MASONIC CALENDAR

Ancient Craft Masons:

Commence their era with the creation of the world, calling it Anno Lucis (A.L), "in the year of light".

Royal Arch Masons:

Date from the year the second temple was commenced by Zerubbabel.

Anno Inventionis (A.L.)," in the year of discovery".

Order of High Priesthood:

Date from the year of blessing of Abram by the High Priest Melchizedek, Anno Benefacionis (A.B.), "in the year of blessing".

Royal and Select Masters:

Date from the year in which the temple of Solomon was completed, Anno Depositionis (A.Dep.), "in the year of deposit".

Knight Templar:

Commence their era with the organization of their Order, Anno Ordinis (A.O.), "in the year of the Order".

Scottish Rite:

Same as Ancient Craft, except that the Jewish chronology is used, Anno

Mundi (A.M.), "in the year of the world".

RULES FOR MASONIC DATES

Ancient Craft Masons: Add 4,000 years to the Common Era:

Thus, 2004 plus 4,000 = 6004.

Royal Arch Masons: Add 530 years to the Common Era:

Thus, 2004 plus 530 = 2534.

Order of High Priesthood: Add 1,913 Years to the Common Era:

Thus, 2004plus 1,913 = 3917.

Royal and Select Masters: Add 1,000 years to the Common Era:

Thus, 2004 plus 1,000 = 3004.

Knights Templar: Subtract 1,118 years from the Common Era:

Thus. 2004 minus 1.118 = 886.

Scottish Rite: Add 3,760 years to the Common Era:

Thus. 2004 plus 3.760 = 5764.

RECOMMENDATIONS and OBSERVATIONS

RITUAL

Ritual proficiency in our Chapters is improving. Our Custodians of the Work and their assistants have attempted to provide opportunities for instruction at the local level for every Chapter who has requested their assistance. I thank all those hard-working Companions who have shared their time and knowledge with those Chapters who are making an effort to improve their ritualistic performance. If you are not from one of those Chapters, make an effort to improve your Chapter beginning with yourself. I recommend a focus on establishing additional degree proficiency in Chapters, to make each region capable of conferring each of the Chapter degrees.

REGIONAL DEGREE TEAMS

Several years ago, the Grand Chapter recognized the inability of most Chapters to confer degrees adequately. Regional degree teams were adopted as a method to fill the void, with the hope of stimulating Companions back into activity. We are gratified to see regional degree conferrals occurring consistently in the Tulsa and Oklahoma City areas, and in the South Central and West Regions as candidates become available. I recommend that the non-metropolitan areas of the state engage this process and that the Grand York Rite Bodies continue to support this important concept. I also recommend the Grand York Rite Bodies invest in the equipment necessary to support the degree festivals.

SUPPORT FOR LOCAL LODGES

It is no secret that most local lodges have not experienced an increase in membership in recent years. For us to attract new Master Masons to our Chapters, there must be some new Master Masons in our Lodges. Please do all that you can to be supportive of your Lodge, we all need the help!

TRAVEL

Discussing reimbursement of Grand officers travel expenses is never a popular topic, and few members do not have an opinion on the subject, myself included. If we expect our Grand High Priest to make at least one visit to each Chapter, attend the annual communications of the Masonic Youth Orders, our Grand Lodge, and Scottish Rite Reunions, and attend the Grand Sessions of the members of the South-Central Conference, then a meaningful increase in the amount of reimbursement is warranted.

CONCLUDING REMARKS

I want to thank R.E. Companion Gary Davis, Grand Secretary, for his constant attention to the business of the Grand Chapter. I would also like to thank M.E. Companion Kent Israel, Grand Treasurer, and M.E. Companion Elwood Isaacs, Grand Treasurer Emeritus for their generous contribution of time and talent in managing the investments of our Grand Jurisdiction.

When we leave this room, we will have new leadership of this Grand Chapter. Our advancing line officers are full of wisdom and energy. I ask that you, please support your new Grand officers and engage their vision for our Grand Chapter. It has been my pleasure to have served with them, and I pledge to them my support.

In 1998 I was elected into the Grand Commandery officers line and served as Grand Commander, later served as Grand Illustrious Master of the Grand Council, and very shortly will become a Past Grand High Priest and conclude my twenty-one-year journey through the Grand York Rite of Oklahoma. Exaltations, Admissions, and Reinstatements of **85** compared to **84** last year, Suspensions/withdrawals were **50** compared to **42** last year. All Chapters have submitted quarterly reports for Year 2017. We had **28** members reported on the Annual Reports who are unable to pay their dues compared to **25** last year.

There were **5** new Perpetual members with a total of **498** living and **371** deceased. Approximately **36%** of our active members are perpetual members.

All Chapters be aware that perpetual fees are 15 times your yearly dues. If your Chapter's yearly dues are not equal to or more than the percapita, then you will not recover your dues for that member. Example: at the present time, if your Per-capita is \$14.25 per member and your dues are \$28.50 you will get 50% of the dividends and interest. Less dues will be proportionately less and more will be proportionately more. All computations are based on the time the perpetual was purchased. See Article 11, Section 21 of the Constitution and General Laws.

JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

The Jurisprudence Committee of this Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Oklahoma met in executive session in the Hawthorne Conference Room on Thursday, April 25th, 2019, at the Wyndham Garden Oklahoma City Airport Hotel in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order at 1:57 pm by Most Excellent Companion James R. Taylor, Jr., as Chairman.

Companions, your Past Grand High Priests of Oklahoma appreciates our Most Excellent Grand High Priest for the manner in which he has performed the duties and responsibilities of this High Office. In his numerous visits, and in performance of his duties, he has represented the Grand Chapter well and has honored both the Grand Chapter of Oklahoma and the office of Grand High Priest.

We especially commend him on his official visits to all our constituent Chapters during his term, as well as representing our Grand Chapter at regional and international meetings, and before the other bodies and youth groups that comprise the family of Freemasonry in Oklahoma. Additionally, during some of the visits he was able to recognize members with fifty or more years of service and present some of the living recipients of the Joseph S. Murrow Award of Merit with their medal. You may recall, at last year's Grand Convocation, this Grand Chapter voted to present a medal to the recipients of the Murrow Award, in lieu of a certificate. We applaud him for his continued promotion of the programs which have been adopted by this Grand Chapter; especially ritual proficiency, membership recruitment, regional degree conferrals, and member along with candidate education. We also support the recommendations made by the Grand High Priest in his address.

The Jurisprudence Committee reviewed that portion of the Annual Report submitted by the Most Excellent Grand High Priest, enumerating his official acts during the recess of this Grand Chapter, with the following findings.

On August 30, 2018, Most Excellent Grand High Priest John Logan issued the following decision:

1. The Chapters were notified that the 130th Annual Convocation of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons would be held on

April 25-26, 2019, at the Wyndham Garden Airport Hotel, 2101 S. Meridian Avenue, Oklahoma City, OK., in accordance with Article 2 Section 1(i) of the General Laws of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Oklahoma.

We find the decision is in conformity with accepted law and well within his power.

The Committee reviewed the five dispensations issued by MEGHP John Logan:

- 1. Tulsa Chapter No. 52, to hold its annual election of officers on November 19, 2018, instead of December 17, 2018.
- 2. Texoma Chapter No. 28, to temporarily move their charter to Durant Lodge No. 45.
- 3. Bartlesville Chapter No. 55, to hold its annual election of officers on November 19, 2018, instead of December 20, 2018.
- 4. Indian Chapter No.1, to hold its annual election of officers on November 26, 2018, instead of December 24, 2018.
- 5. Veritas Chapter No. 103, to hold its annual election of officers on January 26, 2019, instead of December 8, 2018.

We find the dispensations are in conformity with accepted law and practice and well within his power.

MEGHP John Logan approved the By-Laws of the James E. Smyrl Chapter No. 104, the amended By-Laws of Norman Chapter No. 24 and the amended By-Laws of Tulsa Chapter No. 52. We find the approvals of the By-Laws are well within his authority.

The Committee reviewed the actions by MEGHP John Logan:

- 1. Opened Grand Chapter to constitute James E. Smyrl Chapter No. 104 and install its officers in Owasso, OK.
- A committee was appointed for the support of DeMolay. The members are Gary A. Davis, Chairman, Franklin J. Kell, Jr., and Michael L. Branson.
- 3. Issued a commission to ME Companion George Henry Turpin as Grand Representative from the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Victoria.

4. Issued a commission to RE Companion Patrick J. O'Sullivan as Grand Representative from the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of New Hampshire.

We find the above actions are well within his power.

Resolution No. 1 was reviewed by the Committee and found to be in proper and legal form.

On the Request of Companion Gary Davis, Grand Secretary, the Committee discussed the MEGHP's travel expense section of our Law. He requested that responsibilities of auditing, reviewing and approval of these expenses should be transferred to the Finance Committee. After reviewing the Law, the consensus was that if the Grand Secretary would like these responsibilities transferred to the Finance Committee, a resolution to our Law should be presented to the Grand Chapter to add this duty to the Finance Committee's duties for the Grand Chapter's consideration.

In conclusion, we congratulate our Most Excellent Grand High Priest John Logan for outstanding work and leadership this past year and thank him for his many years of service to this Grand Chapter of Oklahoma and York Rite Freemasonry in Oklahoma.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:16 pm.

These accumulated figures will be included in the annual budget for the Triennial year. This fund will be used to pay the expenses of the Grand High Priest, Grand 37

King and Grand Scribe, not to exceed fifteen (15) cents per mile, one way, by direct route and twenty (\$20) dollars per diem while in actual attendance at the Triennial Convocation of the General Grand Chapter.

