#### Royal Arch Masons:

Date from the year the second temple was commenced by Zerubbabel. Anno Inventionis (A.L.)," in the year of discovery."

#### Order of High Priesthood:

Date from the year of blessing of Abram by the High Priest Melchizedek, Anno Benefacionis (A.B.), "in the year of blessing."

#### Royal and Select Masters:

Date from the year in which the temple of Solomon was completed, Anno Depositionis (A.Dep.), "in the year of deposit."

#### Knight Templar:

Commence their era with the organization of their Order, Anno Ordinis (A.O.), "in the year of the Order.

#### Scottish Rite:

Same as Ancient Craft, except that the Jewish chronology is used, Anno Mundi (A.M.), "in the year of the world."

Ancient Craft Masons: Add 4,000 years to the Common Era:

Thus, 2004 plus 4,000 = 6004.

Royal Arch Masons: Add 530 years to the Common Era:

Thus, 2004 plus 530 = 2534.

Order of High Priesthood: Add 1,913 Years to the Common Era:

Thus, 2004 plus 1,913 = 3917.

Royal and Select Masters: Add 1,000 years to the Common Era:

Thus, 2004 plus 1,000 = 3004.

Knights Templar: Subtract 1,118 years from the Common Era:


Thus, 2004 minus 1,118 = 886.

Scottish Rite: Add 3,760 years to the Common Era:

Thus, 2004 plus 3,760 = 5764.





#### JOHN E. KING 2011-12

John E. King was born at Westerly, RI in 1941. Raised in Westerly and Wakefield, RI and graduated from South Kingstown High School. He joined the Air Force in 1960. He served 21 years as an Avionics Technician and 7 years as a First Sergeant. He retired from the Air Force as a Senior Master Sergeant in 1988 after 28 yrs of service and as a Vietnam Veteran 1964 – 65. He married his wife Vicki in 1964, and has 5 children, 14 grand children and 9 great grand children. He has an diploma from DeVry Electronics, Associate of Arts Degree from Western Oklahoma State College, Associate of Science in Avionics from the University of the Air Force, Bachelor of Science in Occupational Education from Southern Illinois University at Carbondale, postgraduate work in Education and Human Relations at the University of Oklahoma, and Oklahoma State University, and holds a Oklahoma Department of Education Secondary Teaching Certificate. He taught High School and Adult students in Vocational Electronics at the Great Plains Technology Center in Frederick, OK. Retiring after 14 years he taught Heavy Industrial Electronics Maintenance at Southwest Technology Center, Altus, OK for another two years.

#### TRIENNIAL REPORT

The year 2011 being the Triennial Year, I had the pleasure of attending 68<sup>th</sup> Triennial at Raleigh, North Carolina. I met with companions not only across the nation, moreover across the world. Masons from countries throughout the world are embracing United States Royal Arch Masonry. I heard a companion from Central America speak about Masonry in his country. He said Masonry was changing the politics, living conditions and how women were treated. What could be a better testimony? This is Masonry doing exactly what it was designed to do.

I had the high honor to carry the Oklahoma Flag into the convocation. I also had the extreme pleasure of watching M : E : Ike Isaacs receive the Silver Medal. I cannot think of anyone more deserving. M : E : Timothy Israel was appointed and received his accouterments for Ambassador to Oklahoma from General Grand Chapter. I also witnessed M : E : Edmond D. (Ted) Harrison elected and installed as Grand High Priest of General Grand Chapter. I have been able to spend time with him the last three years and we have become friends. He is a dedicated Mason and is constantly on the road working to further Royal Arch Masonry

#### STATE OF THE CRAFT

As I traveled this year, I observed a lack of effort to open Chapters. This reluctance has developed into a nearly complete inability to do any of the work. Meetings are being opened for business only, no matter how many are present. Chapters with Commanderies are opening and conducting all business in Commandery completely, without opening Chapter or Council.

The opening and closing ritual of Chapter is unique in Masonry. It is specifically designed to instill companionship among its members. When it is not done, the whole significance of the meeting is lost. New members are expecting this ritual, but instead find a dull "business" meeting with no ritual and no meaning. Soon they will leave to find it somewhere else.

The performing the ritual opening and closing has also created the lack of interest in performing the degrees. We have very few Chapters that have the capability of conferring even one degree. The comments of candidates after receiving the Chapter degrees are that they beautiful and meaningful degrees. They are ready to get active. We are not a business; we are a ritual fraternity. Let us return to our roots.

On the positive, the two Chapters chartered two years ago are still running and are working to improve. Members of Lindsay Lodge No. 248 requested a visit from the Grand Chapter Officers to discuss how to charter a Chapter of Royal Arch Masons. I with the Grand King (R : E : Robert Rolseth) and District Deputy (M : E : Donnie

Higginbotham) attended a stated meeting. The Grand King gave his program on Royal Arch Masonry and we answered their questions. I found them to be very dedicated Masons who are trying to improve their Masonic experience. Three of them received their degrees at the field day in February. The District Deputy is in the process of assembling teams to confer the degrees at the Lodge. They will then submit for dispensation.

When I was installed, I told the Grand King to do whatever he determined was necessary to begin programs that will help the craft make Oklahoma York Rite Masonry go forward. His year programs began on that date. He developed an educational, membership, traveling lecture and has been delivering it to Blue Lodges. He is developing a correspondence course to help Royal Arch Masons better understand Royal Arch Masonry. He is developing other methods to deliver to the needs of the Constituent Chapters to succeed and grow.

A new membership organization has been submitted by R : E : Robert Davis to have a structured membership committee that will better serve the needs of Chapters recruiting new members.

I designed a packet, along the same lines as the Grand Lodge Pathway Packet. It will contain a petition, the York Rite information pamphlet, a map of Chapter locations with meeting times and secretary information, also pamphlets of our philanthropies. The Grand King has had them printed and is in the process of assembling them.

#### RECOMENDATIONS

Chapters, open in full form! Give the new members something to keep them coming back.

Become a mentor. Establish a mentorship program in your Chapter. Make sure that new members are followed up on. Get them to the meetings and involve them in the running of the Chapter. Let them know that they are important and are needed.

