MASONIC CALENDAR

Ancient Craft Masons:

Commence their era with the creation of the world, calling it Anno Lucis (A.L), "in the year of light."

Royal Arch Masons:

Date from the year the second temple was commenced by Zerubbabel. Anno Inventionis (A.L.), "in the year of discovery."

Order of High Priesthood:

Date from the year of blessing of Abram by the High Priest Melchizedek, Anno Benefacionis (A.B.), "in the year of blessing."

Royal and Select Masters:

Date from the year in which the temple of Solomon was completed, Anno Depositionis (A.Dep.), "in the year of deposit."

Knight Templar:

Commence their era with the organization of their Order, Anno Ordinis (A.O.), "in the year of the Order."

Scottish Rite:

Same as Ancient Craft, except that the Jewish chronology is used, Anno Mundi (A.M.), "in the year of the world."

RULES FOR MASONIC DATES

Ancient Craft Masons: Add 4,000 years to the Common Era:
Thus, 2004 plus 4,000 = 6004.

Royal Arch Masons: Add 530 years to the Common Era:
Thus, 2004 plus 530 = 2534.

Order of High Priesthood: Add 1,913 Years to the Common Era:
Thus, 2004 plus 1,913 = 3917.

Royal and Select Masters: Add 1,000 years to the Common Era:
Thus, 2004 plus 1,000 = 3004.

Knights Templar: Subtract 1,118 years from the Common Era:
Thus, 2004 minus 1,118 = 886.

Scottish Rite: Add 3,760 years to the Common Era:
Thus, 2004 plus 3,760 = 5764.

Most Excellent Donald G. Jones was born in Hobart, OK on May 10, 1940. In 1945 his family moved to Cordell, OK. Companion Jones attended Cordell schools and graduated there in 1958. He married in 1961 and from this marriage he has two children and four grandchildren. In 2004 he and V. Jean McMahon were married in Eufaula, OK. Jean has two children and four grandchildren from a previous marriage.

In 1962, Companion Jones graduated from the Southwestern State College of Pharmacy with a Bachelor's Degree. He moved to Ada, OK where he lived until 1998. During that time he served in several offices with the 4th District of the Oklahoma Pharmaceutical Association, the S.W.O.S.U. Pharmacy Alumni Association, the National Association of Retail Druggists, the American Hospital Association and the Kiwanis of Greater Ada. In 2001, Companion Jones attained the status of Doctor of Pharmacy. He is also a graduate of the Dale Carnegie Leadership Program.

Companion Jones is a current Elder of the Presbyterian Church and has served on various committees and as Treasurer for the First Presbyterian Churches in Ada and McAlester, OK.

Companion Jones was raised a Master Mason at Ada Lodge #119 June 13, 1977 and received his Master's Proficiency on August 15, 1977. He was the Worshipful Master of Ada Lodge #119 in 1983 and later served that lodge as Treasurer, Secretary and Trustee. He is a plural member of Allen Lodge #81 and So. McAlester Lodge #96 which he also served as Worshipful Master. He has been a "C" Certificate Lecturer for several years.

Companion Jones has served the Grand Lodge as a District Deputy Grand Master and has served on several committees. In 1989, he received the Certificate of Service Award from the Masonic Service Association;. From 1991 to 1994, he served as a Hiram II Guide for the Hiram Masonic Renewal Program and served as Assistant Grand Chaplain in 2003.

In October 1977, Companion Jones became a 32nd Degree Mason at the McAlester Scottish Rite. He was invested a Knight Commander of the Court of Honor in 1985 and coroneted a Thirty-Third Degree Inspector General Honorary in 1997. From 1977 to 1998 he served the Valley in several offices and positions of responsibility and leadership. He was appointed to the office of General Secretary by S.G.I.G. Paul T. Million, Jr. in 1998 and retired from that office in October of 2011.

Companion Jones joined the York Rite at a Field Day in McAlester OK on October 11, 1991. As a member of the Ada York Rite Bodies he served as the High Priest, Illustrious Master and Commander in 1994. His membership was transferred to the Shawnee Bodies in 1995. While living in McAlester, he was active on York Rite degree teams and assisted with the annual York Rite Field Days held there. In 2002, he was elected the Grand Principal Conductor of the Work in the Grand Council of Cryptic Masons of Oklahoma and served as the Most Illustrious Grand Master in 2004-2005. In 2010 his York Rite membership was transferred to the Norman York Rite Bodies in Norman, OK. Companion continued his York Rite activities and was elected to the office of Grand Captain of the Host of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of Oklahoma and was elected Most Excellent Grand High Priest for 2013-2014.

