma.

## **EDUCATION**

To the Most Illustrious Grand Master and Companions of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma,

Significant progress has been made in recent years by the Committee on Education in producing and making available Cryptic educational resources to both our Councils and members.

The Cryptic Masonry Education Course was published by the Grand Council in 2017. This text covers the history and symbolism of the three Council degrees and follows the same format as the Capitular Masonry Education Course, which was published by the Grand Chapter several years earlier. The Course provides an excellent source of material for individual or group study.

In an effort to foster more opportunities for educational presentations during Council meetings, in 2018 the Committee on Education developed twenty-four lessons which are drawn from the Cryptic Masonry Education Course, the Ritual of the Grand Council, and the Bible. These Lessons are specifically designed to enable presentation, participation, and discussion as a group during Councils meetings.

During 2021, a copy of the Cryptic Masonry Education Course and a copy of the Lessons on Cryptic Masonry were distributed to each of our Councils.

During 2021 and 2022, the Committee on Education added one new educational resource for our Councils and members: A monthly education enewsletter. Each month we explored a topic which we hoped was of interest to Cryptic Masons (and Royal Arch Masons). Each enewsletter drew heavily from the two publications mentioned above, along with additional material from Masonic monitors, encyclopedias, and periodicals. Also included were relevant video presentations and links to even more information about that month's topic.

The twenty-fourth and final edition of this monthly e-newsletter was released in January 2023. Since then we have assembled all of our previously released editions into a single website, with links to each of the twenty-four topics covered. This new website may be found at:

## **TRIENNIAL**

To: Most Illustrious Grand Master, Companions of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma

ARTICLE 3.

**Section 1. h. Committee on Triennial.** Consists of three Past Grand Illustrious Masters appointed by the Grand Illustrious Master at the first Stated Assembly following the Triennial Assembly and shall serve the Triennial term. They shall serve from one Triennial until the next.

Section 2. Duties of Committees. g. The Committee on Triennial. They shall advise the Grand Council of matters pertaining to the Triennial and make all arrangements for attendance at Assembly of the General Grand Council. They shall perform such duties as custom and usage require.

## ARTICLE 6.

Section 1. Financial Revenues.

#### Section 5. Triennial Fund.

- a. The Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer shall accumulate the Triennial Fund in an amount equal to twenty (20) cents per member on the rolls of the Grand Council as of December 31 of each year in the Triennial Fund. These accumulated figures will be included in the annual budget for the Triennial year. This fund will be used to pay the expenses of the Grand Illustrious Master, Grand Deputy Master and Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, not to exceed twenty (20) cents per mile, one way, by direct route and twenty-five (\$25) dollars per diem while in actual attendance at the Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Council.
- b. Any balance remaining shall be distributed equally among the Past Grand Illustrious Masters and Grand Recorder attending the Triennial Assembly, provided that none shall receive an amount in excess of the largest allowance to `a Grand Officer or more than he would receive if computed on the same basis as the Grand Officer's allowance.
- c. Provided further that if a Grand or Past Grand Officer is eligible to receive an allowance from the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Oklahoma, the total amount to be received shall be subject to the maximum as outlined herein. The allowance to the member from each of the respective Grand Bodies shall be determined by agreement of the Triennial Committee Chairmen.
- d. Any balance remaining in the Triennial fund after the close of the General Grand Council shall be returned to the General Fund of this Grand Council.

The 72<sup>ND</sup> Triennial Convocation of the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, International, and the 48<sup>th</sup> Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons will be held in Branson, Missouri, on August 12-17, 2023, at the Chateau on the Lake Resort Spa & Convention Center. ## YORK RITE COORDINATION

HERE IS WHAT WE DID (at least) THIS YEAR

We have not really followed the process set forth in our Laws since they were amended. The process that has been used is for all the Grand Officers to meet 'at what we call' "Quarterly Meetings." Our goal in the Quarterly Meeting is to get input from all 3 York Rite Bodies and the Officers present at those meetings. We have not restricted the attendance to just Grand Officers, although we seek to have them all show up, whether in person or on ZOOM.

This year the three Grand Heads have met regularly in addition to those

meetings. We meet in person, on the phone, over Zoom, or via email. There is barely a week that has passed that we have not had some type of consultation together in twos or with all three. We have sought to have a uniform front on all of our major decisions.

#### HERE IS THE GRAND COUNCIL CODE

Committee on York Rite Coordination- Prior to 2016
 This Committee shall consist of the Grand Illustrious Master, Deputy Grand Master, Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, and Grand Captain of the Guard. (Amended 4/22/2016)

#### Prior to 2016

k. Committee on York Rite Coordination. This Committee shall consist of the Deputy Grand Master and three members to be appointed. Each Grand Illustrious Master shall make the appointment of one member for a three year term. If and when vacancies occur, the Grand Illustrious Master will appoint a new member to serve for the unexpired term.

I am including the language used in the Codes of the Chapter and Council. The Commandery is the same, but has additional language which is italicized at the end.

#### **AFTER 2016**

h. The Committee on York Rite Coordination. They shall research, plan and recommend programs for the advancement of the York Rite in Oklahoma; coordinate promotional material; plan area and statewide festivals; provide a continuing file of personnel and facilities available for degree work; and such other duties as may be delegated to this Committee by joint agreement of the Grand High Priest, the Grand Illustrious Master and the Grand Commander. The Committee shall hold a minimum of three (3) meetings annually, the first of which shall be held within the three weeks following the Annual Assembly of the Grand Council. The first meeting to be held will include the election from its membership of a Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Recorder. A written report of each meeting shall be furnished to the Grand High Priest, the Grand Illustrious Master and the Grand Commander for their study and implementation.

It is recommended that the Grand Commander appoint the Committee to consist of the Grand Commander, Deputy Grand Commander, Grand Generalissimo, and Grand Captain General. The Committee shall serve concurrently with similar committees from the Grand Chapter and Grand Council.

#### YORK RITE COORDINATION REPORT and COMMENTARY

It appears that it may be time to revisit the design of this Committee. **Prior to 2016**, it was a committee of four, the Deputy Grand Master by virtue of his office and of 3 others who serve for a three year term. The One which is appointed by the MIGM will serve for 3 years. The two remaining members will serve out their 3 year term. This was changed in 2016 and appears to now be the top 4 elected officers.

They have very specific duties. They are supposed to act in connection with the York Rite Coordination Committee of each of the other two York Rite Bodies. The presiding Grand Officers, if they choose and agree, can assign specific duties to these committees. The code specifies when the first meeting shall be and how officers of the Committees shall be elected. The committees shall send a written report of their

3 mandatory meetings to the respective Grand Presiding Officer of their body.

The appointment of the top four elective officers (not including the Grand Treasurer or Grand Secretary / Recorder) is now mandated in Chapter and Council, but only suggested in Commandery.

I wanted all to know how I read this to work. The reality is that this year we did not follow this directive in our Constitution and Code. I set forth that reality for this year in the first few paragraphs of my report above. I have apparently served on this Committee since my election to this Grand Council Line. We know certain things have not happened during a portion of this these last few years due to COVID and the restrictions it placed upon us.

I fully believe that the three York Rite Bodies should coordinate their activities. I believe that has been done during the time I have held an elected office in the Grand Council.

By virtue of my term ending, I will no longer be on this Committee. As Chairman, I have drafted this report on my own and will share it with my Committee Members as well as the other two Grand Presiding Officers. If our Grand Bodies decide that they want to seek to amend this Committee, they will be free to make whatever decisions they would like.

## MASONIC CHARITY FOUNDATION

To the Grand Council of Oklahoma:

M.I. Grand Master and Companions,

The Masonic Charity Foundation of Oklahoma is an Oklahoma not-for-profit corporation formed on July 9, 1930, to encourage charity, benevolence, education, and philanthropy. It was created so Oklahoma Freemasonry's institutional giving could be better focused and coordinated. The activities of the Foundation do not replace those of the individual Masons; they merely serve to supplement them.

## **MANAGEMENT**

The Foundation is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of twenty-two members. The Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of the State of Oklahoma elects fifteen directors, three each year, for a five-year term. There are also three Directors representing the Scottish Rite, one from each Valley, three Directors representing the York Rite, one from each Grand Body, and one Director from the Order of the Eastern Star. Board members receive no monetary compensation of any kind. The Foundation has full-time staff working in the Edmond office under John L. Logan, Executive Director. ## **FINANCIAL**

The Foundation's 12/31/2022 combined balance sheet, less the Throckmorton Trust, reflects total assets of \$96,645,221, a decrease of \$17,410,524 from one year ago. Endowments, less the Throckmorton Trust, total \$90,816,030, an increase of \$1,016,555 from one year ago.