Become involved in the new membership activities. Make sure you are utilizing the new membership committee and use the new recruiting packet.

There will be a leadership program available at the 55<sup>th</sup> Annual Southwest Regional and South Central Department Conference, September 14 & 15 2012, at Dallas in September. This is close and can be attended in one day. Send your young members that are in the line to improve their leadership abilities.

Remember that we are Masons. We need to be working at our Blue Lodge to get new Masons, help to get them raised and mentor them. We cannot get Royal Arch Masons off the street.

Keep the Grand High Priest in the loop. He is there to serve the craft and to keep the light of Royal Arch Masonry burning.

I recommend that the Chapter, Council and Commandery of each York Rite Body elect separate heads of each body. One man has conflicts of interest when he is the head of all three bodies.

Take the correspondence course when it is published later this year. Learn more about Royal Arch Masonry.

I recommend a class of instruction for the District Deputies. The District Deputy should know exactly what his duties entail and how to carry them out Fraternally submitted, John E. King, Grand High Priest

#### FRATERNAL CORRESPONDENCE COMMITTEE

In preparation for this report I had the pleasure of reviewing the proceedings of Grand Chapters from the United States, Scotland, England, Canada, several from south America and a few from Europe.

Decline in membership remains a concern in many jurisdictions, and there is guarded optimism that the turnaround is within sight. Losses due to demits and suspensions are slowing considerably as efforts for retention are being initiated to stir interest and attendance. More proactive activities in recruitment are necessary to stem the tide of increasing deaths due to an aging membership.

Reports also indicate that some chapters are experiencing moderate growth. This success is attributed to the efforts of informing and educating Craft Masons on the York Rite. Many jurisdictions have developed a presentation to be used in Blue Lodge to promote membership in the York Rite. Some Grand Bodies have combined fund raisers. A good number Jurisdictions have been commending those Chapters, officers and members for the zealousness of their endeavors in their respective locales, awarding certificates, medals, pins...etc. The Grand Chapter of Texas, for example, distinguishes an outstanding constituent Chapter for their efforts with a "Zerubbabal" award. Some Grand Chapters encourage competition in either fund raising or ritual. The General Grand Chapter has had a ritual jewel available along with a Sweetheart award to recognize the ladies of our Companions. Locally, some chapters have put together a Master Mason degree team and perform a special play

written for the presentation in a Blue Lodge.

He was a leader and he has left a big void in our lives, in our Chapter and Masonry, and in Elk City.

Lets take a look at the "numbers". In Oklahoma we lost a net of 43 Royal Arch Masons. Death claimed 50 members. Oklahoma lost a Chapter at Shawnee. But, we exalted a total of 50 new Royal Arch Masons. We even reinstated 3. Six of our Chapters had net growth, including Norman who got 56 members from Shawnee. Eleven Chapters had a net loss of membership. We lost more Royal Arch Masons this year than either the Council or the Commandery. Although our net loss was less than 2% (1.6%), it is still too high.

With 20 Chapters we only need to exalt two more members per chapter to obtain growth. But there is so much more to examine. Our survival as York Rite Bodies is in serious jeopardy. If we went to a Doctor in our condition, he would be giving us a serious check-up and a comprehensive plan of treatment. That is what we need.

We must address the issues and solve the problems that lead to declining membership.

I really believe that the first step is our own personal commitment to our York Rite Bodies (and our Blue Lodges). We have declining numbers in attendance. We have to look in the mirror before we look anywhere else for a solution. We must all commit to attend meetings and make them interesting, to learn ritual parts for degrees and then do those degrees, to have educational programs for our membership (which we can do ourselves), and to talk to our friends who aren't Masons about this fraternity we all love.

I have a bias and I am going to share it. The Chapter is the foundation of the York Rite System. It continues the lessons that we learned in the Lodge. The symbolic degrees of Entered Apprentice, Fellowcraft, and Master Mason, as conferred in Oklahoma and most of the United States, are degrees of the York Rite. I honestly believe that every Mason in Oklahoma should receive the Royal Arch Degree. The Holy Royal Arch is one of the oldest and most important degrees in all of Masonry.

Since we don't have York Rite Bodies affiliated with every Lodge in Oklahoma, we need a system to provide Capitular Masonry to those Masons. A couple of years ago in a report like this one Robert G. Davis made a suggestion that I believe we all need to hear. We should have a viable Chapter in at least one lodge in every three counties. Men need access to the York Rite within a round trip driving distance that can reasonably be accomplished in one evening. A Viable Chapter. We all need to work on the ones we have to make them viable - and more.

We need to be performing degree work on a continuing basis in all of our Chapters. That is one of the reasons we have monthly or semi-monthly meetings. We can do our degree work at our home York Rite bodies or by combining with other bodies, offer regional degrees. It will enhance the Masonic experience of all involved.

To be able to combine with those other bodies in our area, each Chapter needs to be able to confer one or more degrees.

We are part of some of the most beautiful and insightful degrees in all of Masonry. We need to promote those wonderful lessons of Masonry and build the camaraderie that Masonry is about.

To begin to rebuild a ritual program, if that is what your Chapter needs, start by making sure you can confer the Mark Master degree. That would allow us to get our new members started at home. They would begin to feel that they were part of a York Rite Body. It would allow them to meet more of our members and become involved in our local activities. (You do have local activities, don't you?) Then, *if you must*, take the new member to a festival or field day. I don't mean send him with one other member of your Chapter, but take a group and allow him to become a part of your body.

As I was about to submit this report, I noticed that each of you reading this report in the pre-print are members of this Committee. We should all take our commitment to this Membership Committee seriously and formulate our own plan about how we should implement membership growth in Oklahoma and in our own Chapters.

#### **NECROLOGY COMMITTEE**

#### RARA COMMITTEE

The Board of Directors of Royal Arch Research Assistance Incorporated, the philanthropy of the General Grand Chapter Royal Arch Masons International, after considerable research, review, discussion, soul searching and interviewing numerous organizations involved in Central Auditory Processing Disorders have chosen three for research funding for 2011 – 2012.