BE AMENDED TO READ:

a. The Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer shall accumulate the Triennial Fund in an amount equal to **twenty (20)** cents per member on the rolls of the Grand Chapter as of December 31st of each year in the Triennial fund. These accumulated figures will be included in the annual budget for the Triennial year. This fund will be used to pay the expenses of the Grand High Priest, Grand King and Grand Scribe, not to exceed **twenty-five (25)** cents per mile, one way, by direct route and **twenty-five (\$25)** dollars per diem while in actual attendance at the Triennial Convocation of the General Grand Chapter.

RARA COMMITTEE

Royal Arch Research Assistance (R.A.R.A.) has been the world's leading philanthropy dedicated to helping children with Central Auditory Processing Disorders. R.A.R.A., through the contributions of the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons, International, supports the Center for Central Auditory Research at Colorado State University, where continuous efforts are being made to understand and treat individuals with Central Auditory Processing Disorders.

A central auditory processing disorder (CAPD) is a condition in which one has difficulty processing or interpreting auditory information when in less than optimal listening environment. Individuals with CAPD typically have normal hearing acuity but are unable to efficiently process or interpret speech when in a minimally-noisy environment. The majority of children and adults that we test at the Center for Central Auditory Research at Colorado State University can hear soft sounds but are unable to understand or process verbal information in an efficient manner in their daily lives. They often report that they are confused or become flustered in busy listening environments. Settings such as a classroom environment, the work place, and social gatherings are often very difficult for them because of confusing verbal stimuli.

Royal Arch Masons International ranks among the leading charities helping children with central auditory processing disorder. Many people with autism have related challenges. They can include difficulty using,

understanding and remembering information conveyed through speech and other sounds.

With the support of a Royal Arch Research Assistance grant, Autism Speaks is funding a pilot study and a research fellowship to address sound-processing difficulties among people with autism and other developmental disabilities.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE REPORT

Significant progress has been made in recent years by the Committee on Education in producing and making available Capitular educational resources to both our Chapters and members.

The Capitular Masonry Education Course was published by the Grand Chapter in 2014. This text covers the history and symbolism of the four Chapter degrees and was adapted from a similar text originally introduced by the Grand Chapter R.A.M. of New York. The Course provides an excellent source of material for individual or group study.

In an effort to foster more opportunities for educational presentations during Chapter meetings, in 2016 the Committee on Education developed thirty-five lessons which are drawn from the *Capitular Masonry Education Course*, the Ritual of the Grand Chapter, and the Bible. These *Lessons on Capitular Masonry* were published in a spiral-bound format and a copy was distributed to each of our Chapters. The *Lessons* are specifically designed to enable presentation, participation, and discussion as a group during Chapter meetings.

The *History of Free Masonry in Oklahoma* by Charles E. Creager, John G. Hough, and James A. Lathim is a comprehensive survey of the early history of Freemasonry in Indian Territory and Oklahoma and has long been hailed as the definitive source on the subject. It was first published by the Grand Chapter in 1935 and was subsequently republished by the Oklahoma Lodge of Research in 1972. Having been out-of-print for many years, it was again published by the Grand Chapter in 2015. This volume has become one of the best selling titles offered by the Oklahoma Lodge of Research.

For many years, educational presentations had been offered at our degree festivals, both before and after each degree. In 2015, digital prologues of the Capitular degrees were created and produced and have been very well received at our regional and statewide degree conferrals. In addition, we had been distributing flashdrives with an abundance of educational material to our new members; this previously distributed material is now available on our website, thereby making it more readily accessible.

We urge our Chapters and members to utilize these plentiful resources and make Capitular education an integral part of their Masonic experience.

The Grand Recorder and Grand Treasurer shall accumulate the Triennial Fund in an amount equal to twenty (20) cents per member on the rolls of the Grand Council as of December 31st of each year in the Triennial Fund. These accumulated figures will be included in the annual budget for the Triennial year. This fund will be used to pay the expenses of the Grand Illustrious Master, Deputy Grand Master and Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, not to exceed twenty-five (25) cents per mile, one way, by direct route and twenty-five (\$25) dollars per diem while in actual attendance at the Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Council.

The Committee found that these Dispensations and Commissions were within his power and authority to grant. It was noted that the October 22, 2018 Dispensation to Tulsa Council #22 was missing from the MIGM's Address. His Address should be amended to add this Dispensation when presented to the Grand Council.

MIGM Allford approved the By-laws of the Mysterious Nine Council #61, the amended By-laws of Tulsa Council #22 and the amended By-laws of Norman Council #27. This action is required by our Grand Council Law.

On August 30, 2018, MIGM Allford issued a Decision to hold the 2019 Grand Council Session at the Wyndham Garden Airport Hotel in Oklahoma City. Although this Decision was within his power and authority, all Decisions should reference in writing the section of our Grand Council Law that gives him that power and authority to make that Decision. This will provide a historical record and guide for future MIGMs.

Resolution No. 1 was reviewed by the Committee. A motion was made by PMIGM Charles Stuckey and seconded by PMIGM Don Jones to report to the Grand Council that this Resolution is in legal and proper form.