## LODGE MATCHING FUNDS

This program was established in 1983 and designed to encourage and support local Lodges in the area of charity by matching local Lodge monetary contributions in scholarships, local disasters, local charitable causes, and local community services. In 2022, 192 Lodges used the program for \$1,502,402. Since the Matching Funds Program began, the Foundation has contributed \$36,104,022 to support local charitable or educational projects. The local lodges' participation has created a minimum of \$72,208,044 of support for local community needs.

Matching Funds dollars have allowed lodges to double their fundraising ability to support local community needs. In 2022, Matching Funds provided an additional \$606,854 in support for youth and public education, \$135,659 to local fire, police, and veterans organizations, \$356,968 to individuals in need (or organizations who provide direct services to needy individuals), \$103,093 to senior citizen centers and charities who provide aid to seniors, \$64,962 to Masonic Youth Orders, and \$47,815 to support local museums, libraries, parks, and historical preservation projects. Matching Funds dollars and lodge fundraising injected over \$2.7 million into community charitable and educational projects.

## PROMISES MATTER

The Foundation stands ready to assist those Lodges and OES Chapters in caring for their needy members through matching funds or direct grants. Each Lodge or Chapter is best positioned to know which members need assistance. Lodges may use their entire \$12,500 matching funds for Promises Matter activities. In 2022, Promises Matter Matching Funds provided an additional \$327,430 to assist female OES and Master Masons members and widows with immediate financial needs due to illness, injury, or other hardship. Also, eight different Lodges received Promises Matter Grants totaling \$33,153. The average grant amount distributed was \$2,763.

The Masonry in Action Award program began in 2013 to recognize lodges that do an outstanding job utilizing the Foundation programs. The Foundation allows each winning Lodge the opportunity to specify a worthy nonprofit in their community to receive a \$5,000 grant. In 2022, Maud-Konawa Lodge 106 was the small lodge category winner, and Owasso Lodge 545 won the large lodge class for the sixth year. Maud-Konawa Lodge 106 designated their prize funds to provide a charitable grant of \$5,000. The Lodge chose to award the Maud and Konawa Public Schools for high school senior scholarships in Masonry in Action Award funds. Owasso Lodge 545 awarded their \$5,000 community grant to an outdoor education program administered by the Owasso Fraternal Order of Police and their Shop with a Cop Christmas program. Congratulations to both lodges!

## **PUBLIC PARTNERSHIPS**

The Foundation works with other organizations to achieve worthwhile goals and make Masonic charity more visible across Oklahoma.

Partners in Prevention is a partnership with Vizavance. Lodges statewide sponsor vision and glaucoma screenings, targeting the young and the elderly. The Foundation granted \$300,000 to support the ongoing costs of the program. Over 140,000 students were screened in the first semester of the 2022-2023 school year. The Foundation has provided over \$5 million to support this important mission, One Goal, One Vision, and One Mission Advancing Children's Education Through Better Vision!

Food Bank support has been an annual program since 2011. In 2022 the Fight Childhood Hunger Campaign resulted in \$69,000 being donated to the Regional Food Bank and \$31,000 to the Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma. The 2022 Masonic Food for Kids campaign ran from August 1 through October 15. This statewide effort combines the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma, the Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma, the Masonic Fraternity of Oklahoma, and Griffin Communications (Channel 5 in OKC and Channel 6 in Tulsa). Food Bank is one of three projects with statewide visibility that attempt to enhance the image of the Fraternity while supporting a significant charitable or educational purpose.

The Oklahoma State Department of Education - Our support for public education was demonstrated in nine statewide programs.

- The Oklahoma State Teacher of the Year program honors teachers who
  make outstanding contributions to the public education of our youth. The
  State Teacher of the Year is awarded a check for \$5,000, and each of the
  eleven finalists receives \$1,000. Each local Teacher of the Year receives a
  certificate of appreciation.
- 2. The Student of Today Award is a program that encourages outstanding performance in students of all grade levels by recognizing exemplary students. Each recipient receives a certificate, usually from a local Mason, at their school's awards assembly, or some Lodges host banquets for the winners. In 2022, the Foundation prepared 1,792 certificates for presentation.
- 3. Freemasonry uses the Teacher of Today Award program in Oklahoma to say "thanks" to those hundreds of teachers across our state that make a daily difference in our children's lives. Each Teacher receives a certificate presented by the local Lodge. It is a small token to express our appreciation to these men and women who carry the future burden on their shoulders. In 2022, the Foundation prepared 595 certificates for presentation.

- 4. The State Superintendent's Awards for Arts Excellence honor the Fifty top high school seniors in our state's visual and performing arts. Also, the leading school administrators and board members are honored during a prestigious formal reception at the Guthrie Scottish Rite Temple. The students are presented medals by the Grand Master and State Superintendent of Education. The 2023 event will be held at the Guthrie Scottish Rite on April 18, 2023.
- 5. The Payne Education Center is a nonprofit organization established in 1984. Since 1996 the Foundation has supported the Payne Education Center's Reading Readiness program designed to train kindergarten and transitional 1st-grade teachers by providing scholarships for enhanced reading techniques. In 2022, \$115,000 was provided, half allocated for teacher scholarships and the other to support their Digital Phonics Program.
- 6. **The Youth Scholarship Program** funding is through the Education Endowment. The scholarship program is open to DeMolay, Job's Daughters, and Rainbow members. This year sixty scholarships of \$3,000 each were budgeted, and forty-three were awarded as follows: DeMolay 9, Job's Daughters 2, and Rainbow 32.
- 7. The Senior Essay Contest was launched in 1966 in support of education. Writing teaches critical thinking skills. The essay contest is open to all seniors in Oklahoma public schools. The Masonic Fraternity in Oklahoma sponsors it as part of its continuing commitment to education. Cash prizes in the Men's and Women's divisions range from \$2,000 for 1st place to \$200 for 10th place. Also, a \$5,000 grant will be made to each of the 1st place winners in high school. For the 2022 2023 contests, 529 seniors entered the contest. A total of \$13,700 was awarded to the 20 statewide winners of the contest, and \$5,000 grants to the schools of each of the statewide first-place winners. Certificates for presentation to the local division winners of 62 high schools sponsored by 54 Lodges will be provided to the local Lodge.

Senior Assistance Program- Through an agreement with the Oklahoma Area Agencies on Aging, a Department of Human Services division, \$798,146 was given in November 2022 to assist needy Oklahomans aged 55 and over with services not covered by existing government programs during the calendar year 2023. Since the inception of this program in 2007, the Foundation has donated \$11,660,930 in the name of the Masonic Fraternity of Oklahoma to enhance the lives of seniors in our communities. # **CHARITABLE GRANTS**

In addition to partnerships with other charitable organizations or agencies, the Masonic Charity Foundation makes several grants yearly to support Public Education, Public Wellness, and Public Charities. Some highlights of 2023 grantmaking are:

- A \$1,000,000 gift will be disbursed in \$500,000 over two years to the Mercy Women's Health Center, which is currently finalizing construction. Due to the tremendous growth in the need for women's healthcare, there is an urgent need to increase the amount of physical space and quality of healing. The new center will offer comprehensive, collaborative care. An essential priority is providing services to the economically disadvantaged.
- Hearts for Hearing provides audiology and speech pathology services in a unique one-stop setting for children with hearing loss. Charitable services for young children ensure they can learn to speak, connect with the world, and become self-sufficient members of their families and communities. A \$200,000 grant from the Masonic Charity Foundation of Oklahoma will benefit hearing-loss families. In addition to providing the first set of hearing aids to children ten years of age and under at no cost to families, Hearts for Hearing also offers financial assistance for specialized speech therapy and audiology services.
- The Cavett Kids Foundation helps children with terminal or chronic illnesses thrive by using camp experiences to build character, coping skills, and connection. Camps are provided for kids of every age who may be dealing with heart issues, cancer, or other disorders. Masonic charity's \$25,000 camp funding in 2023 will provide two of Cavett's highest-level camp experiences throughout the year.
- The YMCA Military Welcome Center at Will Rogers International Airport provides a safe location for military personnel to rest, access mail and telephone services, find refreshments, and prepare for the journey onward. The Masonic Charity Foundation provided \$18,000 to support the operation of this facility in 2023.

#### SUPPORT OF MASONIC GROUPS

- Each year, the Masonic Charity Foundation supports a charitable or educational cause or project of the Grand Master's choice. In 2022, a \$12,000 grant for equipment was provided to the Arnett High School Science Department STEM program.
- Masonic Charity supports Masonic youth orders! In addition, \$64,449 in
  Matching Funds will be provided to local DeMolay, Rainbow, and Jobs
  Daughters in 2022. Scholarships of \$3,000 to youth order members and
  \$10,000 to each youth order's state-level trust to support ongoing
  programming and scholarships.
- The Supreme Assembly, IORG, also received a \$200,000 donation for renovating the Supreme Assembly building in McAlester.
- Each year, the Masonic Charity Foundation of Oklahoma contributes to the programming of several national Masonic organizations:
  - Gifts totaling \$1 per Oklahoma member are made by Masonic Charity Foundation every year to support the George Washington Masonic National Memorial in Alexandria, Virginia.