The first organization selected is the University of Connecticut and Dr. Frank Musiek, PhD., an internationally known and recognized researcher in CAPD, and their promising program for continuing their efforts in this field of research. The second organization is Autism Speaks, which has a number of initiatives dealing with hearing and research in newborn children and toddlers, and thirdly the Deafness Research Foundation, which has a pilot educational program, Sage and Sound, for elementary and middle school children. Autism Speaks has a number of initiatives dealing with hearing research in newborn children and toddlers. This program will also provide hands on local capability to become involved in fund raising activities at either the state or local Chapter level should our Companions wish to join or become involved and participate in this great opportunity. They also have a new initiative called the *Hearing Restoration Project*, which is a new multidisciplinary national research consortium effort

aimed at speeding up research in the regeneration of cells and molecules that regulate hearing processes.

The Board is excited as it is felt that this initiative will advance national and local recognition of our efforts and provide a very positive image throughout the world for Royal Arch Masonry. The Board also feels that by taking this approach we will have a broader field of research being accomplished by a number of researchers working in Central Auditory Processing Disorders. This certainly seems to provide Royal Arch Masonry with the opportunity to obtain the greatest bang for the buck over all other programs and organizations that were considered. These initial grant programs are to be reviewed annually to assure that the goals and objectives are being met as a requirement for additional future funding.

The potential need for central auditory processing disorder (CAPD) diagnosis and management is great. Because central auditory processing difficulties are associated with children and adults with other challenges such as traumatic brain injury, autism, and attention deficit disorder (ADD), the incidence of CAPD is most likely underestimated. For example, the incidence of autism is 1 in every 500 births, 200 million people a year have some degree of head injury, and 28 million individuals have hearing loss. Furthermore, 2 million children have been diagnosed with ADD, and 1 in every 1600 individuals has multiple sclerosis. All of these population groups are at risk for CAPD and with your continuing support, we can help them.

Your Oklahoma York Bodies, as of February 28, 2012, had contributed a grand total since the conception, of \$115,937.77 (\$100,586.50 in "regular" contributions and \$15,351.27 in memorial contributions).

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

During our visits to the Councils around the state, we found that some are still suffering from the same problems we have had in the past, particularly lack of attendance, and lack of using opening and closing rituals. My main objective in our visits was to emphasize fellowship and ritual. Our responsibility to get new members does not end with getting his name on a petition and getting him thru the degrees and orders. We need to make sure they know where and when the meetings are held, tutor and mentor them to take positions of responsibility in the Council to better step in and fill vacant chairs when needed or elected.

I would recommend that the Councils establish some form of communication, i.e., email or even better, telephone, with new and existing members to remind them of the date and time of your next meeting. In this busy age it is easy to forget.

Also, the practice of "going dark" for three months or so interferes with the normal routine of going to meetings and practicing opening and closing rituals. If at all possible, I would recommend that you try and make the Council meetings a monthly affair. The rituals closely follow Blue Lodge and with a little practice do not take a lot of time and effort to do.

In conclusion, if your Council needs any assistance in direction or any other help, please contact your Grand Council Officers or your local DDGM's. We are here to help your Council succeed.

The total maximum disbursements for the Grand Council will be based on 4,344 members times .08 cents per member or \$347.52.

The Most Illustrious Grand Master did not attend due to his flight being cancelled because of a hurricane in the area. Had he attended the calculation for the MIGM would be based on 1,142 miles times 15 cents per mile, one way, plus \$20 per day per diem; 1,142 miles times .15 cents per mile = \$171.30, plus 3 days per diem or \$60 for a total of \$231.30. The total disbursement of \$347.52 less \$231.30 = \$116.22, which would normally be split between the two MIPGM's attending.

In accordance with Article 6, Section 5b, of the Grand Council "none shall receive an amount in excess of the largest allowance to either the Grand High Priest or the

Grand Illustrious Master". Therefore the allowance to Companions Stuckey and Isaacs is based on GHP Allowance of \$262.80 less \$23.06 received from the Grand Chapter, less an adjustment of \$65.98, so the amount received equals \$173.76 for each MIPGM in attendance for a maximum total of \$347.52.

Of course, it has been a personal pleasure for me to serve as Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar in Oklahoma. To all of you, Sir Knights, your warm friendliness, good counsel, and fraternal courtesies have been the most humbling experience of my life. I am grateful to all of you for granting me the honor of serving the Grand York Rite Bodies of Oklahoma.

In August of 1983, fellow Lion Charles Godfrey and I were manning a concession stand for District playoffs in Prep Baseball at Lions Park in Cushing. During a lull in the soda jerking business, I asked Charlie what that pin was on his lapel. (No, not the turtle pin). He briefly stated the Masons, then gave me a petition, I applied, was elected to receive the degrees and quickly ran through the categorical lectures and was a Master Mason. I was appointed Senior Steward at my first meeting after turning in my Master's lecture. In short order Charlie insisted I become a Scottish Rite Mason, then other Lodge members Jimmy Dooley, Ray Hayes, and Rex Bowen persuaded me to go through the degrees of the Chapter and Council at the Old Downtown Tulsa Lodge. (I swear Pat Couch was getting caught sleeping at his post even then.) The Junior Past Grand Commander Jack Shanklin drove me back to Cushing. I was the candidate for Cimarron Valley Commandery No. 42's inspection.

In 1989, Ray Hayes found that asylum above and left me his sword. Shortly after that I began to work in the Order of the Temple at Drumright. Tom Hall decided to retire as Prelate and gave me his Prelate garb. I jumped at the chance because I had the worst uniform and chapeau of anyone and I knew I could safely do the Prelate and not have to buy the accompanying uniform, chapeau, and belt. Jack Shanklin taught me the language. He joked (I thought) if I learned the part, be warned, I could be asked to go to other Commanderies to do the Prelate's part in the Order. To my surprise, that is what happened, first Stillwater, then Bartlesville along with Cimarron Valley. Not long after working my regular Prelate part at the inspections, I remember RE John Schrawger asking me to take an interest in running for the Grand Line. Finally, Robert G. Davis convinced me the time was right and I was fortunate enough to be elected.