MEMBERSHIP

In 2004, Companion and Most Worshipful Robert Shipe wrote an excellent program for the York Rite of Oklahoma. The program was a little long, but included points that, if worked, would help make the York Rite more significant to lodge Masons, more prominent among Masons in an area, more appealing to the families of Masons and to make the York Rite more attractive in general. The goals of the program were to keep existing members, attract new members and to enhance the York Rite experience.

In 2006, Companion Robert G. Davis presented the Regional Degree program. By establishing regions composed of three or four York Rite Bodies the program would make the York Rite degrees more accessible to the Companions and their candidates. This concept is still in use to a couple of areas or regions. .

At the 2013 Grand Session, the Companions passed a resolution that established a York Rite membership organization. The resolution provided for specific duties and a list of ways for candidates to receive the degrees of the Chapter, Council and Commandery. The state of Oklahoma was divided up into regions with Regional Chairmen. It also provided for a General Membership Chairman to monitor and help the local Chairmen. The plan was all laid out, it only needed for someone to work it. One or two Companions did work it.

Now, at this point in time, we have been given the tools, the Grand Bodies are funding the work, the talent is in the field. Where does the York Rite go from here?

Fortunately, we have Companions who have taken the above and run with it. My sincere appreciation is extended to Most Excellent Bob Rolseth and Right Excellent Clyde Schoolfield for their labors the past year. Kudos also to the Tulsa York Rite Bodies for continuing with the regional degree presentation. I commend all of the Companions who worked successfully in the membership field. How do we get more members? We follow their example and "go to work"!

RECOMMENDATIONS

As stated above, I believe the membership plans should be signed off and committed to by every York Rite Body in Oklahoma. The regional degree teams continue the need to be organized and able to function.

Communication among the Companions has improved but it could be better. More use of the Okmason bulletin board on the Grand Lodge website, the use of newsletters, telephone or

texting trees and other methods of communication may be implemented. "Word of mouth" just isn't reaching enough people. I think an informed membership stimulates action.

The officers' quarterly meetings have been improved this year with the use of agendas and time limits that were adhered to. These meetings have improved the relationship among the Bodies and made the Oklahoma York Rite Grand Bodies more effective.

How do the Grand Bodies prevent the dissolution of the constituent Bodies? Unfortunately like a badly managed business, the constituent Bodies close themselves. An older member population is taking its toll on the Order. As those men enter the Grand Lodge above, they leave big shoes for the young men of today to fill. May they be up to the task.

CONCLUSION

In the review of the events and activities of the past year, Jean and I wish to thank all of those who have helped us. Your hospitality and friendship will continue to be the highlights of our year in the office of Grand High Priest. Thank you.

And thank you Companions for allowing me the privilege and honor of serving as your Most Excellent Grand High Priest in 2013-2014. The disappointments have been few, the good times have been many and the memories will be forever.

In preparation for this report I had the pleasure of reviewing the proceedings of Grand Chapters from the United States, Scotland, England, Canada, several from south America and a few from Europe.

Declines in membership remain a concern in many jurisdictions. A few Grand Chapters have experienced growth in the past twelve months, and there is guarded optimism that the turnaround is within sight for many more Grand Jurisdictions. Losses due to demits and suspensions are slowing considerably as efforts for retention are being initiated to stir interest and attendance. More proactive activities in recruitment are necessary to stem the tide of increasing deaths due to an aging membership.

Many of the success stories are attributed to the efforts of informing and educating Craft Masons on the York Rite. Some jurisdictions have developed a presentation to be used in Blue Lodge to promote membership in the York Rite. Some Grand Bodies have combined fund raisers. A good number of Jurisdictions have been commending those Chapters, officers and members for the zealously of their efforts in their respective locales, awarding certificates, medals, pins...etc. The Grand Chapter of Texas, for example, distinguishes an outstanding constituent Chapter for their efforts with a "Zerubbabal" award. Some Grand Chapters encourage competition in either fund raising or ritual. The General Grand Chapter has had a ritual jewel (This is the last year this award is available), along with a Sweetheart award to recognize the ladies of our Companions. Locally, some chapters have put together a Master Mason degree team and others perform a special play written for the presentation in a Blue Lodge.