- An annual gift of \$1,500 is made to the Masonic Information Center, an organization operating under the Masonic Service Association of North America that publicly provides information on Freemasons and responds to Freemasonry critics.
- The Masonic Charity Foundation of Oklahoma supports every Masonic Services Association of North America plea for disaster support with a \$1,000 donation.
- Masonic Charity Foundation also provides annual contributions of \$4,000 to the Masonic Service Association of North America's Hospital Visitation Program, making Oklahoma's support of this program competitive nationally.

# CRYPTIC MASON MEDICAL RESEARCH

The Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation (CMMRF) incorporated on March 6, 1986, through the efforts of the General Grand Master Ben Mandlebaum (OK). The CMMRF funds research, under the direction of Dr. Michael Murphy, at the Indiana University School of Medicine in Indianapolis through the Indiana Center for Vascular Biology and Medicine (ICVBM) and the Richard Roudebush Veteran's Administration Medical Center. The CMMRF Executive Director since 2012 is Gary G. Wyne PMIGM of Indiana.

The ICVBM is committed to being a leader in basic as well as applied research in understanding vascular wellness and disease, and the development of leading-edge medical therapies to improve the care of patients with vascular problems. Through your continued donations, CMMRF has funded and continues to fund research and treatment through stem cell therapy and has resulted in medical breakthroughs in the treatment of Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm, Type 1 Diabetes, Cancer, Peripheral Artery Disease, Heart Disease, Stroke, COVID-19, and many other illness and disease that were poorly managed by today's medical standards. Because blood vessels are very important in maintaining the health of and repairing almost all tissues, nearly all diseases turn out to have a vascular component involved in their origin or tissue repair. Studies testing the use of adult stem cells from bone marrow, vertebral bone, and various ethically sourced samples are proving to be the future of medicine, made possible by our donations.

Nationally, donations made to CMMRF in 2022 totaled \$463,788.11, an increase of \$72,267.02 over the previous year. Oklahoma's giving of \$4,715.00 was a Grand Council 54 129th Annual Assembly

decrease of \$2,503.56 over the previous year. Donations made by Oklahoma's Companions ranked 21st in 2022 in comparison to other jurisdictions.

"The Bernard F. Mandlebaum Award recognizes the local Council which is credited with the largest dollar contribution in the preceding calendar year. Most Puissant Companion Mandlebaum was Grand Illustrious Master of the Grand Council of Oklahoma in 1962-1963. He served as General Grand Master of the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons, International from 1984-1987." Woodward Council #52's total donations of \$1,620.00 were the largest dollar contribution in 2022.

"The Robert W. Hill Award recognizes the local Council which is credited for the largest average contribution per member in the preceding calendar year. Most Illustrious Companion Hill was first Grand Illustrious Master of Indian Territory, serving in 1895-1896. He was a member of Oklahoma Council No. 1, Atoka, Indian Territory." Woodward Council #52's \$43.78 per member contribution was the largest in 2022.

Each Oklahoma Council is urged to hold at least one fundraising event each year for the benefit of this worthy philanthropy and to participate in CMMRF Month during March, and we are asking for a \$5 donation for each member of their Council. However, the youth orders must continually recruit new members. Older members "majority out" and without an influx of new initiates the membership Grand Council 55 129th Annual Assembly

numbers automatically decline. Because of the pandemic, all three orders were restricted in their ability to recruit new members for many months and are trying to make up for the time that was lost.

York Rite members throughout the state have supported their local youth groups with their time and money.

Most DeMolay activities resumed to their pre-2020 level. Conclave 2022 was held at the Embassy Suites Convention Center in Norman, July 7 - 10, 2022 with 182 registered attendees – a slight decrease from last year. Winterfest 2023 was held in Tulsa at the Doubletree Hotel, January 27 - 29 with good attendance. DeMolay Leadership Conference (DLC) was held on the campus of UCO in Edmond, July 17 – 23 with 125 attendees, which was an improvement over the previous year. Statewide membership is currently 675, which is a decrease of 21 members from the previous year. It should be noted that membership is DeMolay is for life and the 675 members are not all active participants. We currently have eighteen active DeMolay Chapters.

Oklahoma Rainbow has resumed virtually normal operations after the pandemic. Grand Assembly 2022 was held at OU on Memorial Day Weekend with good attendance. The Grand Worthy Advisor's project this year is Oklahoma Cancer Research Institute. Her goal is to raise \$10,000 and is nearly there. This year was the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of Rainbow in McAlester, Oklahoma, by Rev. W. Mark Sexson, Past Grand Master and Past Grand Patron of Oklahoma. The Supreme Assembly was held in Oklahoma City July 27 to August 4 with attendees from all over the United States and many foreign countries. Oklahoma Rainbow performed the Grand Cross of Color Ritual and did an outstanding performance in front of the international attendees. The Mother Advisor's Workshop and Rainbow Leadership Retreat were both held in Guthrie and were very successful. The current membership is 353 which is a decrease from the previous year. Oklahoma Rainbow has twenty-three active Assemblies.

Oklahoma Job's Daughters: There are currently four active Bethels with 28 members in Oklahoma. Oklahoma Job's Daughters is being managed long distance by a Supreme Deputy in Kansas. There is not currently a Supreme Deputy in Oklahoma.

The authority for said decision is set forth in Constitution, Laws, and Regulations of The Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Oklahoma under ARTICLE XIII, of the Laws and Regulations, styled APPEARANCE IN UNIFORM which provides, in part: Section 1. Every officer and every Sir Knight must appear in Full Dress Uniform at the opening of the Annual Conclave and of each Constituent Conclave unless he is excused there from by the Grand Commander or by the Commandery.

However, in that same General Order All Past Grand Commanders of this Grand Commandery, and Dais Officers from the Constituent Commanderies will be in Full Dress Class A uniform or Cap and Mantle. All Other Sir Knights should be in Full Dress Class A uniform, Cap and Mantle, or black / dark suit for the Opening of the Annual Conclave and session.

# Knights Templar Educational Foundation Scholarships

The Knights Templar Educational Foundation Committee considers all applications for scholarships without regard to age, race, religion, National origin, gender, Masonic ties, or affiliations. These scholarships are not "grants in aid" but are open to all students regardless of their financial circumstances.

The purpose is to provide financial assistance to students who meet the required qualifications, which may vary from state to state.

In 1922, the Grand Encampment launched the Knights Templar Educational Foundation with the words: "We feel that the Grand Encampment can build no greater monument nor inaugurate a more worthwhile movement than to establish a plan which will provide educational advantages for the youth of our beloved country, thereby enabling them to become more useful members of society and better Citizens of the United States of America."

The Foundation was sustained and perpetuated by each Sir Knight paying the sum of \$1.00 annually for a period of nine years beginning July 1, 1924. This fund

became available for student loans.

Through the years, the fund has grown, and Grants and Scholarships are available in several states. However, some states continue to use the Loan program where the student is expected to repay the loan at a low-interest rate. States have either Grants, Scholarships, or Loans but not both.

Education beyond high school is essential in a technological age. It may be obtained today in:

- 1. A vocational school that trains artisans and craftsmen.
- 2. A technical school that prepares technicians for various specializations.
- A professional school that offers preparation in medicine, law, theology, engineering, business, agriculture, and others.
- Colleges and universities that give a firm foundation for business, trade, or profession.

Since its founding, the Knights Templar Educational Foundation has assisted more than 80,000 students for an aggregate monetary value of over thirty-eight million dollars through Loans and Scholarships to deserving youth, thereby exemplifying the purpose and principles for which it was created.

The 2023 Knights Templar Education Foundation, Division of Oklahoma Scholarship committee has met and has gone through the scholarship applications. This year, we received twelve (12) girl and four (4) boy applications. The committee is pleased to announce the winners of the four (4) scholarships. Each will receive a \$1,500.00 scholarship which will be mailed to their institutions.

The two girls are: Haley Dennis and Courtney Harris The two boys are: Aiden Murray and Garrett Blair

#### Awards

The Knight Templar Cross of Honor Award was created at the 49th Triennial Conclave of the Grand Encampment held in 1946 at Philadelphia. The Knight Templar Cross of Honor shall be awarded only for exceptional and meritorious service rendered to the Order of Knights Templar far beyond the service usually expected of an Officer or member. In Oklahoma, the Grand Commander can select only one nomination from the Sir Knights of this Grand Commandery during any one Templar year.