On the Request of Companion Gary Davis, Grand Recorder, the Committee discussed the MIGM's travel expense section of our Law. He requested that responsibilities of auditing, reviewing and approval of these expenses should be transferred to the Finance Committee. After reviewing 97

the Law, the consensus was that if the Grand Recorder would like these responsibilities transferred to the Finance Committee, a resolution to our Law should be presented to the Grand Council to add this duty to the Finance Committee's duties for the Grand Council's consideration.

The committee would like to compliment Most Illustrious Companion Alford on an excellent year and thank him for his dedication to Cryptic Masonry.

Many other programs are still in place and active, such as the Student of Today, Teacher of the Year, Partners to Vizavance (formerly Prevention of Blindness), Essay Contest, assisting our Masonic youth organizations and others, all of which are important to our Masonic activities.

CRYPTIC MASON MEDICAL RESEARCH FOUNDATION (CMMRF)

The Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation (CMMRF) was incorporated on March 6, 1986, through the efforts of the General Grand Master Ben Mandlebaum (OK). The CMMRF funds research at the Indiana University School of Medicine in Indianapolis through the Indiana Center for Vascular Biology and Medicine (ICVBM) and the Richard Roudebush 103

Veteran's Administration Medical Center. The CMMRF Executive Director since 2012 is Gary G. Wyne, PMIGM of Indiana.

The ICVBM is committed to being a leader in basic as well as applied research in understanding vascular wellness and disease, and the development of leading-edge medical therapies to improve the care of patients with vascular problems. Because blood vessels are very important in maintaining the health of and repairing almost all tissues, nearly all diseases turn out to have a vascular component involved in their origin or tissue repair. Studies testing the use of adult stem cells from body fat, or adipose tissue, in restoring circulation in the body's lower limbs are currently being conducted, along with studies related to heart disease, diabetes, blindness, COPD, wound healing, erectile dysfunction, arthritis, and stroke.

The CMMRF Board of Trustees established a 2019 goal of raising five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000), which will require a one hundred ten percent effort by all of us. We need to make sure that each Council and every Companion continues to support CMMRF enthusiastically. As a first step, we began by actively and visibly promoting CMMRF Day, March 6, 2019, and solicited a nine dollar (\$9.00) per member contribution through each local Council.

Nationally, donations made to CMMRF in 2018 totaled \$239,104.35, an increase of \$18,562.89 over the prior year. Oklahoma's giving of \$2,093.00 was a decrease of \$1,481.00 over the prior year. Donations made by Oklahoma Companions ranked 29th in comparison to other jurisdictions nationally.

Woodward Council 52 received its second extender bar, recognizing cumulative donations in excess of \$3,000.00. Mysterious Nine Council received the Nine Arch Triangle plaque recognizing cumulative contributions in excess of \$1,000.00.

The Bernard F. Mandlebaum Award recognizes the local Council which is credited for the largest dollar contribution in the preceding calendar year. Most Puissant Companion Mandlebaum was Grand Illustrious Master of the Grand Council of Oklahoma in 1962-1963. He served as General Grand Master of the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons, International from 1984-1987, and the CMMRF was created during his triennial. Bartlesville Council 41's \$281.00 donation was the largest dollar contribution in 2018.

The Robert W. Hill Award recognizes the local Council which is credited for the largest average contribution per member in the preceding calendar year. Most Illustrious Companion Hill was first Grand Illustrious Master of Indian Territory, serving in 1895-1896. He was a member of Oklahoma Council No. 1, Atoka, Indian Territory." Bartlesville Council 41's \$6.39 per member contribution was the largest in 2018.

Each Oklahoma Council is urged to hold at least one fundraising event each year for the benefit of this worthy philanthropy.

REGIONAL DEGREE FESTIVALS

Until a few years ago, we had become terribly dependent upon the Grand Master's Festival for new members. In fact, in many years almost all of our new members were greeted at this one-day festival. There has been a concerted effort over the past few years to encourage regional degree conferrals in an attempt to break this dependency.

The Cryptic year 2015-2016 was of special note in that a total of 53 new Cryptic Masons were greeted at five regional festivals. When compared to the 45 new Cryptic Masons that were greeted at the Grand Master's Festival that year, we see that more than half of our greetings that year occurred outside of the one-day festival. This was the first time in recent memory that a majority of our new members had not come from the one-day festivals.

This regional emphasis continued the next year with 38 new Cryptic Masons being greeted in 2016-2017 at four regional festivals. However, during 2017-2018 only two regional festivals were held greeting a total of 15 new Cryptic Masons.

In our most recent Cryptic year 2018-2019, once again only two regional festivals were held; this year greeting 23 new Cryptic Masons. We

applaud our Companions in the Central and Northeast regions for holding their regional festivals year after year. Their commitment to the regional festival concept has been unwavering.