Success favors strong consistent leadership, enthusiasm, the ability to adapt to change, relevant content in meetings, and strong communication skills. In retrospect, I would say that the success of any Chapter is directly proportional to the drive, creativity and dedication of its officers and Companions. GRAND COUNCIL PHA VISIT

On Saturday June 1, 2013 I had the privilege of attending the Herman E. Duncan Grand Council and Commandery at the Tulsa Marriott Southern Hills. This was the first attendance of a Grand Illustrious Grand Master from our Grand Council at the Grand Session of our Prince Hall Affiliated Companions. Grand Commander Anthony E. Bowens provided a

warm welcome and allowed me to sit on the dais before handing me the Sword of Authority and allowing me to address the assembled Sir Knights and Companions. He and his officers were most hospitable and conducted an efficient and business-like Grand Session. I thank them again for their courtesy and hospitality.

ACTIONS AND DISPENSATIONS

October 16, 2013 - Granted a dispensation to allow Tulsa Council No. 22 to hold its annual election on November 18, 2013 instead of December 16, 2013.

December 16, 2013 - Granted a dispensation to allow Woodward Council No. 52 to hold its annual election on December 19, 2013 due to hazardous weather conditions on December 12, 2013.

January 10, 2014 - Granted a dispensation to allow Capitol Hill Council No. 59 to hold its annual election of officers on January 17, 2014 due to hazardous weather conditions on December 20, 2013.

February 11, 2014 - Opened Okmulgee Council No. 17 in ample form and was present for the final discussion and vote on the proposed consolidation with Muskogee Council No. 2.

RECOMMENDATIONS

RITUAL

Ritual proficiency in our Councils is generally poor. We therefore this past year have attempted to provide additional opportunities for instruction at the local level by appointing Assistant Custodians of the Work in each district. These Assistant Custodians of the Work met with the Custodians of the Work to ensure that the instruction would be uniform in presentation and interpretation. A copy of the work was provided to each Custodian of the Work and Assistant Custodian of the Work, along with a ritual evaluation form that was to be used to record ritualistic proficiency. Our Grand Council officers visited each Council and observed the efforts of the Companions to properly perform the ritual were sincere, but hampered by a lack of knowledge, practice, and instruction at the local level. I therefore recommend that the Grand Council allow a clear language version, except for the secret work, of the opening, closing, and reception of Grand Officers and guests, be provided to each Council in sufficient number for each officer.

REGIONAL DEGREE TEAMS

Several years ago the Grand Council recognized the inability of most Councils to adequately confer degrees. Regional degree teams were adopted as a method to fill the void of local teams and with the hope of stimulating Companions back into activity. We are gratified to see regional degree conferrals occurring in the Tulsa and Oklahoma City areas. I recommend that the non-metropolitan areas of the state engage this process and that the Grand York Rite Bodies continue to support this important concept.

FINANCES

The finances of the Grand Council are in poor condition. Per capita is always the primary source of revenue for all Masonic organizations. In the past year per capita paid by the constituent Councils covered only 57% of the Grand Council expenses. The remaining funds came from interest and dividends from savings 37%, new member's fees, and sale of rituals and codes 6%.

In 1989, the year I joined the Council, our Grand Council had 2,667 members. We closed 2013 with 1,433 members, a 46% decline over 24 years. We must recognize that as

the primary source of revenue has decreased, not so our fixed costs, they remain and with fewer to share the expense, naturally the per member burden increases. I recommend the Grand Council consider increasing per capita by \$1.00 per year for each of the next five (5) years.

CONCLUDING REMARKS

I would like to thank R.I. Companion Gary Davis, Grand Recorder, for his constant attention to the business of the Grand Council. I would also like to thank M.I. Companion Elwood Isaacs, Grand Treasurer for his generous contribution of time and talent in managing the investments of our Grand Jurisdiction.

Being appointed as an officer in a fraternal Grand Line is a privilege. Being elected as a Grand Officer is humbling. Serving as your Illustrious Grand Master has truly been an honor and I thank each of you for helping make this possible.

With the coming change of leadership of this Grand Council you have much for which to look forward. The advancing line of this Grand Council is full of wisdom and energy. I ask that you please support your new Grand officers and engage their vision for our Grand Council. It has been my pleasure to have served with them.