It is my honor and privilege to announce the recipient of this year's award is Sir Knight John F. Carter from Ardmore Commandery No. 9 and he was presented the award at the Grand Banquet.

# The Commissioned Templar Chaplain Program

In the Grand Encampment's efforts to improve the fraternity, the Grand Prelates and the elected line have developed a training program for Prelates and Chaplains. Long thought of as simply officers who read a prayer, or pray for the sick, Chaplains and Prelates should be leading officers in all Masonic bodies, but more especially in Commandery.

To help us all develop and actuate our faith in the world, Chaplains need to be secure in their own. After taking this training program, we hope that Sir Knights (and any other member of the fraternity, including our ladies and youth organizations who opt to take the course), will emerge as leaders who exemplify servant leadership and

service.

Chaplaincy is a ministry of presence, and simply being there for people in real and meaningful ways at challenging times in their lives is the core of what a Chaplain is supposed to do. This program is designed to help members dedicated enough to serve the Craft and God to be more effective in their positions.

Before presenting more about the program and what it is, we need to be sure to say what it is not. This is a commissioning, not an ordination. This does not make a

person a trained evangelist nor qualify one to be a Board-Certified Chaplain: only Seminary and CPE courses can do that. This program will not shove a trinitarian view of Christianity down people's throats, but there is certainly grounding in what trinitarian Christianity really is.

The structure of the course is twelve units on the Grand Encampment's official Learning Management System, templared.org. Each self-paced unit requires readings, watching short videos made by our team of Chaplains, quizzes on the materials in the readings and lectures, and then short projects devised to immediately impact the lives of members of the organization. These projects are going to be archived and made available for other Lodges and Commanderies to use to help them as well. The units assume no prior training and even provide help with the mechanics of speech that so few of us are taught nowadays.

The textbook, On Being a Masonic Chaplain, was written for this course and edited by more than twenty experienced Chaplains from the Grand Encampment. The proceeds of this book are going to help the Knight Templar Eye Foundation and the Holy Land Pilgrimage.

On March 18th, I had the privilege of participating in the commissioning ceremony of Oklahoma's first Commissioned Templar Chaplains. The Sir Knights, who were commissioned, are Dylon Townsend and Brian Ragain of Lawton Commandery No. 18. I want to congratulate both Sir Knights on completing the program and training to become better prepared servant leaders in the fraternity and in the service of God.

## Inspections

A "traditional" inspection consists of the Commandery Opening, Reception of the Grand Commander and the Grand Commandery Staff, Order of the Temple, and Commandery Closing. The requirements were done according to the Work and Tactics of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Oklahoma (Yellow Book), and the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the U.S.A. ritual for the Order of the Temple (White Book) as specified by General Order No. 2.

I attended the inspections of all the Commanderies that stood for inspection. I thought all the Commanderies performed exemplary work and tactics in accordance with the prescribed rules as set forth by the Work and Tactics Committee. I thought each Commandery did an excellent job in their conferral of the Order of the Temple. I would like to thank the Eminent Commander and Officers of those Commanderies for their hard work and effort in their inspections. Inspections can be difficult, time-consuming, and require commitment, but inspections can also be rewarding, bonding, and provide a sense of accomplishment. # Inspection Out of Cycle

An Oklahoma Sir Knight, who served his Oklahoma Commandery as Eminent Commander in 2019 and 2020, asked to stand inspection out of cycle. He completed his terms of office, saw his successor installed as Commander and is qualified as a Past Commander and voting member of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Oklahoma. The date of the inspection was Saturday December 10th in Muskogee. The Officers of Muskogee Commandery No. 2 and Trinity Commandery No. 20 filled the officers' positions. It was a "traditional" inspection of Opening, Receiving the Grand Officers, Order of the Temple and Closing with the Sir Knight, as Eminent Commander, being the only one graded. I want to thank the Sir Knights of Muskogee and Trinity for filling the positions and giving of themselves to help this Sir Knight stand inspection.

A little backstory – Sir Knight was preparing the Commandery to stand inspection in 2019. There were conflicts with the Grand Commander's schedule which required a reschedule of the date. The rescheduled date, which was made without the consent of the Eminent Commander, conflicted with his work schedule so he was not able to stand inspection. His Commandery stood inspection (Open, received the Grand Officers, and Closed) on the rescheduled date with a substitute in

the Eminent Commanders station. In 2020, all Templary was shut down due to COVID-19 which did not allow any Commandery to stand inspection.

The process to approval – this process was not simply the Grand Commander saying yes let's do it. The process started with a formal request from the Sir Knight to the Grand Commander requesting to stand inspection out of cycle and fulfill his obligations as Eminent Commander. I had a conference call with the Work and Tactics Chairman presenting the information in the formal request and determining the correct steps to follow.

The Work and Tactics Chairman discussed this opportunity with the Work and Tactics committee and after receiving a consensus of the committee he approved the request of the Sir Knight to stand inspection pending the Grand Commander's decision.

After I was informed of the Work & Tactics Chairman decision, it was my decision to determine if this was in the best interest of Templary in the State of Oklahoma. As I talked with the Sir Knight and discussed the situation, he kept repeating that he wanted to fulfill his obligation as Eminent Commander. If only all our Eminent Commanders would take the obligation of the office with such passion.

It is my hope that all Eminent Commanders, who served during the pandemic or at other times, would be willing to stand inspection and fulfill their obligation. Thus, my determination was that the interests of Oklahoma Templary would be best served in allowing this Sir Knight to fulfill his obligation.

For some candidates, it is the only way that they can (or will) join the York Rite. The Order of the Temple was conferred by the Grand Commandery Officers. The Officers did an exemplary job at the conferral and are to be commended for their efforts. A special thanks to Sir Knight David Tennison for filling in as Warder, due to the absence of Sir Knight Jay Wall, Eminent Grand Warder, and Sir Knight Jon Greene, Eminent Grand Recorder, for filling in as Captain General, due to the absence of Sir Knight John Turner Eminent Grand Captain General.

For several years, the organizing committee of the Grand Master's Festival has been composed of the Grand Generalissimo, along with the Grand Scribe (from the Grand Chapter) and the Grand Principal Conductor of the Work (from the Grand Council).

This administrative structure has the added benefit that the three Grand Officers forming this administrative committee will only serve for one year and do not have to worry about being stuck with the administration of the Grand Master's Festival for many years. It is my hope that we continue this administrative structure in future years.

Special thanks should go to this year's committee Grand Generalissimo Glen Chaney (Lawton #18), and Blaine McKnight (McAlester #6) for their hard work in making this year's Grand Master's Festival a success. I also served as part of the committee with my role in the Grand Council.

# Regional Commandery Festivals

Two Regional Commandery Festivals were held during this Templar year. Northeast Oklahoma and Central Oklahoma held the festivals on March 11th and March 18th, respectively.

On March 11th, Trinity Commandery No. 20 hosted the Northeast Oklahoma Regional Commandery Festival. Seven Select Masters were introduced to the mysteries of Chivalric Masonry and Knighted into the Orders of Christian Knighthood.

On March 18th, Norman Commandery No. 38 hosted the Central Oklahoma Regional Commandery Festival. Four Select Masters were introduced to the mysteries of Chivalric Masonry and Knighted into the Orders of Christian Knighthood.

It is my recommendation we keep the statewide coordination a responsibility of the Grand Captain General, with assistance in the various regions by the regional chairman's. I trust given the proper time and understanding of all involved this statewide coordination process will prove beneficial.

I would like to thank those Sr Knights responsible for planning the Regional Festivals; without your determination, dedication, organizational, and time management skills these festivals would not have been successful. You are what makes Chivalric Masonry in Oklahoma a success. I am encouraged by the success of the Regional Festivals and look forward to the day when all Regions in the State can host their own.

#### South Central York Rite Conference

The 65th Annual South Central York Rite Conference was held at Sam's Town Hotel and Casino in Shreveport, Louisiana on September 16th – 17th, 2022.

On Friday presentations from the General Grand Chapter and General Grand Council were given. Companion Mathew Turner, Most Excellent Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Oklahoma and Companion Bob Davis, Right Illustrious Deputy Grand Master of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma, on behalf of Companion Tim Israel, Most Illustrious Grand Master of the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma, gave reports on the Grand Chapter and Grand Council activities for this year.