I have relished my time in the Grand Line and it has just dawned on me that it is

over, done, 9 years and I will soon pass on the Red Maltese Crosses and take up those of Purple. With great pride and joy I step aside. I miss those who had helped me and are now at rest from their labors. I hope I have represented them well.

When I began as a Grand Commander Line Officer our outlook appeared bleak by many, but I saw many aspects of York Rite Masonry which were appealing and posed for success if properly marketed. We are a patriotic and Christian fraternity. We are the bearers of a great legacy which remains among the most curious and fascinating of the fraternal and religious societies for the past 1000 years. We still possess the positive name recognition. Movies of late have made us out as being mysterious, heroic, chivalric, and bound by an ideal code of ethics. I have yet to mention our distinctive and romantic uniforming.

We have a message, we have a legacy which reaches back to the Great Crusades, and we have a past bathed in tragedy and christened by our vows of Knighthood. What we are dependent on to grow is the ability to extend the initiatory experience to those who wish to join. The field days have been a success but alas too few. Hopefully a new plan is afoot to remedy the anemic opportunities of those number who wish to be companions in order to gain permission to pass through our ceremonies and enter the asylum of our Commandery.

I congratulate Robert G. Davis for the construction of the Oklahoma York Rite Membership Recruitment Organization. This has the potential to grow our Rite and our Order. I recommend it be adopted at the April 2012 Grand Sessions. It does not take much foresight to see that our Commandery numbers will grow by one or two in the next year or so. Further with this structure in place we may have several more Chapter, Council, and Commanderies in Oklahoma.

Finally, I want to express my gratitude to Cimarron Valley Commandery No. 42, St. John's Commandery No. 8, and Calvary Commandery No. 26 the three local Bodies of which I belong. The Companions and Sir Knights have taught me much about the ritual workings of the York Rite. They are men who showed me unsullied honor, unwearied zeal, and universal benevolence.

#### Recommendations

We are poised for a new dawning of Templar Masonry in Oklahoma. The statistics show a leveling off of our decline in both membership and the number of Commanderies in serious trouble or going dark. Although this fact by itself may not seem to be the great new awakening we need to be optimistic. It is a spark of optimism and a spark that can ignite the imaginations of thousand of Oklahomans who demand a better self. This perceived optimism is born from several observable factors which may or may not show up on any polling data. We can best parlay this optimism into a fountain of solid members by focusing on providing a valuable and timely initiatory experience to the companions and pilgrims who approach our Rite.

Many of our newly knighted Templars are becoming active. All over the state I have seen evidence of young Sir Knights actively taking a part and excited about Templary. I have talked to either the Commanders or representatives of every Commandery in Oklahoma and everyone is committed. The Commanderies not doing the Order of the Temple this year leave me with the impression this is just a temporary set back. All are ready to see the Order of the Temple continue to be conferred in their Commanderies.

What the Commandery now has in the mix are young members, enthusiastic members, and optimistic members. What we need are more just like them. Although we have two good one day festivals a year and fully 12 Commanderies that perform the Order of the Temple, we do not offer enough opportunity for potential Sir Knights to be conferred.

- The Regional degree program should be implemented and promoted through-out the State so that the degrees/orders are available to every Master Mason in the State. Access to, and knowledge of the Rite is our most pressing problem. Membership recruitment coupled with a regional degree team can address this problem.
- 2. Commanderies who feel they cannot do the Order of the Temple during Inspection should request a regional team perform the Order, using either an entire team or those positions the local Commandery cannot field.
- 3. The Inspection season should be extended to eight to ten weeks with many weekends used for Commanderies further from metropolitan areas. This may increase visitation from those members with careers.

4. Seek a way to terminate the problem that has developed within the Grand Encampment. No option should be off the table. An unhealthy atmosphere is created when our "superior body" cannot adhere to the constitutions, law, rules, and edicts of the Grand Lodge of Oklahoma.

#### **Concluding Remarks**

I cannot leave the office of Grand Commander without praising the work of RE Gary A. Davis, PGC and Grand Recorder. He has done a stellar job in organizing the office of Grand Recorder and handling the business of our Grand Bodies. He is truly a servant leader and we are blessed to have an individual of such dedication and skill looking after the administrative functions of our Grand Bodies. Sir Knight Gary; Thanks for carrying me through this year.

I thank Robert G. Davis who has aided my Masonic journey for the past 25 years. A man who is even more excited about the Craft than he was when I first met him at the Guthrie Consistory. I have been fortunate to have served with him in Consistory, Guildhall Lodge, and as a Grand Officer in the Commandery. Thanks Bob for helping me all these years, I am indebted to you.

To the delegates of our Grand Sessions, I thank you for the opportunity to serve a leadership role in one of the oldest heritages in all of Masonic history. Every Christian Mason should take our moving Order of the Temple. Our uniqueness has much to offer the Masonic culture. The degrees and Orders stand on their own when given to those who become Freemasons. Let us strive to increase Masonic awareness of our traditional Rite and its purposes in the family of Masonry. Let us go forth and maintain degree work of consistent quality in every region of Oklahoma. We are growing and with the continuation of a quality initiatory experience we will continue to grow.

I had always heard the admonition, "you get out what you put into any endeavor", Masonry has taught me that is not true. I have put very little into Masonry to have accomplished so much self satisfaction and to be associated with so many admirable Sir Knights

# THE REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON GENERAL MATTERS

We find the general health of our local Commanderies weaker than last year. Only two showed an increase in membership. The number of suspensions in Lawton 18, Elk City 22 and Calvary 26 are a serious concern as these represent 10 to 14 percent. The Grand Commandery suffered a two percent loss in 2011 compared to 1.5 percent in 2010.

The other concerns are the pattern of late filings of reports and failure to stand inspections. These are both areas the Grand Commander and OIC's should address with the local Commanders and Recorders.