To that end, we recommend that the Custodians of the Work be authorized to publish such a document and that copies be made available to the local Councils. It should be noted that this is not a new ritual; it is merely a collection of excerpts from our already adopted ritual.

Specifically, the publication shall include: (i) the Ritual for the Opening of a Council of Select Masters, as it appears on pp. 6 – 10 of the Plain English Revision, (ii) the Ritual for the Closing of a Council of Select Masters, as it appears on pp. 39 – 41 of the Plain English Revision, (iii) the Ritual for the Reception of the Most Illustrious Grand Master and other Dignitaries, as it appears on pp. 43 – 44 of the Adopted Ritual, and (iv) the diagram illustrating the Officers Stations and floor work during the Opening, as it appears on Plate I of the Floor Work Diagrams.

Finally, we wish to note the passing of our longtime Companion and Custodian of the Work Kenneth D. Buckley. His experience and expertise will be greatly missed.

Nominations are made to the Regional Deputies on the FORM and selection by the elective officers. These nominations must be sent to the General Grand Recorder by Dec 31st of 2013.

The first known award for an Oklahoma Council member goes to:

ROBERT G. DAVIS

Robert G. Davis is a 45-year Mason. Currently he is the General Secretary of the Guthrie Scottish Rite Bodies in Oklahoma, serving there for 27 years. He is a Past Master of three Masonic lodges, and served as the charter Master of Guildhall Lodge #553, a traditional practices lodge in Oklahoma. He is a KYCH, a 33° Mason, and recipient of the Grand Cross. He is a Past Grand Commander of the Grand Commandery of Knights Templar of Oklahoma, and serves as the Secretary of the Board of Directors of the Oklahoma Masonic Charity Foundation. He is a Past Sovereign of the Red Cross of Constantine, Past Sovereign Master of the Allied Masonic Degrees, and Past Governor of the Oklahoma York Rite College. He is the Chief Adept of the Oklahoma College of Masonic Rosicrucians.

Nationally, he is serving as the Senior Grand Warden of the Grand Council of Allied Masonic Degrees in the United States; he serves on the Education Committee of the York Rite Sovereign College of North America, the Masonic Education and Research Committee and Rituals and Ritualistic Matters Committee of the United Grand Imperial Council of the Red Cross of Constantine, and serves on the Board of Directors of the Scottish Rite Research Society. He is a past president of the Masonic Restoration Foundation and serves on the Steering Committee of the Masonic Information Center of the United States. He is past President and Fellow of the International Philaethes Society and serves as the editor of the High Council publications of Masonic Rosicrucians. He is a member of the Nine Muses Council No. 13 in Washington, D.C.

Robert is well known both in the areas of Masonic Research and Masonic Renewal. For his work in Masonic Renewal, he was awarded the Paul Horn Memorial Medal by the Grand Lodge of the State of Washington. He was the first person to receive this highest award of that state who is not a Past Grand Master. In 1999, he was selected to receive the Grand Master's Award of the Grand Lodge of Kansas (the highest honor given by that Grand Lodge) for his work in Masonic Leadership. In 2008, he received the Duane Anderson Award for Excellence in Masonic Knowledge from the Grand Lodge of Minnesota.

Davis also holds the Cross of Honor and the Legion of Honor in DeMolay and is an Honorary Member of the Supreme Council of the International Order of DeMolay.

Illustrious Companion Davis has provided exceptional service to the Grand Council of Oklahoma. Beginning in 2000, Davis organized and implemented a state-wide membership structure. In 2005, Davis added to this structure a regional degree team component to make the York Rite degrees available to more candidates by sharing the talents of local York Rite Bodies on a regular schedule. In 2007 Davis assumed the challenge of re-creating the Oklahoma York Rite website with the goal of making York Rite Masonry appealing to interested Masons. Davis serves a class director at many state-wide York Rite festivals,

explaining the beautiful symbolism of the degrees and orders by sharing his extensive knowledge of the ritual with the new Companions and Sir Knights.

Before moving to Guthrie, Davis served 14 years in the City Management and City Planning professions. He is past president of the Guthrie Education Foundation and the Lions Club. He has served two terms on the City Council of the City of Guthrie, where he was Chairman of the Finance Committee and Chairman of the Guthrie Industrial Development Authority. He currently is the Chair of the city's Fee and Rate Structure Advisory Committee to the city council. In addition to being employed with the Guthrie Scottish Rite, Davis is also a freelance writer and a grant writer for governmental entities, Native American tribes, and non-profits.