On Saturday presentations from the Grand Encampment were given. The presentations were on Membership, S.O.O.B, KTEF, Grand Encampment Programs and Protocols. The four dais officers of the Grand Commandery and the Grand Recorder are required to attend the Department Conference, all were in attendance except for the Grand Captain General who was granted an excused absence due to work obligations. There were seven Grand Commandery Officers (two were attending the Emerging Leader Training) and three Past Grand Commanders (two were attending the Emerging Leader Training) present from Oklahoma. During the session, Oklahoma had two members who were recognized for completing the three-year cycle of the York Rite Emerging Leaders Program. As Grand Commander, I gave a report about the activities of our Grand Commandery.

The 66th Annual South Central York Rite Conference is scheduled to be held September 15th – 16th, 2023 in Branson, Missouri. While the conference is primarily designed for Grand Officers, any Sir Knight is welcome to attend. There will be several interesting presentations and leadership training will be available through the "York Rite Leadership Training Program."

The 67th Annual South Central York Rite Conference is scheduled to be held in Oklahoma, dates and location yet to be determined.

# Past Grand Commander's Jewel

On September 28, 2022 the Grand Commandery of Oklahoma contracted with The Masters Craft out of Indiana to reproduce the Oklahoma Past Grand Commander jewel (see the approved reproduction jewel below).

I asked Sir Knight Trasen Akers, Eminent Grand Junior Warden, to contact The Masters Craft and give them the pertinent information and dimensions of the Past Grand Commander jewel. This is an important endeavor for our Grand Commandery to secure a manufacturer of our Past Grand Commander jewel, even if it is a reproduction.

After discussion with the Grand Commandery Finance Committee, it was approved we order twenty-five reproduction jewels at a cost of \$1,510.00, or \$60.40 per jewel. This would give us a sufficient supply going forward. We have given the living Past Grand Commander's the option to get a reproduction jewel and turn in their current Past Grand Commander jewel or keep the jewel they currently wear.

Most of the jewels the Past Grand Commanders are wearing are extremely valuable, due to the gold content, and the Grand Commandery does not carry insurance on the jewel, so if the jewel is lost, stolen, or broken the Grand Commandery has lost its investment. Also, when a Past Grand Commander dies, the

family is supposed to return the jewel, if owned by the Grand Commandery, sometimes this does not happen. When this happens, the jewels are either pawned, melted down, or lost and again the Grand Commandery has lost its investment.

The cost of the reproduction jewel is inexpensive which would allow the Past Grand Commander and his family to keep the jewel. I would like to thank Sir Knight Trasen Akers and the Grand Commandery Finance Committee for their efforts on this project.



# Holy Land Pilgrimage

The KNIGHTS TEMPLAR HOLY LAND PILGRIMAGE is a program related to the Grand Encampment Knights Templar of the United States of America. Its Mission: To send credentialed Christian Ministers on a Biblical study and historical / cultural immersion experience who would not have the opportunity otherwise. In this program, the various State Grand Commanderies of Knights Templar sponsor Christian Ministers on an expense paid study pilgrimage in Israel for 11 days.

This year the Grand Commandery of Oklahoma is fortunate to be able to send two ministers to Holy Land. They are Pastor Katy Gott serving at Lighthouse Family Worship Center in Barnsdall, Oklahoma and Pastor Mitchell Miller serving at Santa Fe Presbyterian Church in Edmond, Oklahoma.

Pastor Miller made a presentation to the Companions and Sir Knights during the March Grand Commander's chat and Pastor Gott made her presentation during our Grand Banquet Friday evening.

Sir Knights this is an easy opportunity for your Commandery to impact the spread of the Gospel of Jesus Christ in your local communities. I would encourage every constituent Commandery to nominate a minister for participation in this program.

#### Henry Arms Golden Boy Raffle

This topic still relates to the Holy Land Pilgrimage, whereby we received a very gracious offer from the Henry Arms Company when they agreed to DONATE to the Grand Commandery a Golden Boy Freemasons Tribute Edition .22 caliber rifle during the Templar year 2016-17. This rifle currently sells for over \$1,200. The stipulation was that it was to be used for a fundraiser to support the Holy Land Pilgrimage. The details were left up to us. We chose to sell raffle tickets as our fundraiser. This is our second attempt to raffle the rifle. The original winner of the rifle was unable to assume ownership, so the rifle has remained in the possession of Sir Knight Paul Currell, REPGC since 2017.

In February 2023, I mailed a book of six tickets to every Sir Knight in Oklahoma. The net proceeds raised from this beautiful rifle will be split between the Holy Land Pilgrimage operating fund and the Holy Land Pilgrimage endowment fund, with the larger portion going to the endowment fund.

The winner of the raffle was selected during the banquet Friday evening was Sir Knight Rusty Henson. Also, I am incredibly pleased to report that we have had two members become Knights of the Holy Land by virtue of their \$1,000 donations which came in from this mail-out campaign.

#### Social Order of the Beauceant

The Social Order of the Beauceant was originally started at the suggestion of the Commandery in Denver, Colorado. Asked to host the 25th Triennial Conclave for the Grand Encampment of the Knights Templar which was to be held in their city in August 1892, the Sir Knights felt with only one Commandery and a membership of just over three hundred they needed help. Their wives agreed to supply the help.

At the first official meeting which was held in February 1890, the ladies adopted the name "Some of Our Business Society" and a brief ritual. The S.O.O.B. was organized solely for the purpose of providing aid and sociability for the Sir Knights and ladies who would attend the Triennial. The ladies so enjoyed the work that they never disbanded, but instead continued operating for the purpose of "making life purer, better and sweeter for others."

The Society remained a small, loyal, local band of ladies, doing good, and assisting their Sir Knights until the 1913 Triennial when they decided to take action to expand. It was then that the first members from other cities were initiated. At that same time, a decision was made to change their name to something more appropriate to Templary while retaining the initials S.O.O.B. Derived from a banner used by the ancient Templars, the "Social Order of the Beauceant" was the result. Oklahoma has one Assembly, which is Stillwater No. 124.

Beautiful and impressive, the Beauceant's ritual contains many lessons which are exemplified by a cadre of seventeen officers in the local Assemblies and nineteen officers in the Supreme Assembly.

Eligibility to Membership – wives, widows, mothers, sisters, daughters and granddaughters of Knights Templar of United States of America, or mothers, sisters, daughters, and granddaughters of a member, who are, or were at time of decease in good standing in a Commandery or an Assembly are eligible to membership. A petitioner must be at least 18 years of age at the time of petitioning.

One of the most basic landmarks of the order is the admonition to "cultivate the spirit of love for and loyalty to each other, and the Order of Knights Templar, and the reciprocal consideration due the order." With that in mind, the Beauceant in 1957 adopted the Commandery's Knights Templar Eye Foundation as their official charity. Since that time, they have donated over one and a half million dollars to the Eye Foundation.

Today's Beauceant is an order with a long history of support to the Commandery, one that has proven to be a source of pleasure and benefit both to them and to the Sir Knights. It is a history they are proud of and one they wish to maintain. Therefore, they continue to cheerfully fulfill requests to assist with entertainment and hospitality at any level of their organization.

Like many masonic related organizations, the Social Order of the Beauceant is suffering from a decline in membership and participation. Historically, the SOOB began solely with the wives or widows of knights templar. Adjustments were made to include additional family relationships; but something else began to occur which I believe needs our immediate attention.

For unknown reasons, the closeness of our two Orders began to subside. Our local commanderies began to lessen their support of local assemblies, both financially, and in promoting their beautiful Order. The results are that without our support, the assemblies in Oklahoma have dwindled to point that only one exists in our state.

What can we do to help promote the Order? We can start by recognizing the Order during our Grand Banquet, let the Order have membership information available during Grand Sessions, and give the Order the opportunity to address this august body. That is only a start, the most interest can happen when the Grand Commandery and constituent Commanderies work together to promote the Order. We, Sir Knights need to think of opportunities to integrate the Order into our meetings, festivals, observances, social gatherings, public ceremonies and cornerstones. Be creative in ways the Order can be presented to pique the relevancy

of the Order to the Sir Knights and their ladies. I believe the SOOB, just as Templary, is important and needed today. The application of the principles taught not only helps encourage and strengthen the perseverance of faith in our ladies but us as well. As we are a fellowship of Christian men, so the S.O.O.B. is a fellowship of Christian women.

My beloved knights, this is a necessary and worthwhile endeavor for all of us.

# State of Templary and Recommendations

I have no desire to be pessimistic, but rather to consider with optimism a way to greater possibilities. The splendid seed sown by our predecessors will not bring forth fruit without constant nourishment and cultivation. While our membership has decreased, we have solicited more petitions, which is a laudable effort, but we have begun to overlook the importance of our efficiency and the proper rendition of our beautiful ritual. No business may succeed by adding new customers when the loss of the old ones is greater than the increase.