But we would also encourage our Companions in our other five regions to step up their efforts to hold degree festivals in their regions. The advantages of doing so are quite evident, as witnessed by the results from 2015-2016 and 2016-2017. An additional benefit of these regional conferrals has been the increased number of our constituent Councils who are now able to confer one or more of the degrees.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE REPORT

Significant progress has been made in recent years by the Committee on Education in producing and making available Cryptic educational resources to both our Councils and members.

The *Cryptic Masonry Education Course* was published by the Grand Council in 2017. This text covers the history and symbolism of the three Council degrees and follows the same format as the *Capitular Masonry Education Course*, which was published by the Grand Chapter several years earlier. The *Course* provides an excellent source of material for individual or group study.

In an effort to foster more opportunities for educational presentations during Council meetings, in 2018 the Committee on Education developed twenty-four lessons which are drawn from the *Cryptic Masonry Education Course*, the Ritual of the Grand Council, and the Bible. These *Lessons on Cryptic Masonry* were published in a spiral-bound format and a copy was distributed to each of our Councils. The *Lessons* are specifically designed to enable presentation, participation, and discussion as a group during Councils meetings.

A History of the Cryptic Rite of Freemasonry in Oklahoma by Charles E. Creager is a thorough survey of the early history of Cryptic Masonry in Indian Territory and Oklahoma. It was first published by the Grand Council in 1925. While surprisingly a few copies of this original printing are still available, the time was long past due for this book to be republished. The Committee on Education published a new edition of this classic text and made it available for distribution at our Grand Assembly in April 2017.

For many years, educational presentations had been offered at our degree festivals, both before and after each degree. In 2015, digital prologues of the Cryptic degrees were created and produced and have been very well received at our regional and statewide degree conferrals. In addition, we had been distributing flash drives with an abundance of educational material to our new members; this previously distributed material is now available on our website, thereby making it more readily accessible.

We urge our Councils and members to utilize these plentiful resources and make Cryptic education an integral part of their Masonic experience.



SUPPLEMENT TO TREASURER'S PRE-PRINT

When Ike Isaacs and I met with our Wells Fargo Advisors, they explained that most investors fall into roughly one of 9 buckets, depending on Risk and Investment goals. Our Commandery funds have been largely in the bucket titles Moderate Growth and Income, but as I explained to them that our goal, especially for the Perpetual Membership Account and the Holy Land Endowment Fund, was Dividends and Interest. We are now in the process of changing some of our funds to move closer to the Aggressive Income bucket. This should decrease our downside risk about 2%, decrease our average return less than 1%, and increase dividends and interest by about 21%. This will help our Perpetual Membership Accounts pay out over 4% instead of 2.6% like we did last year.

REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

The Jurisprudence Committee of this Grand Commandery met on Thursday, April 26th, 2019, at the Wyndham Garden Oklahoma City Airport Hotel in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The meeting was called to order by Timothy P. Israel, P.G.C., Chairman, at 3:30 pm.

This committee wishes to commend Sir Knight McGee, Right Eminent Grand Commander on a very successful year. He has performed his duties with distinction and has demonstrated his commitment to this Grand Commandery and to the Knights of Oklahoma. We believe that he has been an effective leader and has encouraged the Knights of Oklahoma.

We especially agree that our "membership has slightly decreased this year, mainly because of suspensions for non-payment of dues." It is quite important that the issues of suspensions should be being addressed more specifically with all our Commanderies. Sir Knight McGee challenged the Commanderies to plug into the new programming by Grand Encampment to better understand how to work to avoid suspensions.

Sir Knight McGee has gone above and beyond to be the face of Knights Templar in Oklahoma. He has regularly closed his Jewelry store early or all day in order to attend various Masonic events as the representative of this Grand Commandery. That commitment should not only be recognized but 160

acknowledged as going above and beyond the normal course of leadership.

In addition to his regular attendance at various Masonic events in the Capacity of Grand Commander, he attended all the Inspections. He funded two separate programs to raise funds for KTEF and for the Holy Land Pilgrimage. They were quite unique in that he customized small bars of pure silver to use a raffle tickets so that everyone who purchased a "ticket" received a small bar of silver with his name, title, and the year. The prize from the raffle was a large bar of "pure" silver. It was quite unique and well received.

We will now move into the official actions of the Grand Commander.

Dispensations

The only dispensations granted were to allow three (3) Templar Commanderies to hold their election out of time. They are listed in the Grand Commander's Address and are in conformity with accepted law and practice and well within his power.

General Orders and Actions

General Order No. 1

May 16th, 2018 - Announced the Grand Officers, the area assignments of the officers in charge, and the appointment of committee members.

General Order No. 2

May 18th, 2018 - Announced the inspection dates for each Commandery, along with the designated inspector and set forth certain rules for the inspections.

General Order No. 3

July 5th, 2018 - Consisted adding the regional festival committee for the templar years 2018-2019 and gave notice of the death of Most Eminent Honorary Past Grand Master Herbert Davis Sledd.