He has just completed a book on the history and evolution of the American Masonic ritual entitled *The Mason's Words*, and is the author of *Understanding Manhood in America: Freemasonry's enduring Quest for the Mature Masculine,* focusing on the fraternal quest for the ideal in masculinity. Robert is married. He and his wife Sharon have two daughters and four grandchildren.

Companion Davis is truly an exceptional Mason and a credit to the reputation of Freemasonry. The Companions of Oklahoma heartily recommend him for the Columbian Award.

THE REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON GENERAL MATTERS

As is the normal situation in reports of this type, there is good news and bad news. Let's look at Good News first.

Of the 16 Commanderies that started the year, 14 knighted at least one new Knight. One Commandery, Oklahoma # 3 proved that you can still find men who want to become York Rite members. They Knighted 35 new Knights. That is awesome. Five other Commanderies Knighted 8 or more new Knights. This year Oklahoma Knighted 110 new Knights. That amounts to over 8 % of our existing membership. We also had 4 admitted and 15 reinstated. It is definitely important to try to reinstate our members and not just let them disappear. Eight of our Commanderies had reinstatements. However, it still only translates to a net growth of 21 Knights, which is 1.5 %.

Also on the positive side, we were able to again make a payment of Perpetual Membership income to our Commanderies. That payment only amounted to a total of \$647.50, but that is more than we were able to pay last year.

We also had 100 % participation in the Holy Land Pilgrimage program.

Now to the bad news. We can learn from our weaknesses. Quarterly reports are still

not being timely filed. Annual reports are late. As a new Recorder, I am guilty. I am working to figure out what all I need and to get a new item in my calendar.

Losses. We all abhor the loss of our members. Only 3 demitted. We lost 47 Knights to death. We lost 57 knights to suspension or withdrawal. It seems only logical that we should be able to reduce at least some of the loss to suspensions and withdrawals. We would urge that the Officers in Charge meet with their Commanderies early in the year and encourage every Commandery to set up an active committee to contact the members who are behind in their dues. Only 3 Commanderies lost 8 or more Knights to suspension. Of our 16 Commanderies, 6 had a net loss of membership, 7 gained members, and 3 were unchanged.

Consolidations. It truly strikes a pain in my heart to lose a Commandery. This year Gethsemane voted to consolidate with Muskogee. That action was approved and the two have become one under the banner of Muskogee #2. Both of these Commanderies have a long and distinguished history.

KNIGHTS TEMPLAR EYE FOUNDATION REPORT

This being my first year as Chairman of the Knight Templar Eye Foundation, I had grand ideas on how to promote the KTEF and the work they do, but I had many family and work issues get in the way of my plans. This year would have been a complete failure were it not for the prodding and encouragement given me by the Past KTEF Chairman, Jim Rossi. He is what made this year the success it was. We had a rather large, six figure grant made to the OU medical research center in Oklahoma City, where they are doing research using gene therapy where they hope to prevent blindness altogether. We have gotten away from helping individuals, but with the research being done we may be able to prevent blindness forever in the near future.

With the KTEF campaign that ended May 15, 2013 Oklahoma donated a total of \$10,504.30, and we are closing in on that amount this year. The two plaques we presented at Grand Sessions, the F.M. "Fritz" Lombard award for the largest total contribution, and the Ned D. Prator award for the largest per-capita contributions this year are going to separate Commandery's this year.

The winner of the F.M. "Fritz" Lombard plaque goes to Trinity Commandery No. 20 (Tulsa), with donations of \$2,890.00 and the winner of the Ned D. Prator plaque goes to Calvary Commandery No. 26 (Bartlesville), with largest per-capita donations of \$15.09.

MEMBERSHIP

It has been an exceptional year to reflect on the call of membership enhancement in the York Rite. All Concordant Bodies of Freemasonry were given a singular opportunity to do something beyond the ordinary during this past year when our Oklahoma Grand Master, Randy Rogers, called for the advancement of Entered Apprentices and Fellow Crafts in two remarkable One Day Conferral programs that were held in Guthrie and Muskogee. This effort produced over 1200 Master Masons.