It is regrettable to observe the condition of a few of our Commanderies. Some of them habitually relapse into a state of lethargy or even coma, from which it is difficult to arouse them. I am convinced that a more heroic measure than a mere reminder from time to time will be necessary. Just what course to pursue is the problem of this Grand Commandery and I trust that the proper measure will be brought to light and adopted. Of one thing I am certain, and that is, that the fundamental principles of this Order of Christian Knighthood are right. In our Order we subscribe to the Christian Faith. It still combines the religious and militant spirit, and it is pledged to defend those principles and ideals upon which civilization is based.

Unlike the revered progenitors of this Christian Order who fought with sword, shield, and buckler, ours is a mission of peace; of good will toward men; of love and reverence for the Great Captain of our Salvation; of fidelity to the cause of the Christian religion and the practice of the Christian virtues. In such a glorious cause, our swords, once used with such dauntless courage against the enemies of the Cross, are now only symbolic in the unwearied zeal with which we engage in the common cause for the eradication of darkness and superstition, of hatred, of wrong and oppression. While we may exult that our appearance upon the stage of this life was allotted to us at the present advancing age of scientific research, of social, moral, and intellectual attainments, yet the same precepts which inspired the ancient Templars to deeds of charity and pure beneficence find a larger field for the practice of the Christian virtues, for bigotry, oppression, and intolerance are, alas, yet to be found among the nations of the world.

It is my belief that Templary is an extension of the ministry of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. That extension being the principle and philosophy of Servant Leadership.

Servant leadership is a leadership philosophy in which the goal of the leader is to serve. This is different from traditional leadership which involves the accumulation and exercise of power by one at the "top of the pyramid." A servant leader shares power, puts the needs of others first and helps people develop and perform as highly

as possible. Instead of the people working to serve the leader, the leader exists to serve the people. A Servant Leader should be focused on, "Do those served grow as persons? Do they, while being served, become healthier, wiser, freer, more autonomous, more likely themselves to become servants?

The Bible provides many important lessons on the principles of Servant Leadership, including the lessons Jesus Himself offered. The one who leads ought to be like a shepherd who goes before the sheep, finds good pasture and water, and takes the sheep to safe places known to him. Because the flock is close to the heart of the shepherd, caring for their wellbeing is his main concern. Jesus taught the disciples (and us) the basic principles of servanthood when they were arguing about who should be prominent in the kingdom, saying to them, "If anyone desires to be first, the same shall be last of all, and servant of all" (Mark 9:35 KJV).

Sir Knights, to be truly effective leaders in the Masonic Fraternity we must be Servant Leaders. Look around the Asylum today and you will see many examples of Servant Leadership, but where we, in our best estate, fall short due to our fallibility as man. There is one who gave us the perfect example of Servant Leadership through his actions, the Great Captain of our Salvation, and though we will fall short of his example, his Grace and Mercy are sufficient to see us through.

In Christ, the goal of leadership is not to grab power but to serve.

Each Constituent Commandery shall pay to the Grand Commandery at the time of filing its quarterly returns the sum if five dollars (\$5.00) for each Order of the Red Cross, five dollars (\$5.00) for each Order of Malta and ten dollars (\$10.00) for each Order of the Temple conferred in the preceding quarter year. # BE REWRITTEN TO READ: ARTICLE XVI REVENUES

Section 3 The Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Oklahoma shall provide an online electronic database at no charge to the Constituent Commandery. The Constituent Commandery Recorder shall maintain the online electronic database. He shall contact the Grand Recorder if he has any problems with the database. The Grand Recorder will invoice the Constituent Commandery for all Orders, five dollars (\$5.00) for each Order of the Red Cross, five dollars (\$5.00) for each Order of Malta, and ten dollars (\$10.00) for each Order of the Temple conferred, after each Festival. The Grand Recorder will invoice the Constituent Commandery for per capita fees by January 15. In addition, the Grand Recorder will provide each Constituent Commandery Recorder with a Financial Review and Award Forms. The Financial Review form will be signed by the Financial Review Committee of the Constituent Commandery, showing their findings on the financial condition of said Commandery as shown by the books of the Recorder and Treasurer. **WHEREAS:** The Triennial Fund was set aside to help pay the way for the Dais Officers of the Grand Commandery to attend the Triennial Session and;

WHEREAS: The Triennial Fund has not been changed to account for inflation costs in a number of years, and;

**WHEREAS:** We shouldn't expect the Dais Officers of the Grand Commandery to go into great personal debt to attend the Triennial Session.

# NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED ARTICLE XVII FIXED EXPENSES

Section 4.

a) The Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer shall accumulate the Triennial Fund in an amount equal to twenty (20) cents per member on the rolls of the Grand Commandery as of December 31 of each year in the Triennial fund. These accumulated figures will be included in the annual budget for the Triennial year. This fund will be used to pay the expenses of the Dais Officers of the Grand Commandery, not to exceed twenty-five (25) cents per mile, one way, by direct route and twenty-five (25) dollars per diem while in actual attendance at the Triennial Conclave of the Grand Encampment. # BE AMENDED TO READ: (This version was withdrawn\*) ARTICLE XVII FIXED EXPENSES

#### Section 4.

a) The Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer shall accumulate the Triennial Fund in an amount equal to twenty (20) seventy-five (\$0.75) per member on the rolls of the Grand Commandery as of December 31 of each year in the Triennial fund. These accumulated figures will be included in the annual budget for the Triennial year. This fund will be used to pay the expenses of the Dais Officers of the Grand Commandery, not to exceed twenty-five (25) sixty-five (\$0.65) cents per mile, one way, by direct route, two nights lodging, and twenty-five (25) fifty (\$50.00) dollars per diem while in actual attendance at the Triennial Conclave of the Grand Encampment. (Amended 4/27/2019)

# AMENDED VERSION (This version was presented and passed) ARTICLE XVII FIXED EXPENSES

Section 4.

The Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer shall accumulate the Triennial Fund in an amount equal to seventy-five (\$0.75) cents per member on the rolls of the Grand Commandery as of December 31st of each year in the Triennial Fund. These accumulated figures will be included in the annual budget for the Triennial year. This fund will be used to pay the expenses of the Grand Commander, Deputy Grand Commander, Grand Generalissimo, and Grand Captain General to attend the Triennial Convocation of the Grand Encampment. For each of the four said officers, the maximum sum allowed will be one-fourth of the accumulated Triennial Fund.

The 2022 stock market performance was the worst since 2008. The S&P fell 19.4%, the Dow Jones Industrial Average lost 8.8%, and the Nasdaq tumbled 33.1%. We also incurred double digit losses. Despite the losses, with our strategy we were able to slightly increase dividends in our Perpetual Accounts. In the second half of the year, we made more than half of our dividends. I am hoping to continue to see growth in our dividends and interest in those accounts in coming years. So far in 2023 we have continued to see crazy volatility in the market and are currently positive for the year, just over 4% for our Grand York Rite Bodies overall.

Changing investment advisors was a massive undertaking. We moved from Wells Fargo in Bartlesville to Morgan Stanley in Oklahoma City. It would not have been possible without our Grand Recorder Jon Greene. He was instrumental on getting not only tax id numbers, but pictures of original charters and other requested documents. Every time I felt we were close to getting everything setup with Morgan Stanley, they would need another document or signature. Thank you so much Companion Greene!

We added very few new members to our Perpetual Members list in 2022. With our change in Investment Advisors last year, checks were severely delayed and not mailed until the fall. The checks for this year have already been mailed out and are slightly larger than last years checks.

Please see the attached statement of income and expenses for the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Oklahoma. In addition, the Grand Treasurer's report depicts the investment holdings and performance for the year.

We had a net loss of 26 Sir Knights as compared to a gain of 9 Sir Knights the previous year. We Knighted 59 compared to 106 last year. Suspensions and withdrawals were 41 compared to 47 last year. We had 45 deceased Sir Knights in 2022 as compared to 55 in 2021. We had 20 members reported on the Annual Reports who were unable to pay their dues compared to 14 last year.

Please keep in mind that perpetual fees are 15 times your yearly dues. If your Commandries yearly dues are not equal to or more than the per capita, then you will not recover your dues for that member. For example: at present, if your Per-capita is \$13.75 per member and your dues are \$27.50, you will get 50% of the dividends and interest. Less dues will be proportionately less, and more will be proportionately more. All computations are based on the time the perpetual was purchased. See Standing Resolution, Perpetual Membership of the Constitution, and General Laws.

#### **JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE**

The Grand Commandery Jurisprudence Committee met in Executive Session at 3:30 pm on April 27, 2023, at the Hilton Garden Inn and Suites in Oklahoma City with the following members listed below in attendance.

The meeting was called to order, and the invocation was given by S.K. Timothy P. Israel. The Grand Commander's Address, General Orders, and Dispensations were reviewed and found to be in proper form.