## MASONIC CHARITY FOUNDATION OF OKLAHOMA

The Masonic Charity Foundation of Oklahoma is an Oklahoma not for profit corporation formed on July 9, 1930 for the purposes of encouraging charity, benevolence, education and philanthropy. It was created in order that the institutional giving of Oklahoma Freemasonry could be better focused and coordinated. The activities of the Foundation do not replace those of the individual Masons; they merely serve to supplement them.

# **MANAGEMENT**

The Foundation is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of twenty-two members. The Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of the State of Oklahoma elects fifteen of the Directors, three each year, for a five year term. There are also three Directors representing the Scottish Rite, one from each Valley, three Directors representing the York Rite, one from each Grand Body, and one Director from the from the Order of the Eastern Star. Board members receive no monetary compensation of any kind. The Foundation has a full time staff working in the Edmond office, under the direction of John L. Logan, Executive Director. ## **FINANCIAL**

The Foundation 12/31/11 preliminary financial report shows an increase to the general funds of \$2,396,059.67. The 2012 budget projects revenues of \$3,931,922 and expenses of \$3,305,480.

# LODGE MATCHING FUNDS

This program was established in 1983 and designed to encourage and support local Lodges in the area of charity by matching local Lodge monetary contributions in the areas of scholarships, local disasters, local charitable causes and local community services. In order to qualify, the Lodge must be actively engaged in raising the money to be matched. In 2002, the amount was raised to \$10,000 per year, with the requirement that no more than \$7,500 could be used for community needs. The remaining \$2,500 could only be used for a needy Brother or his family. In 2007, the community matching funds portion was raised to \$10,000, with the \$2,500 remaining for Promises Matter matching. In 2011, 220 Lodges used the program in the amount of \$1,586,972.

# PROMISES MATTER

The Foundation stands ready to assist those Lodges and OES Chapters in caring for their needy members through matching funds or direct grants. Each Lodge or Chapter is in the best position to know which of its members need assistance. Lodges may use their entire \$12,500 allotment of matching funds for Promises Matter activities. The Foundation can be contacted immediately on a toll free number, 1-877-5-Masons, if a member is discovered whose needs are beyond the ability of the Lodge or Chapter. In 2011, 27 different Lodges and 2 OES Chapters participated with grants totaling \$106,577. The average grant was \$3,331.

# **PUBLIC PARTNERSHIPS**

The Foundation works with other organizations to achieve worthwhile goals and make Masonic charity more visible across the State of Oklahoma.

**Partners in Prevention** is a partnership with Prevent Blindness Oklahoma. Lodges statewide sponsor vision and glaucoma screenings, targeting the young and the elderly. The Foundation funded the project in the amount of \$156,000 in 2011 and has budgeted \$160,000 for 2012.

**Oklahoma Educational Television Authority-**Better known as OETA, received a combined total of \$49,139.50 from 175 lodges with matching funds from the Foundation. Our contribution allows us to sponsor four of the most popular programs of public television, the OETA Movie Club, the World of National Geographic, This Old House and Antiques Road Show.

**Senior Essay Contest** – During the 2011-2012 school year 118 schools participated in the contest by submitting 2,313 essays which were sponsored by 135 Lodges. Local school winners were recognized with certificates for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place in both boys and girls divisions. Statewide winners were selected from these and 10 in both boys and girls divisions were recognized with cash prizes totaling \$13,700 in 1<sup>st</sup> through 10<sup>th</sup> places.

**The Oklahoma State Department of Education-**Our support for public education was demonstrated in five statewide programs.

- 1. The Oklahoma State Teacher of the Year program honors teachers who make outstanding contributions in the public education of our youth. The State Teacher of the Year is awarded a check for \$5,000, the State Teacher of the Year's school district receives \$5,000, each of the eleven finalists receives a check for \$500 and each of the Rising Star award recipients receives \$500. Each local Teacher of the Year receives a framed certificate of appreciation.
- 2. The Student of Today Award is a program that encourages outstanding performance in students of all grade levels by recognizing exemplary students. Each recipient is presented a certificate, usually by a local Mason, at their schools awards assembly or some Lodges host banquets for the winners. In 2011, the Foundation prepared 2,617 certificates for presentation by 180 participating Lodges.
- 3. The Teacher of Today Award program is used by Freemasonry in Oklahoma to say "thanks" to those hundreds of teachers across our state that makes a daily difference in the lives of our children. Each teacher receives a certificate presented by the local Lodge. It is a small token to express our appreciation to these men and women who carry the burden of the future on their shoulders. In 2011 the Foundation prepared 829 certificates for presentation by 172 participating Lodges.
- 4. The State Superintendent's Awards for Arts Excellence honor the fifty top high school seniors in the visual and performing arts in our state. In addition, the top school administrators and school board members are honored during a prestigious formal reception at the Guthrie Scottish Rite Temple. The students are presented medals by the Grand Master and State Superintendent of Education.
- 5. **Higher Education Endowments** in the amount of \$100,000 each were established at 4 regional universities –Oklahoma Panhandle State University, University, East Central University of Science and Arts (USAO), Cameron University, Langston University.

**The Payne Education Center** is a non-profit organization established in 1984. Since 1996 the Foundation has supported the Payne Education Center's Reading Readiness program designed to train kindergarten and transitional 1st grade teachers by providing \$75 reading readiness kits. For 2012, the Foundation budgeted \$42,500 for this program.

**Senior Assistance Program**-Through an agreement with the Oklahoma Area Agencies on Aging, a division of the Department of Human Services, \$750,064 was given in December 2011 to assist needy Oklahomans aged 55 and over with services not covered by existing government programs during calendar year 2012. ### **Foundation Activities**

A report of the Foundation activities including its audited financial statements is made annually to the MW Grand Lodge of Oklahoma and is printed in its annual proceedings. Additional information can also be found at the Foundation's website <a href="https://www.mcfok.org">www.mcfok.org</a>.

It has been a great honor to serve as the Foundation representative for the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Oklahoma, and I thank the members for the opportunity to serve as their representative in this important work.

It has again been an honor for me to serve as the State Chairman for the Knights Templar Eye Foundation for this past year. I want to thank each of you for your contributions and support toward this worthy cause and I prompt each Commandery to give Sir Knight James Rossi, our new State Chairman, the support you have given me during these past years.