The York Rite mailed information to those who were raised in the spring of 2012 and invited these new Master Masons to join our Grand Master's York Rite Festival held in September. While the results were better than in the past, it was obvious there was little follow up among our lodge representatives in promoting that membership opportunity.

As a test of the effectiveness of the membership organizational structure, a special appeal was again made in advance of the February York Rite Festive held in Oklahoma City. In addition to a mailed invitation, a special package was prepared by Central Oklahoma region director, Clyde Schoolfield, and mailed to the newly raised prospects living in the Oklahoma area. Follow up contacts were made and all lodges were visited informing brethren of the York Rite joining opportunity.

The results were outstanding, as evidenced by the class of 51 Master Masons who became Royal Arch Masons, Royal and Select Masters on February 2, 2013. A good number also received the Order of the Temple. This is the largest class of candidates hosted by the Oklahoma York Rite Bodies in recent memory.

In addition to the results as documented in the numbers joining in February, the Central Oklahoma team effort verified that personal contact and word-of-mouth marketing are the essentials to membership recruitment success. The effort also clearly points out that a sound organizational structure is in place in the York Rite. Our failing is that we still do not have enough members who are actually making a personal effort working toward securing petitions.

While membership recruitment is a voluntary process and cannot be mandated, it is recommended the Grand Secretary/Recorder provide all regional membership directors the list of all newly raised Master Masons in their areas received by him. This contact information should then be forwarded to lodge representatives before each future one day conferral. At a minimum, their assignment should include speaking to every lodge that has prospects and reporting back to the regional directors a report of their efforts. It is further recommended that York Rite recruitment materials be reprinted and made available in a package form to be used by lodge representatives.

TEMPLE REVIEW

The following are portions extracted from the proceedings of different Grand Commanderies for 2012-2014:

Connecticut – This Grand Commandery was organized September 13, 1827. Their 185th Annual Conclave was held in Rocky Hill, Connecticut on April 14, 2012. Their Grand Commander SK Leonard Bucher reports the continued decline in membership and reported that numbers have dropped below 1000 members to 958.

Florida – The Grand Commandery of Florida held its 115th Annual Conclave. The outgoing Grand Commander, worked throughout his year to promoting the Constituent Commanderies proficient in opening and closing an Asylum properly and promoting the passing of resolutions to shore up uniform regulations and usage of name plates and military service awards on a Sir Knights uniform.

Oregon – This Grand Commandery held its 127th Annual Conclave in North Bend, Oregon on April 6, 2013. Oregon continues to struggle with membership; they start 2012 with 838 Sir Knights and finished the year with 796. The Grand Commander, SK Courland B. Brooks expressed his concern and relief concerning Grand Encampment and Grand Priory of the Scottish Reformed and Rectified Rite of the USA.

North Carolina – This Grand Commandery held its 132nd Annual Conclave in New Bern, North Carolina on March 18, 2013. REGC Dale D. Davis' theme for the year was "Our Legacy: Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow." The intent was to offer each Sir Knight the opportunity to reflect upon past achievements and what must be done to sustain the progress for today and into the future. He also reports a renewed interest in North Carolina. Increased enthusiasm for knowledge of the customs and history, as well as a desire to be locally active has created more opportunities for the individual Commanderies.

Texas – The 159th Annual Conclave of the Grand Commandery, Knights Templar of Texas was held in the Grand Ballroom of the Doubletree Hilton Hotel in Houston, TX on Monday, April 23, 2012. Eminent Commander Donald A. Wunsche traveled extensively throughout his year and reported on the health of the states Commanderies. Their membership stands at 8908, a decline of 301 Sir Knights, gaining 304 by Knighting but losing 563 members to either suspension or death.

We still have work to do in the North, South Central and Southeast Regions, but it is a positive thing to know that we can put on regional conferral programs in half of the regions in Oklahoma, including the new largest population areas in the state. That represents real progress from just a few years ago.

Our local Chapters, Councils and Commanderies are to be congratulated for their efforts and we hope to be able to fill out the remaining Degrees and Orders in the Central Region; as well as add to the existing capabilities in the North, South Central, and Southeast regions over the next year.

We are at a place where Master Masons, Scottish Rite Masons and Shrine Masons who want to join the York Rite can now do so without travelling half way across the state. Keep up the good work so that we may complete our quarterly conferral program in every region of Oklahoma as soon as possible.