General Order No. 4

August 30th, 2018 - Issued pursuant to the duties of the Grand Commander Section 48, paragraph B, of the Grand Encampment constitution and statutes and consisted of filling vacancies in the Grand Commandery line as a result of the Junior Grand Warden resigning from his office due to a job-related move. It reflected moving the officers below the Junior Grand Warden up and my appointment of Mark K. McFadden as the Grand Sentinel. Additional revisions were also made to Grand Commandery committee appointments.

This General Order should be corrected to reflect that the vacancy was the Senior Grand Warden and NOT the Junior Grand Warden.

General Order No. 5

August 30th, 2018 - Issued pursuant to Article II, annual conclave of the Grand Commandery laws and regulations and announced the location for our next annual conclave to be held at the Wyndham Garden, Oklahoma City Airport Hotel, 2102 S. Meriden Ave. Oklahoma City and that activities will begin on 28th of April and end on the 27th of April 2019.

General Order No. 6

August 30th, 2018 - Announced the death of the three Past Right Eminent Grand Commanders Sir Knight Donald J. Cink, Sir Knight Don L. Turley, and Sir Knight Edward J. Becerra and requested that the Charters be draped in their remembrance.

General Order No. 7 (Now No. 8)

March 29th, 2019 - This General Order forwarded General Order No. 5 of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar requiring each Commandery of the Grand Commandery Knights Templar to have a Membership Committee. G.O. No. 7 further requires each Commandery in Oklahoma to include such committee in its bylaws and requests that each Commandery submit its bylaws to the grand recorder's office for approval within 60 days.

It was determined by this Committee that above General Order No. 7 should, in fact, be General Order No. 8. As there was a prior General Order No. 7 as follows:

General Order No. 7

4 December 2018 – This General Order is notify all concerned that the Work and Tactics Committee will be having their annual practice at Norman Lodge, 1700 N Porter, Norman, OK beginning at 10:30 a.m. on 19n January 2019.

All Sir Knights are encouraged to attend, but particularly Commandery Officers and those working in the "Order of the Temple".

Grand Representatives

On the 9th of October 2018 I appointed Sir Knight Jimmy Dale "JD" Davis representative of the Grand Commandery of Oklahoma near the Grand Commandery of Virginia.

Those General Orders and Actions are in conformity with accepted law and practice and well within his power. As stated above, General Order No. 7 should be renumbered as General Order No. 8 and General Order No. 7 should be included in the Grand Commander's Address.

Discussion was held regarding the current outcome of the action set forth in General Order No.4, also impact the process of converting specific offices from Elected to Appointed. **See Article IV OFFICERS, Section 1**. A portion of that language is quoted below:

"These changes shall take effect as the Grand Sentinel elected and installed in 2017 passes each of the offices that have been changed from elected to appointed."

The Grand Sentinel was advanced by the action of the Grand Commander and has now passed an additional office, therefore there will be three (3) appointed officers in the bottom of the Grand Line.

Again, we congratulate Sir Knight McGee on an excellent year as Grand Commander and offer our appreciation for his service.

RESOLUTION NO. 1

The purpose of Resolution No. 1 is to increase, albeit only slightly, the

amount of money accumulated in the Triennial Fund per member from 10ϕ to 20ϕ , and to increase the potential payment to authorized dais officers by increasing the mileage rate from 15ϕ per mile to 20ϕ per mile and by increasing the per diem rate from \$20 to \$25 while in actual attendance.

The Resolution is in proper form and is timely for the Grand Commandery to consider its adoption or rejection.

MASONIC CHARITY FOUNDATION

The Masonic Charity Foundation of Oklahoma is an Oklahoma not for profit corporation formed on July 9, 1930, to encourage charity, benevolence, education, and philanthropy. It was created so that the institutional giving of Oklahoma Freemasonry could be better focused and coordinated. The activities of the Foundation do not replace those of the individual Masons; they merely serve to supplement them.

MANAGEMENT

The Foundation is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of twenty-two members. The Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of the State of Oklahoma elects fifteen of the Directors, three each year, for a five-year term. There are also three Directors representing the Scottish Rite, one from each Valley, three Directors representing the York Rite, one from each Grand Body, and one Director from the Order of the Eastern Star. Board members receive no monetary compensation of any kind. The Foundation has a full-time staff working in the Edmond office, under the direction of John L. Logan, Executive Director. FINANCIAL

The Foundation 12/31/18 preliminary consolidated financial report reflects total assets of \$90,990,627.31. The 2019 consolidated budget projects expenditures of \$4,765,253.

LODGE MATCHING FUNDS

This program was established in 1983 and designed to encourage and support local Lodges in the area of charity by matching local Lodge monetary contributions in the areas of scholarships, local disasters, local charitable causes, and local community services. In 2018, 215 Lodges used the program for \$1,644,873. Since the beginning of the Matching Funds program, the Foundation has contributed \$30,505,576 in support of local charitable or educational projects, and with the local lodge's participation have created a minimum of \$61,011,152 of support for local community needs.