Through the years, the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc. has provided millions of dollars for approved eye procedures for individuals and millions more for Research Grants. Since 2003, Oklahoma has received two \$30,000 research grants and \$1,403,233.50, for eye procedures for hundreds of individuals. However, the Trustees of the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc. voted to stop giving assistance to individuals as of December 31, 2010. Our donations will now go toward research grants only.

Thanks to Sir Knight Gary A. Davis; PGC who established our partnership with Dean A. McGee Eye Institute. We continued to grow since its' beginning in 2003. I wish to thank the Doctors and Staff at the Dean A. McGee Eye Institute and the efforts of Sir Knights Willis Emerson; PGC, Ed Hart, PGC, Gene Harper, William Pearce, James Rossi and Jim Halbrooke for their assistance.

This year the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, Inc. funded \$171,942.50 for eye care procedures for our friends and neighbors here in Oklahoma . Sir Knights, this past year we contributed almost the amount of the previous year. But, our total contribution was only \$5,806.15.

The 43nd Annual Voluntary Campaign began July 1, 2010 and ended on May 15, 2011. The Commanderies of Oklahoma contributed \$5131.80 and the Order of the

Eastern Star donated \$674.35 for a total of \$5,806.15. Thus, Oklahoma placed 29<sup>th</sup> in a field of 54 for total contributions. Our total per-capita contribution was \$4.21 and placed us at 27th.

Each year the Grand Commandery presents a traveling plaque to the Commandery with the largest total contribution and one for the highest per-capita contribution. # OTHER INFORMATION

1. Inquiries have been received about the charter granted to the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the USA from the Grand Priory of the Scottish Rectified and Reformed Rite of Occitania located in France. According to the Grand Encampment website, this charter has been used to establish a Grand Priory of the Reformed and Rectified Rite of the United States of America and to confer the Grades of the Rectified Scottish Rite. This new Grand Priory has been established and grades have been conferred on candidates; however, correspondence issued by the regular Great Priories of the Rectified Scottish Rite in Europe states the Great Priory of Occitania is an irregular body. It was self-created in 1995 by former members of the Great Priory of Gauls, which was declared irregular by the Grande Loge Nationale Francaise, and its members expelled. The Grand Priory of Occitania, according to its own documentation maintains mutual recognition with only the following Grand Lodges: The Symbolic Grand Lodge of France, the United Grand Lodge of France, and the Grand Orient of Switzerland, all of which are irregular. It also only maintains recognition with the Great Priories of Gauls, the Independent Great Priory of France, and the United Great Priories of the Three Provinces, all of which are irregular bodies. The Great Priory of Occitania, after its formation in 1995, then formed its own grand lodge, the Reformed and Rectified Scottish Grand Lodge of Occitania, which is equally irregular. This Commission does not normally concern itself with the affairs of appendant bodies; however, it is concerned about the negative impact on the established system of regularity in North American Freemasonry that may be caused by members of our Grand Lodges setting a precedent by becoming affiliated with organizations that receive their charter from an irregular source.

Dear Most Worshipful Brother Bousquet,

I have received copies of the March 13, 2011 Edict and March 20, 2011 letter to your constituent Lodges. I understand and applaud your decisive leadership.

The 2011 Report of the Commission on Information for Recognition, adopted by us in Denver, Colorado, clearly stated the Grand Priory of the Scottish Rectified and Reformed Rite of Occitania is an irregular body. It is our duty as Grand Masters to carefully review this report and take appropriate action. To do less opens the door to irregularity coming into our Grand Jurisdictions. If further irregularity occurs in the U.S.A. in the future, it can be traced back to our inaction while we occupied these respective chairs as Grand Masters.

I am distressed that the national leadership of Knights Templar has become associated with an irregular body. I do not want this lapse of proper judgment at their national level to interfere with the Masonic unity that exists in Oklahoma. The Oklahoma Grand Commandery of Knights Templars is a recognized concordant body of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Oklahoma, officially listed in our Constitution and Laws. Our two organizations have had a long and most cordial association. I want that relationship between these two Oklahoma Masonic bodies to continue.

By this letter, I am directing Sir Knight Dwayne Dixon, Right Eminent Grand Commander, to not permit any representatives of the Grand Encampment of Knights Templar, or any other Sir Knight, who belongs to this irregular body, to attend the upcoming Spring meeting of the Grand Commandery of Oklahoma. I will not permit someone who has violated the obligation of a Master Mason to sit in a tiled meeting in Oklahoma.

I am officially notifying you that the Grand Lodge of Oklahoma is *joining* your effort to negotiate a successful resolution to this problem identified by the Commission on Information for Recognition. The Grand Lodge of Oklahoma endorses, supports, and offers whatever assistance is needed in your effort to conclude this matter in a satisfactory manner.

I congratulate you on providing the needed leadership in this matter. Good luck in your future efforts.

# ORDER

JOSEPH A. DiCLERICO, Jr., District Judge.

The Grand Encampment of Knights Templar of the United States of America ("Grand Encampment") and the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of New Hampshire brought suit in state court against the Conference of Grand Masters of Masons in North America, Inc. ("Conference") and seven individuals associated with the Conference. The defendants removed the case to this court. Most of the defendants then filed motions to dismiss for lack of personal jurisdiction. The plaintiffs objected to the motions.

# Standard of Review

"A district court, faced with a motion to dismiss for lack of personal jurisdiction, Fed. R. Civ. P. 12(b)(2), may choose from among several methods for determining whether the plaintiff has met its burden of proving the court's personal jurisdiction over the defendant." N. Laminate Sales, Inc. v. Davis, 403 F.3d 14, 22 (1st Cir. 2005) (internal quotation marks omitted). The most common method is to determine whether the plaintiff has proffered sufficient evidence to make a prima facie case of personal jurisdiction. Id. "This inquiry asks whether the plaintiff has proffered evidence which, if credited, is sufficient to support findings of all facts essential to personal jurisdiction." Lechoslaw v. Bank of Am., N.A., 618 F.3d 49, 54 (1st Cir. 2010) (internal quotation marks omitted). Because the parties submitted evidence in support of and in opposition to the motions to dismiss, the court will proceed under the prima facie method.