The resolutions were reviewed, and resolutions No. 1A,1B, and No. 2, including the proposed amended language, were found to be in proper form. Resolution No. 3 was withdrawn due to conflict with Grand Encampment regulations.

We commend REGC Taylor for his efforts in moving the Grand Commandery forward and his liberal use of General Orders and his use of the ZOOM platform for the purpose of presenting his Ascension Day, Patriotic, Christmas, and Easter observances as well as his monthly chat meetings used to educate and inform the Sir Knights of the issues and challenges coming before the Grand Commandery of Oklahoma.

#### **FINANCE**

The Finance Committee met via Zoom on March 5, 2023, and reviewed the statement of revenue and expenses provided by the Grand Recorder for the Grand Commandery Operating Account and found it to be in order and in agreement with the statements provided by the financial institution holding the assets of this account.

The Committee reviewed the investment reports provided by the financial institution holding the assets for the Grand Commandery General Fund, Grand Commandery Perpetual Membership Fund, Joint York Rite Membership Development Fund, and Holy Land Pilgrimage Funds and found them to be in order and in agreement with the information provided by the Grand Treasurer.

The Grand Commandery's budget is a fiscal year budget based on the calendar year, while the Grand Commandery Officers' term of office is from the fourth weekend in April to the following April. Due to the confusion, this creates in creating and approving the budget, both the outgoing and incoming Grand Commanders' Travel expenses are included in this year's budget to fix the discrepancy.

The Committee commends the Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer for their diligence in accounting and safeguarding the funds and investments of the Grand

Commandery. Also accompanying this report is the proposed budget for the Grand Commandery for 2023.

We recommend its approval by the Grand Commandery.

#### WORK AND TACTICS

ARTICLE IV, Section 2, (d). The Committee on Work and Tactics shall consider, and report all matters and things relating to Asylum Ceremonies and Field Drills, and Competition therein; also, on all matters relating to the interpretation of the Rituals, Manuals, and Drill Regulations; the formation of Drill Corps, and Rules and Regulations Governing them; Inspectors of Constituent Commanderies; and the regulation uniform of this Grand Commandery. It shall prescribe, with the approval of the Grand Commander, or of this Grand Commandery, Rules and Regulations governing the Inspection of Constituent Commanderies, competitions in Asylum Ceremonies and Field Drills, and it shall award all prizes for proficiency. Such Rules and Regulations shall, when approved by the Grand Commander, or this Grand Commandery, have the effect of Rules and Regulations of this Grand Commandery, and be in force after such approval.

Five Commanderies stood for inspection and eight Commanderies conducted School of Instructions. The five Commanderies that stood for inspection are: Guthrie #1, Muskogee, #2, St. John's, #8, Lawton #18, and Trinity, #20. At the York Rite Grand Sessions, the Work and Tactics Committee will recognize the two Commanderies for proficiency. These are for the best score for a Class "A"

Commandery inspected as class "B", and for the Class "B" Commandery with the best score.

#### **GENERAL MATTERS**

Let's look at Good News first.

Of the 14 Commanderies that started the year, 12 knighted at least one new Knight. One Commandery, Trinity #20, proved that you can still find men who want to become York Rite members. They Knighted 14 new Knights. Second Place was Muskogee #2 with 11 Knightings. That is awesome. Two other Commanderies Knighted 5 new Knights, and five other Commanderies Knighted 4 new Knights. That totals 55 of the 59 new Knights. Only two Commanderies did not knight anyone. This year Oklahoma Knighted 59 new Knights.

We had 4 reinstatements, all from one Commandery, Muskogee # 2. Sadly we lost 45 Sir Knights to death

We can learn from our weaknesses. Now to the bad news.

Losses. We all abhor the loss of our members. Our membership count is down 26 members. We experienced 8 demits. But we also had suspensions. They amounted to a total of 41 Sir Knights. It is definitely important to try to reinstate our members and not just let them disappear.

It seems only logical that we should be able to reduce at least some of the loss to suspensions and withdrawals. We would urge that the Officers in Charge meet with their Commanderies early in the year and encourage every Commandery to set up an active committee to contact the members who are behind in their dues or who are local and not attending Conclaves. Only 3 Commanderies lost 5 or more Knights to suspension. Of our 14 Commanderies, 10 had a net loss of membership, 2 gained a member, and 2 were unchanged.

Consolidations. Fortunately, we experienced no consolidations.

Now to the other items under our venue: Charters and Letters of Dispensation - no new Charters nor Letters seeking a Charter, and No Appeals or Grievances.

#### MASONIC CHARITY FOUNDATION

To the Grand Commandery of Oklahoma:

Right Eminent Grand Commander and Sir Knights,

The Masonic Charity Foundation of Oklahoma is an Oklahoma not-for-profit corporation formed on July 9, 1930, to encourage charity, benevolence, education, and philanthropy. It was created so Oklahoma Freemasonry's institutional giving could be better focused and coordinated. The activities of the Foundation do not replace those of the individual Masons; they merely serve to supplement them.

#### **MANAGEMENT**

The Foundation is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of twenty-two members. The Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of the State of Oklahoma elects fifteen directors, three each year, for a five-year term. There are also three Directors representing the Scottish Rite, one from each Valley, three Directors representing the York Rite, one from each Grand Body, and one Director from the Order of the Eastern Star. Board members receive no monetary compensation of any kind. The Foundation has full-time staff working in the Edmond office under John L. Logan, Executive Director. The following officers were elected to serve in 2023:

#### **FINANCIAL**

The Foundation's 12/31/2022 combined balance sheet, less the Throckmorton Trust, reflects total assets of \$96,645,221, a decrease of \$17,410,524 from one year ago. Endowments, less the Throckmorton Trust, total \$90,816,030, an increase of \$1,016,555 from one year ago.

#### LODGE MATCHING FUNDS

This program was established in 1983 and designed to encourage and support local Lodges in the area of charity by matching local Lodge monetary contributions in scholarships, local disasters, local charitable causes, and local community services. In 2022, 192 Lodges used the program for \$1,502,402. Since the Matching Funds Program began, the Foundation has contributed \$36,104,022 to support local charitable or educational projects. The local lodges' participation has created a minimum of \$72,208,044 of support for local community needs.

Matching Funds dollars have allowed lodges to double their fundraising ability to support local community needs. In 2022, Matching Funds provided an additional \$606,854 in support for youth and public education, \$135,659 to local fire, police, and veterans organizations, \$356,968 to individuals in need (or organizations who provide direct services to needy individuals), \$103,093 to senior citizen centers and charities who provide aid to seniors, \$64,962 to Masonic Youth Orders, and \$47,815 to support local museums, libraries, parks, and historical preservation projects. Matching Funds dollars and lodge fundraising injected over \$2.7 million into community charitable and educational projects.

#### PROMISES MATTER

The Foundation stands ready to assist those Lodges and OES Chapters in caring for their needy members through matching funds or direct grants. Each Lodge or Chapter is best positioned to know which members need assistance. Lodges may use their entire \$12,500 matching funds for Promises Matter activities. In 2022, Promises Matter Matching Funds provided an additional \$327,430 to assist female OES and Master Masons members and widows with immediate financial needs due to illness, injury, or other hardship. Also, eight different Lodges received Promises Matter Grants totaling \$33,153. The average grant amount distributed was \$2,763.

The Masonry in Action Award program began in 2013 to recognize lodges that do an outstanding job utilizing the Foundation programs. The Foundation allows each winning Lodge the opportunity to specify a worthy nonprofit in their community to receive a \$5,000 grant. In 2022, Maud-Konawa Lodge 106 was the small lodge category winner, and Owasso Lodge 545 won the large lodge class for the sixth year. Maud-Konawa Lodge 106 designated their prize funds to provide a charitable grant of \$5,000. The Lodge chose to award the Maud and Konawa Public Schools for high school senior scholarships in Masonry in Action Award funds. Owasso Lodge 545 awarded their \$5,000 community grant to an outdoor education

program administered by the Owasso Fraternal Order of Police and their Shop with a Cop Christmas program. Congratulations to both lodges!

#### **PUBLIC PARTNERSHIPS**

The Foundation works with other organizations to achieve worthwhile goals and make Masonic charity more visible across Oklahoma.

**Partners in Prevention** is a partnership with **Vizavance**. Lodges statewide sponsor vision and glaucoma screenings, targeting the young and the elderly. The Foundation granted \$300,000 to support the ongoing costs of the program. Over 140,000 students were screened in the first semester of the 2022-2023 school year. The Foundation has provided over \$5 million to support this important mission, One Goal, One Vision, and One Mission Advancing Children's Education Through Better Vision!