PROMISES MATTER

The Foundation stands ready to assist those Lodges and OES Chapters in caring for their needy members through matching funds or direct grants. Each Lodge or Chapter is in the best position to know which of its members need assistance. Lodges may use their entire \$12,500 allotment of matching funds for Promises Matter activities. In 2018, 17 different Lodges and 4 OES Chapters participated with grants totaling \$99,058. The average grant was \$4,717

PUBLIC PARTNERSHIPS

The Foundation works with other organizations to achieve worthwhile goals and make Masonic charity more visible across the State of Oklahoma.

Partners in Prevention is a partnership with Vizavance, formerly known as Prevent Blindness Oklahoma. Lodges statewide sponsor vision and glaucoma screenings, targeting the young and the elderly. The Foundation provided \$200,000 in 2018 and had budgeted \$240,000 for 2019 to support the ongoing costs of the program. In February of 2017, the 4-millionth child was screened through this partnership. The Foundation has provided over \$4 million in support of this important work.

Food Bank support has been an annual program since 2011. In 2018 the Fight Childhood Hunger Campaign resulted in \$50,000.00 being donated to the Regional Food Bank and \$35,000.00 being donated to the Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma. The 2018 Masonic Match to Fight Childhood Hunger campaign will run from August 1st through September 30th. This statewide effort is a combined effort of the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma, the Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma, the Masonic Fraternity of Oklahoma, and Griffin Communications (Channel 9 in OKC and Channel 6 in Tulsa). Food Bank is one of three projects with statewide visibility that attempt to enhance the image of the Fraternity while supporting a significant charitable or educational purpose.

FFA Masonic Endowment Campaign began in 2016 with a goal of establishing a one-million-dollar endowment for the FFA. The FFA Masonic Endowment is one of three projects with statewide visibility that attempt to

enhance the image of the Fraternity while supporting a significant charitable or educational purpose. A summary of the FFA Endowment program is as follows:

The State Teacher of the Year is awarded a check for \$5,000, the State Teacher of the Year's school district receives \$5,000, each of the eleven finalists receives a check for \$1,000 and each of the Rising Star award recipients receives \$500. Each local Teacher of the Year receives a framed certificate of appreciation.
- 2. The Student of Today Award is a program that encourages outstanding performance in students of all grade levels by recognizing exemplary students. Each recipient receives a certificate, usually by a local Mason, at their school's awards assembly or some Lodges host banquets for the winners. In 2018, the Foundation prepared 2,584 certificates for presentation.
- 3. The Teacher of Today Award program is used by Freemasonry in Oklahoma to say "thanks" to those hundreds of teachers across our state that makes a daily difference in the lives of our children. Each teacher receives a certificate presented by the local Lodge. It is a small token to express our appreciation to these men and women who carry the burden of the future on their shoulders. In 2018, the Foundation prepared 904 certificates for presentation.
- The State Superintendent's Awards for Arts Excellence honor the Fifty top high school seniors in the visual and performing arts in our state. Also, the top school administrators and school board members are honored during a prestigious formal reception at the Guthrie Scottish Rite Temple. The students are presented medals by the Grand Master and State Superintendent of Education. The 2019 event will be held on April 23rd at the Guthrie Scottish Rite Temple.
- 5. Higher Education Endowments: The last of the Higher Education Endowments were presented in 2018 and the program is now complete. The project utilized \$2,450,000 of Foundation funds and established a Masonic presence at each state-funded institution of higher learning. The goal of this program was to place a Masonic endowment at every publicly funded university and college in Oklahoma. A total of \$2,450,000 in endowed funds have been placed since 2008, as follows:

- 6. The Payne Education Center is a non-profit organization established in 1984. Since 1996 the Foundation has supported the Payne Education Center's Reading Readiness program designed to train kindergarten and transitional 1st-grade teachers by providing scholarships for enhanced reading techniques. For 2019, the Foundation budgeted \$42,500 for this program.
- 7. The Youth Scholarship Program funding is through the Education Endowment. The scholarship program is open to members of the DeMolay, Job's Daughters and Rainbow. This year ninety scholarships of \$2,000.00 each were budgeted, and eighty-eight were awarded as follows: DeMolay 18, Job's Daughters 8, and Rainbow 62.

Ethics Bowl is a competitive program sponsored by the SEED Foundation through funding in large part from the Masonic Charity Foundation. The Oklahoma Region High School Ethics Bowl competition for the 2018-2019 school year occurred Saturday, January 19, 2019, at the Oklahoma School of Science and Mathematics in Oklahoma City. Even though this will be only the program's third year in operation, Oklahoma is currently the largest region in the nation. The winning team from the Oklahoma Region competition will be invited to compete at the national competition in Chapel Hill, North Carolina this April. The SEED Foundation continues to express gratitude for the financial support of the Masonic Charity Foundation provides the High School Ethics Bowl program.

This year's winning teams were: 1st Place-Dove Science Academy; 2nd Place-Norman North HS; 3rd Place-Oklahoma School of Science and Mathematics.