## Background

The Knights Templar is a Masonic fraternal organization. The Grand Encampment is the

national level of the organization, with an address in Texas. The Knights Templar operates nationally and on state and local levels. The state organizations are Grand Commanderies; local branches are Commanderies; and individual members are known as Sir Knights.

The Grand Encampment raises money for its charities, the Knights Templar Eye Foundation, the Knights Templar Educational Foundation, and the Holy Pilgrimage Fund, which depend on money raised by Sir Knights through the state Commanderies. Some current and former officers of the Grand Encampment are New Hampshire residents, including Sir Knight Thomas X. Tsirimokos, Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery and current Chairman of the Grand Encampment Committee on Templar Jurisprudence.

The Conference and the individual defendants are part of a Masonic organization known as the Grand Masters of Masons. The Conference is located in Missouri. The individual defendants are present and past Grand Masters of Grand Lodges of Free and Accepted Masons in Washington, Oregon, Oklahoma, Alabama, and Illinois and are also present or past members of a Knights Templar organization.

The dispute between the Grand Encampment and the Conference arose as the result of activities on January 22, 2011, in Marseilles, France, during a ceremony held by a French Masonic organization, the Great Priory of Occitania, which was attended by members of the Grand Encampment, the National Grand Lodge of France, the American Canadian Grand Lodge, the United Grand Lodge of England, and the Grand Lodges of Illinois, Indiana, New York, Ohio, Tennessee, and Texas. The Great Priory of Occitania granted a patent to the Grand Encampment to establish the Eleventh Province of the Scottish Rectified Rite ("Rectified Rite"). The Grand Encampment's officers serve as the officers of the Rectified Rite.

In early February of 2011, a gathering known as Masonic Week was held in Alexandria, Virginia. The gathering was attended by members of Masonic organizations, including six Sir Knights from New Hampshire. William R. Miller, a Past Grand Master of the Washington Grand Lodge, prepared a fact sheet which declared that the Charter issued to the Grand Encampment was irregular, meaning improperly or unlawfully established, and accused the Grand Encampment of planning to establish irregular lodges. An attendee at Masonic Week told the New Hampshire Sir Knights about Miller's fact sheet. After Masonic Week, Miller discussed his concerns with other Grand Masters, including G. Santy Lascano, Grand Master of the Washington Lodge, and Ed Bousquet, Grand Master of the Oregon Grand Lodge.

The Conference's Commission on Information for Recognition published a report during the annual meeting of the Conference of Grand Masters, held in Denver, Colorado, at the end of February, declaring that the Grand Priory of Occitania was an irregular organization. The Commission's report also expressed concern about Grand Lodge members associating with irregular organizations. The report was published to all of the Grand Lodges, including New Hampshire's Grand Lodge.

In April, Lascano and Bousquet issued edicts that declared the Grand Encampment and the Rectified Rite to be irregular and directing their members not to communicate with its members. After sending the edict, Bousquet talked by telephone with Tsirimokos, who was in New Hampshire. Bousquet informed Tsirimokos that he was barred from attending the Grand Conclave of Oregon because Tsirimokos held an office within the Grand Encampment.

The Grand Master of the Oklahoma Grand Lodge, Glenn E. Almy, sent a letter to Bousquet in which he stated that the Grand Encampment was irregular and that its members would be barred from an upcoming meeting in Oklahoma. Almy's letter then was sent to other Grand Lodges, including the lodge in New Hampshire. David P. Owen, the Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Washington sent an email to the Grand Secretaries in all states, declaring the Rectified Rite to be irregular and suggesting similar action by other Grand Lodges. Ronald G. Andress, Grand Master of the Alabama Grand Lodge, and Richard L. Swaney, Grand Master of the Illinois Grand Lodge, sent letters declaring the Rectified Right to be irregular and precluding contact by their members with members of the irregular organization.

The Grand Encampment alleges that the charges of irregularity are false and defamatory and have interfered with the Grand Encampment's ability to raise money for its charities. In this action, the plaintiffs bring claims of intentional interference with contractual relations, intentional misrepresentation, negligent misrepresentation, and civil conspiracy.

# Discussion

The Conference and the individual defendants assert, supported by affidavits and other evidence, that the court lacks personal jurisdiction as to each of them. In response, the plaintiffs argue in a consolidated memorandum that sufficient evidence supports specific personal jurisdiction to avoid dismissal. The plaintiffs submit an affidavit and other evidence in support of their objection.

Personal jurisdiction requires the plaintiffs to show that the defendants had sufficient minimum contacts with the forum state to satisfy due process. <u>Adams v. Adams</u>, <u>601 F.3d 1</u>, 5 (1st Cir. 2010). The necessary showing for specific jurisdiction is comprised of three inquiries: "First, . . . whether the asserted causes of action arise from or relate to the defendant's contacts with the forum, . . . . Second, . . . whether the defendant purposefully availed itself of the protections of the forum's laws by means of those contacts, such that the defendant could reasonably foresee being hauled into the forum's courts. . . . Third, . . . whether an exercise of jurisdiction is consistent with the principles of justice and fair play." <u>Carreras v. PMG Collins, LLC</u>, <u>660 F.3d 549</u>, 554 (1st Cir. 2011) (internal quotation marks and citations omitted). Each part of specific jurisdiction is addressed in turn.

# A. Relatedness

"To demonstrate `relatedness,' [the plaintiffs] must show a demonstrable nexus between [their] claims and [each defendant's] forum-based activities, such that the

litigation itself is founded directly on those activities." <u>Adelson v. Hananel, 652 F.3d 75,</u> 81 (1st Cir. 2011) (internal quotation marks omitted). Activity, for jurisdictional purposes, does not require the defendant's physical presence in the forum state and, instead, may be satisfied when an actual injury is caused in the forum state. <u>Astro-Med, Inc. v. Nihon Kohden Am., Inc., 591 F.3d 1, 9 (1st Cir. 2009)</u>. That is, in the context of an intentional interference with contractual relations claim, when a defendant's actions outside the forum state interfere with a contract that is to be performed in the forum state, the injury caused by the interference is felt in the forum state. Id. at 10.