Food Bank support has been an annual program since 2011. In 2022 the Fight Childhood Hunger Campaign resulted in \$69,000 being donated to the Regional Food Bank and \$31,000 to the Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma. The 2022 Masonic Food for Kids campaign ran from August 1 through October 15. This statewide effort combines the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma, the Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma, the Masonic Fraternity of Oklahoma, and Griffin Communications (Channel 5 in OKC and Channel 6 in Tulsa). Food Bank is one of three projects with statewide visibility that attempt to enhance the image of the Fraternity while supporting a significant charitable or educational purpose.

The Oklahoma State Department of Education - Our support for public education was demonstrated in nine statewide programs.

- 1. The Oklahoma State Teacher of the Year program honors teachers who make outstanding contributions to the public education of our youth. The State Teacher of the Year is awarded a check for \$5,000, and each of the eleven finalists receives \$1,000. Each local Teacher of the Year receives a certificate of appreciation.
- 2. The Student of Today Award is a program that encourages outstanding performance in students of all grade levels by recognizing exemplary students. Each recipient receives a certificate, usually from a local Mason, at their school's awards assembly, or some Lodges host banquets for the winners. In 2022, the Foundation prepared 1,792 certificates for presentation.
- 3. Freemasonry uses the Teacher of Today Award program in Oklahoma to say "thanks" to those hundreds of teachers across our state that make a daily difference in our children's lives. Each Teacher receives a certificate presented by the local Lodge. It is a small token to express our appreciation to these men and women who carry the future burden on their shoulders. In 2022, the Foundation prepared 595 certificates for presentation.
- 4. The State Superintendent's Awards for Arts Excellence honor the Fifty top high school seniors in our state's visual and performing arts. Also, the leading school administrators and board members are honored during a prestigious formal reception at the Guthrie Scottish Rite Temple. The

- students are presented medals by the Grand Master and State Superintendent of Education. The 2023 event will be held at the Guthrie Scottish Rite on April 18, 2023.
- 5. The Payne Education Center is a nonprofit organization established in 1984. Since 1996 the Foundation has supported the Payne Education Center's Reading Readiness program designed to train kindergarten and transitional 1st-grade teachers by providing scholarships for enhanced reading techniques. In 2022, \$115,000 was provided, half allocated for teacher scholarships and the other to support their Digital Phonics Program.
- 6. **The Youth Scholarship Program** funding is through the Education Endowment. The scholarship program is open to DeMolay, Job's Daughters, and Rainbow members. This year sixty scholarships of \$3,000 each were budgeted, and forty-three were awarded as follows: DeMolay 9, Job's Daughters 2, and Rainbow 32.
- 7. The Senior Essay Contest was launched in 1966 in support of education. Writing teaches critical thinking skills. The essay contest is open to all seniors in Oklahoma public schools. The Masonic Fraternity in Oklahoma sponsors it as part of its continuing commitment to education. Cash prizes in the Men's and Women's divisions range from \$2,000 for 1<sup>st</sup> place to \$200 for 10<sup>th</sup> place. Also, a \$5,000 grant will be made to each of the 1<sup>st</sup> place winners in high school. For the 2022 2023 contests, 529 seniors entered the contest. A total of \$13,700 was awarded to the 20 statewide winners of the contest, and \$5,000 grants to the schools of each of the statewide first-place winners. Certificates for presentation to the local division winners of 62 high schools sponsored by 54 Lodges will be provided to the local Lodge.

Senior Assistance Program- Through an agreement with the Oklahoma Area Agencies on Aging, a Department of Human Services division, \$798,146 was given in November 2022 to assist needy Oklahomans aged 55 and over with services not covered by existing government programs during the calendar year 2023. Since the inception of this program in 2007, the Foundation has donated \$11,660,930 in the name of the Masonic Fraternity of Oklahoma to enhance the lives of seniors in our communities. #### **CHARITABLE GRANTS**

In addition to partnerships with other charitable organizations or agencies, the Masonic Charity Foundation makes several grants yearly to support Public Education, Public Wellness, and Public Charities. Some highlights of 2023 grantmaking are:

A \$1,000,000 gift will be disbursed in \$500,000 over two years to the Mercy Women's Health Center, which is currently finalizing construction. Due to the tremendous growth in the need for women's healthcare, there is an urgent need to increase the amount of physical space and quality of healing. The new center will offer comprehensive, collaborative care. An essential priority is providing services to the economically disadvantaged.

- Hearts for Hearing provides audiology and speech pathology services in a unique one-stop setting for children with hearing loss. Charitable services for young children ensure they can learn to speak, connect with the world, and become self-sufficient members of their families and communities. A \$200,000 grant from the Masonic Charity Foundation of Oklahoma will benefit hearing-loss families. In addition to providing the first set of hearing aids to children ten years of age and under at no cost to families, Hearts for Hearing also offers financial assistance for specialized speech therapy and audiology services.
- The Cavett Kids Foundation helps children with terminal or chronic illnesses thrive by using camp experiences to build character, coping skills, and connection. Camps are provided for kids of every age who may be dealing with heart issues, cancer, or other disorders. Masonic charity's \$25,000 camp funding in 2023 will provide two of Cavett's highest-level camp experiences throughout the year.
- The YMCA Military Welcome Center at Will Rogers International Airport provides a safe location for military personnel to rest, access mail and telephone services, find refreshments, and prepare for the journey onward. The Masonic Charity Foundation provided \$18,000 to support the operation of this facility in 2023.

#### SUPPORT OF MASONIC GROUPS

- Each year, the Masonic Charity Foundation supports a charitable or educational cause or project of the Grand Master's choice. In 2022, a \$12,000 grant for equipment was provided to the Arnett High School Science Department STEM program.
- Masonic Charity supports Masonic youth orders! In addition, \$64,449 in
  Matching Funds will be provided to local DeMolay, Rainbow, and Jobs
  Daughters in 2022. Scholarships of \$3,000 to youth order members and
  \$10,000 to each youth order's state-level trust to support ongoing
  programming and scholarships.
- The Supreme Assembly, IORG, also received a \$200,000 donation for renovating the Supreme Assembly building in McAlester.
- Each year, the Masonic Charity Foundation of Oklahoma contributes to the programming of several national Masonic organizations:
  - O Gifts totaling \$1 per Oklahoma member are made by Masonic Charity Foundation every year to support the George Washington Masonic National Memorial in Alexandria, Virginia.
  - An annual gift of \$1,500 is made to the Masonic Information Center, an organization operating under the Masonic Service Association of North America that publicly provides information on Freemasons and responds to Freemasonry critics.
  - O The Masonic Charity Foundation of Oklahoma supports *every* Masonic Services Association of North America plea for disaster support with a \$1,000 donation.
  - Masonic Charity Foundation also provides annual contributions of \$4,000 to the Masonic Service Association of North America's

Hospital Visitation Program, making Oklahoma's support of this program competitive nationally.

#### KNIGHTS TEMPLAR EDUCATION FOUNDATION

The Foundation has changed formats and goals over the years. At one time, we made school loans and offered other assistance. Several years ago, we restructured our purposes and how we handle our funds. Our primary function now is in the administration of post high school education.

The Education Scholarship committee did not meet in person this year, we did not travel to meet last year, and it still worked out well. This gives each of us more time to read, review and rank the candidates.

The Committee had had some changes in membership. The members are: Jay Wall, Dace Tom, Mark McFadden, Robert R. Rolseth, and myself Tim Israel. Jon Greene is the Secretary of our committee.

We are in charge of the Education Foundation funds which are currently managed by a Grand Encampment investment team. They forward to us the amount of our interest needed to pay for four (4) \$1,500 scholarships.

This is our fourth year giving four \$1,500 scholarships – two to female applicants and two to male applicants. There is not a specifically required criteria for receiving the scholarships. Each member of the committee reviews every application we receive in a timely manner. They look at such things as the academic record, extracurricular activities, vision of need, future plans with a degree, and financial need. There is no Masonic affiliation requirement at all. Each member then ranks the applications and sends those results to the chairman. The chairman consolidates the rankings and sends that information back to the committee. If a committee member wishes to campaign for a particular candidate that may have not made the cut, he is given that opportunity before the whole committee.

So far the choices of candidates have been agreeable to all members of the committee. As the Chairman, it has been easier to manage this process without meeting in person. There has, so far, always been a consensus on the recipients.

We have all been disappointed with the quality of information received this time. We will be revising our application for next year to give us some additional criteria to review. We had a very limited number of candidates this year: We had 12 girls and 4 boys. As it turns out, ultimately, after we had made our decisions and notified the recipients, we received an additional 32 applications that the USPS had "found" two months after the deadline".

restaurants on Meridian as well as the ladies scheduled visit to the First Americans Museum Friday, April 28<sup>th</sup>.