8. Senior Essay Contest – The Senior Essay Contest was launched in 1966 in support of education. Writing has been found to teach critical thinking skills. The essay contest is open to all seniors in Oklahoma public schools. It is sponsored by the Masonic Fraternity in Oklahoma as part of its continuing commitments to education and the young people of our state. Cash prizes in both the Men's and Women's division range from \$2,000 for 1st place to \$200 for 10th place. Also, a \$5,000.00 grant will be made to each of the 1st place winners high school. For the 2018 – 2019 contests, there were 1,101 seniors who entered the contest. A total of \$13,700 was awarded to the 20 statewide winners of the contest, and \$5,000.00 grants to the schools of each of the statewide first place winners. Certificates for presentation to the local division winners of 124 high schools sponsored by 98 Lodges will be provided to the local Lodge.

Senior Assistance Program-Through an agreement with the Oklahoma Area Agencies on Aging, a division of the Department of Human Services, \$783,261 was given in December 2018 to assist needy Oklahomans aged 55 and over with services not covered by existing government programs during the calendar year 2019. Since the inception of this program in 2007, the Foundation has donated a total of \$9,407,309 in the name of the Masonic Fraternity of Oklahoma to enhance the lives of seniors in our communities. These eleven agencies can be accessed by calling 1-800-211-2116 or at www.okdhs.org.

Masonry in Action Award program began in 2013 with the purpose of recognizing lodges which do an outstanding job in utilizing the Foundation programs. The Foundation allows each winning lodge the opportunity to specify a worthy non-profit in their community to receive a \$5,000.00 grant. In 2018 Pilot 367 was the small lodge category winner and Owasso 545 won the large lodge class. The 2018 contest results were a repeat of 2017! Congratulations to both lodges!

Foundation Activities

A report of the Foundation activities including its audited financial statements is made annually to the MW Grand Lodge of Oklahoma and is printed in its annual proceedings. KNIGHT TEMPLAR EYE FOUNDATION REPORT

The goal of the Knight Templar Eye Foundation is to have every Sir Knight of every Commandery to be a Life Sponsor of the Knight Templar Eye Foundation. At our Grand Sessions in 2016 we witnessed the awarding of a \$55,000 research grant to a doctor here in Oklahoma, and this is not the first time this has happened. We get to see that the donations we make to our 178

Charity come back to us. We are not a donor state but a recipient state. The donations of other Sir Knights from other jurisdictions have come to Oklahoma. At the Grand Encampment meeting this past August it was mentioned that only 7% of all Knight Templars across the country are life sponsors of the Knight Templar Eye Foundation. Over the years our largest donors to any of our charities have been dead people living on a fixed income. For those of you who are members of the Grand Commanders Club or the Grand Masters Club, Thank you. If you already are a life sponsor, Thank you. Please consider purchasing a Life Sponsorship in the Knight Templar Eye Foundation for a candidate that you have top line signed. We can and must do better to support the charities that are part to the organizations that we are members of.

We have lost even more ground in the last 12 months in attaining the goal of 100% participation. Last year I reported that we were at 31.4% and this year we are at 30.9% participation, the drop is due to the deaths of our Sir Knights who were Life Sponsors. As part of our dues structure \$1 from our annual dues goes to the Knight Templar Eye Foundation, but by purchasing a Life Sponsorship for \$30 you have purchased a lifetime investment into the Knight Templar Eye Foundation and that \$1 is deducted from your annual dues. I know of several Commandery's who have made changes in their bylaws regarding the fees structure that includes the cost of a Knight Templar Eye Foundation Life Sponsorship into the joining fees, and I strongly encourage each Commandery to consider making these changes to their bylaws.

Currently McAlester Commandery No. 6 Still leads the state at 86.7% of its membership are Life Sponsors in the KTEF, followed by St. Aumer Commandery No.29 (Woodward) at 44.7% and Trinity Commandery No. 20 (Tulsa) at 40.8% of its membership are Life Sponsors. If you are interested in purchasing a Life Sponsor membership see your local recorder or any Grand Commandery Officer/OIC for more information.

With the 50th annual KTEF campaign that ended May 15, 2018, Oklahoma donated a total of \$6,815.00, a \$4793 decrease over last year. The two plaques presented at Grand Sessions, the F.M. "Fritz" Lombard award for the largest total contribution, and the Ned D. Prator award for the largest per-capita contributions this year, are going to two Commanderies this year.

There are several advantages to obtaining extended contracts for future years. This motion will be brought before the Grand Bodies at the 2019 sessions. If the motion is approved, the dates for the 2020 and 2021 sessions should be as follows: April 23-25, 2019 and April 22-24, 2020. The agenda would remain basically the same as in previous years unless requested by the heads of the Grand Bodies.

In conclusion, while it may still be desirous by a small number of attendees to use mail-in paper registrations, it is strongly recommended in future years that the registration be done entirely utilizing the electronic online registration process. This would allow for a more timely, accurate and complete registration process.





MARSHALL M. CLAYTON