The plaintiffs acknowledge the defendants' lack of physical contact with New Hampshire. They argue instead, for purposes of their claim for interference with contractual relations, that the defendants' activities caused an injury in New Hampshire. To prove a claim of tortious interference with contractual relations, the plaintiffs must show that they had a contractual relationship with a third party, that the defendants knew of the contractual relationship, and that the defendants wrongfully induced the third party to breach the contract. Nat'l Employment Serv. Corp. v. Olsten Staffing Serv., Inc., 145 N.H. 158, 162 (2000); Barrows v. Boles, 141 N.H. 382, 392-93 (1996). The plaintiffs rely on their allegations that the defendants falsely accused the Grand Encampment of being irregular and impaired the Grand Commanderies' ability to collect dues from Sir Knights which "rendered it impossible for the Grand Encampment to oversee funds collected for the charitable purposes. . . . " Pl. Mem. doc. no. 22 at 11. The plaintiffs' cite their allegations that through their false allegations, the defendants "intentionally interfered with the Grand Encampment's and the Grand Commandery's contractual relationships with their Sir Knights. Specifically, the false accusations impaired each organization's likelihood and ability to collect dues from its Sir Knights, and rendered it impossible for the Grand Encampment to oversee funds collected for the charitable purposes described [in the complaint]." Id. The plaintiffs contend that the following occurrences show relatedness with New Hampshire: someone sent Almy's letter to the Grand Master of the New Hampshire Grand Commandery, Owen sent his email to the secretary of the New Hampshire Grand Lodge, Bousquet told Tsirimokos who was in New Hampshire that Tsirimokos was barred from attending a meeting in Oregon, the Conference's declaration was sent to the New Hampshire Grand Lodge, and Miller distributed his fact sheet at the Virginia meeting that was attended by New Hampshire Sir Knights.

The plaintiffs' allegations show no contact with New Hampshire by Lascano, Andress, and Swaney. The plaintiffs allege that someone other than Almy sent his letter to New Hampshire. Therefore, the plaintiffs' provide no basis for personal jurisdiction as to those defendants.

The plaintiffs have not shown or even alleged that Owen's email, Miller's fact sheet, Bousquet's telephone conversations, or the Conference's report caused any New Hampshire Sir Knights not to pay dues. Even if the plaintiffs could show that a contractual relationship with the Grand Encampment and the New Hampshire Grand Commandery required New Hampshire Sir Knights to pay dues to either or both of them and that because of the defendants' actions the New Hampshire Sir Knights did not pay

the required dues, the plaintiffs allege that the effect of not paying dues was felt by either the Grand Encampment, which is not in New Hampshire, or its charities, which also are not in New Hampshire. The plaintiffs' reliance on <a href="Astro-Med">Astro-Med</a>, <a href="591 F.3d 1">591 F.3d 1</a>, and <a href="Medicus Radiology">Medicus Radiology</a>, <a href="LLC v. Nortec Med">LLC v. Nortec Med</a>. <a href="Staffing">Staffing</a>, <a href="Inc.">Inc.</a>, <a href="2011 WL 9373">2011 WL 9373</a> (D.N.H. Jan. 3, <a href="2011">2011)</a>, is misplaced as the circumstances in those cases are inapposite to the circumstances here. Therefore, the plaintiffs have not shown that any of their claims are sufficiently related to the defendants' activities in New Hampshire to support personal jurisdiction.

# B. Purposeful Availment

Even if the plaintiffs were able to satisfy the relatedness prong, they did not provide a prima facie case for purposeful availment. The plaintiffs again focus on their intentional interference with contractual relations claim. They argue that the defendants' actions of declaring the Grand Encampment and the Rectified Rite irregular satisfy the purposeful availment requirement through the "effects test," relying on the analysis in <a href="Astro-Med">Astro-Med</a> and arguing that the same conduct by the defendants' in this case shows purposeful availment.

In <u>Astro-Med</u>, the plaintiff was a Rhode Island corporation with its principle place of business in Rhode Island and sued the defendant in Rhode Island for tortious interference with its contractual relationship with a sales representative. 591 F.3d at 6-7. The defendant, a California corporation and a competitor of the plaintiff, hired one the plaintiff's sales representatives in Florida to replace its own Florida representative. <u>Id.</u> at 7. The defendant asserted a lack of personal jurisdiction because it was located in California and the hiring, which was the subject of the claim, occurred in Florida. <u>Id.</u> at 7-8.

The court noted that to satisfy purposeful availment the defendant's contacts with Rhode Island "had to represent a purposeful availment of the privilege of conducting activities in the forum state. . . ." <u>Id.</u> at 10 (internal quotation marks omitted). The court concluded the requirement was met because the defendant knew that the sales representative was bound by an employee agreement with the plaintiff and that the agreement provided that the laws of Rhode Island governed the agreement and that the sales representative consented to suit in Rhode Island. Id.

In this case, none of the cited connections between the individual defendants or the Conference even suggests that any of them invoked the benefits or protections of New Hampshire law. The plaintiffs do not allege any provisions of a contract or an agreement between them and Sir Knights in New Hampshire that would support purposeful availment. Therefore, the plaintiffs failed to make even a prima facie case to support purposeful availment.

Because the plaintiffs have not sustained their burden of providing a prima facie case as to the first two requirements for specific personal jurisdiction, the court need not consider the reasonableness requirement.

# Conclusion

For the foregoing reasons, the defendants' motions to dismiss (documents nos. 13, 15, 16, and 18) are granted. Because the court lacks personal jurisdiction over the Conference of Grand Masters of Masons in North America, Inc., G. Santy Lascano, David P. Owen, Ed Bousquet, Glenn E. Almy, Ronald G. Andress, Richard L. Swaney, and William Miller, all claims against those defendants are dismissed.

As is noted above, the plaintiffs added Donald H. Yankey as a defendant in the amended complaint filed on October 25, 2011. Therefore, judgment cannot be entered at this time.




#### **ELECTION OF OFFICERS**
